**FORECLOSURES ERODES LATINO FAMILIES**

As the first anniversary of President Obama's Homeowner Affordability and Stability Plan is recognized this week, NCLR (National Council of La Raza), the largest national Hispanic civil rights and advocacy organization in the United States, and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill's Center for Community Capital today released The Foreclosure Generation: The Long-Term Impact of the Housing Crisis on Latino Children and Families, a study which uses interviews with Latino families who have suffered a foreclosure to shed light on the damage inflicted by the loss of their home. The report is the first to provide a glimpse into the far-reaching impact that record-high foreclosures are likely to have on the millions of American families and children expected to lose their home in the coming years, and it calls for a bold response from federal policymakers. "An estimated 1.3 million Latino families will lose their homes to foreclosure between 2009 and 2012.

**TOYOTA PROBE AND PRODUCTION CUTS**

Toyota will shut down production at two of its U.S. assembly plants for a total of at least 11 days as it grapples with slower sales after a wave of safety recalls. The shutdowns, announced on Tuesday, will affect Toyota's San Antonio, Texas, and Georgetown, Kentucky, plants and represent the second time the world's largest automaker has had to cut North American output because of a product safety crisis that has cost it sales and damaged its reputation. Toyota Motor Corp faces a sales decline in the United States, its biggest and usually most profitable market, after the recall of more than 8.5 million cars worldwide since late 2009 for three separate defects.

**TOYOTA RECALL**

At a presser this morning in Japan, Toyota CEO Akio Toyoda says he won't attend a U.S. Congressional hearing on the automaker's safety lapses. Instead Toyota's U.S. executives will answer lawmakers' questions on the massive gas pedal recalls. Also at the presser, Toyota announced it is looking into possible power steering problems with the hot-selling Corolla subcompact. The company is investigating fewer than 100 complaints that drivers may perceive a strange feeling as though they were losing control over the steering. The automaker says they are considering yet another recall.

**PROPOSED CUTS WOULD END CALIFORNIA ASSISTANCE FOR MOST NEW LEGAL IMMIGRANTS**

Arnold Schwarzenegger's latest proposals to close California's budget shortfall would end public assistance for most new legal immigrants, eliminating emergency cash, food and medical aid for those who don't yet qualify for federal welfare.Gov. Schwarzenegger's budget proposes saving \$304 million by eliminating several programs that provide a safety net for elderly, disabled and low-income immigrants who don't yet qualify for federal welfare.

**FORECLOSURES AFECTING HISPANICS**

After taking a break for the holidays, foreclosures spiked in Santa Clara and San Mateo counties in January. Despite efforts by the federal government and lenders to help people stay in their homes, foreclosures rose 37 percent in Santa Clara County last month from December, and 71 percent in San Mateo County, according to a report Tuesday from ForeclosureRadar. In another sign that housing woes are far from over, more homes are lingering in the foreclosure process: Homes that were repossessed by lenders in Santa Clara County in January had been in foreclosure for an average of 221 days, or more than seven months. In August 2008, banks took an average of 143 days to foreclose, less than five months.

**HEALTHCARE OVERHAUL**

President Barack Obama summons anxious Democrats and aloof Republicans to a White House summit Thursday -- live on C-SPAN and perhaps cable -- and gambles that he can save his embattled health care overhaul by the power of persuasion. Adversaries and allies alike were surprised by Obama's invitation to reason together at an open forum, as risky as it is unusual. Ahead of the meeting, the White House will post on its Web site a health care plan that modifies the bill passed by Senate Democrats last year. The modification is an effort to address the concerns of their House counterparts.

The White House will unveil its latest healthcare reform proposals on Monday ahead of a bipartisan summit that President Barack Obama hopes will advance the stalled legislation, a senior administration official said on Saturday. Obama urged Democrats and Republicans on Saturday to find common ground at a summit he will host on Thursday to help rejuvenate efforts to overhaul the \$2.5 trillion healthcare system, one of his top domestic policy priorities. The administration official said the White House would publish its updated proposals on Monday but declined to outline details. The plan is expected to combine features of two Democratic bills passed by the Senate and House of Representatives, according to congressional aides and healthcare advocates. They are expected to reflect common ground negotiated over the past several weeks by Democratic leaders in Congress.

President Barack Obama tried to rejuvenate his stalled healthcare overhaul Monday with a revised plan designed to make coverage more affordable and bolster federal authority to regulate insurance premium hikes. The proposal comes three days ahead of a bipartisan White House healthcare summit Thursday as Obama tries to rally flagging congressional and U.S. public support for a sweeping overhaul that would tighten regulations on insurers and expand coverage to tens of millions of Americans. Republicans have demanded that Obama scrap the healthcare bills passed by the Democratic-controlled Senate and House of Representatives last year. But White House officials rejected the idea and said they hoped the new plan would resolve the differences in the two versions. The new plan, which revises the bill passed by the Senate last year, would cost \$950 billion over 10 years and would not expand the deficit, White House officials said.
