A federal appeals court reopened the case Wednesday of a Bay Area man who was deported to Mexico in 2005 and struck down a regulation that prevented him from presenting evidence that his son, a U.S. citizen, had been diagnosed with mental illness just before he was sent out of the country. The Justice Department's rule applied to

illegal immigrants who have been ordered deported but claim to have new evidence supporting their right to remain in the United States, such as recent family hardship. The regulation prohibited them from introducing such evidence after a judge ordered them deported.

**TOYOTA RECALL

Toyota Motor Corp. built its reputation in the U.S. as a maker of safe and dependable vehicles, but the quality of the Japanese automaker's fleet continues to be tarnished by serious safety recalls. Toyota said Thursday it is recalling 2.3 million vehicles in the U.S. to fix accelerator pedals with mechanical problems that could cause them to become stuck. The announcement comes just months after it recalled 4.2 million vehicles due to gas pedals that could become trapped under floor mats, causing sudden acceleration. That problem was the cause of several crashes, including some fatalities.

The Guatemalan government has issued a public protest after three Guatemalans were arrested this month by immigration agents at a Federal Express office in Florida, when

one of the immigrants went to pick up a package containing his newly issued Guatemalan passport. Suspecting that the passport was fraudulent, Federal Express officials called Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents to alert them when the Guatemalans arrived to collect the package, officials of the immigration agency said. Two of the Guatemalans were illegal immigrants who have been deported, and one is in deportation proceedings.

**TOYOTA RECALL

Toyota is suspending sales of eight models, including the popular Camry and Corolla lines, and halting production at six plants. Toyota recalled 2.3 million vehicles last week because of reports of sticky accelerator peddles. Toyota engineers are trying to develop a quick fix for the problem, but no firm timeline has been set for when vehicle sales could resume.

MEXICO-REMITTANCES

Money sent home by Mexicans abroad plunged a record 15.7 percent in 2009 as migrants worldwide struggled to find work during the global economic slowdown, the central bank reported Wednesday. Remittances -- Mexico's No. 2 source of foreign income after oil exports -- totaled \$21.2 billion in 2009, compared with \$25.1 billion in 2008, the bank said. Since the bank began tracking remittances in 1996, it has recorded just one other annual decline -- a 3.6 percent decrease in 2008, as the world financial crisis exploded. Central bank president Agustin Carstens attributed the latest drop to the weak economy in the United States and the increased difficulty Mexicans are having securing employment there. More than 11.8 million Mexicans live in the U.S.

Toyota says it is recalling 75,500 vehicles in China for the same gas pedal problem behind the U.S. and European recalls. Toyota Motor Corp. has Thursday informed Chinese authorities it will start a recall in February for RAV4 sport utility vehicles that were manufactured in China between March 2009 and January 2010, says spokeswoman Ririko Takeuchi. They use the same problem parts in accelerators that caused the recent spate of massive recalls in the U.S. Toyota said earlier Thursday it will also recall vehicles in Europe, although it has not said the number of vehicles involved.

Toyota Motor Corp. has told employees that it has figured out how to fix a problem with sticking accelerator pedals and will brief them on the details on Friday. The company said in an e-mail to employees obtained by The Associated Press that it presented the remedy to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The memo did not say when the repairs would make their way to customers. The company said on its Web site that engineers are working around the clock to fix the problem in eight of its models, including the top-selling Camry midsize sedan. The automaker and the company that makes the gas pedal systems says the accelerators rarely stick.
