Jorge Ramos sits down with President Barack Obama at the White House to discuss the controversies surrounding health care reform, immigration reform and U.S. relations with Latin America. Why does he support prohibiting undocumented immigrants from buying insurance from the health care exchange and how does he respond to immigrant advocates who call this measure draconian? Also, the clock is ticking on his promise to pass comprehensive immigration reform by the end of his first year in office. Will he break his promise? And, as the Honduran presidential elections approach, how will the U.S. government react towards the victor?

Hispanics overwhelmingly supported the Democratic Party in the last presidential election. In fact, Hispanic's support of the Republican Party dropped from 44 percent in 2004 to 31 percent in 2008. What do Republicans need to do to attract Latinos? In his first appearance on *Al Punto*, House Minority Leader John Boehner says that although Hispanics might not be aware of it, the Republican Party is much more akin to their

values than they might think. He also explains his opposition to what he calls a "government takeover of the healthcare system" and addresses Representative Wilson's outburst during President Obama's speech to the joint session of congress. Will he support comprehensive immigration reform? Does he think it's likely to pass before the end of President Obama's first term?
