**OBAMA AND IMMIGRATION REFORM

President Barack Obama renewed his push for U.S. immigration reform Thursday, reaching out to Hispanic voters despite minimal chances that Congress will pass such legislation this year. In a broad speech that did not break new policy ground, Obama, a Democrat, called for Republican support to pass a law to address the 11 million illegal immigrants in the country without disrupting the economy or violating American values. Obama has been under pressure to keep his promise from the 2008 presidential campaign to overhaul U.S. immigration rules. A tough new law in Arizona has brought the issue to the forefront of public debate, galvanizing Hispanics, who are an important constituency for November's congressional elections.

**UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

More than 1.3 million laid-off workers won't get their unemployment benefits reinstated before Congress goes on a weeklong vacation for Independence Day. An additional 200,000 people who have been without a job for at least six months stand to lose their benefits each week, unless Congress acts. For the third time in as many weeks, Republicans in the Senate successfully filibustered a bill Wednesday night to continue providing unemployment checks to people who been laid off for long stretches. The House is slated to vote on a similar measure Thursday, though the Senate's action renders the vote a futile gesture as Congress prepares to depart Washington for its holiday recess.

**NY: IMMIGRATION FEDERAL PROGRAM

New York has signed onto a controversial federal program that will allow jails in some communities to begin checking the immigration status of every person booked. The state's Division of Criminal Justice Services recently reached an agreement with Immigration and Customs Enforcement to roll out the program known as "Secure communities" in the fall, according to officials with both agencies. They say it's too early to tell if the program will be implemented in New York City, whose policies have been perceived as largely immigrant-friendly. Mayor Michael Bloomberg has said he supports the legalization of some undocumented workers and has been lobbying for an overhaul of immigration laws. He was in Washington Thursday to attend a speech by President Barack Obama on immigration.

**UNEMPLOYMENT

The United States added just 83,000 private-sector jobs in June, a dishearteningly low number that could add to the growing number of economists who warn that the economic recovery is stalling. Over all, the nation lost 125,000 jobs, according to the monthly snapshot of the job market released by the Labor Department on Friday. Most of the lost jobs came as temporary workers hired by the federal government to help with the census exited their jobs. The unemployment rate, based on a different survey, declined to 9.5 percent in June from the previous 9.7 percent.

**TOYOTA RECALL

Toyota Motor Corp. says it intends to recall 138,000 Lexus vehicles in the United States to fix faulty engines in the latest quality problem at the world's No. 1 automaker. The company says flaws in valve springs, a crucial engine component, could make the vehicle stall while in motion. Toyota said in a statement Friday it plans to file paperwork on the recall with the government next week. The recall affects certain GS, IS and LS vehicles from the 2006-2008 model years.

Toyota started recalling more than 90-thousand luxury Lexus and Crown vehicles on Monday in Japan, over defective engines, the latest setback for the automaker beset with quality problems. Toyota Motor Corporation said recalls in overseas markets will follow soon, totalling about 270-thousand vehicles globally. That includes: 138-thousand vehicles in the U.S., 15-thousand in Europe, 10-thousand in the Middle East, 6-thousand in China, 4-thousand in Canada, and 8-thousand in other regions. Toyota told the Japanese government on Monday it was recalling 91,903 vehicles for flaws in the valve springs, a crucial engine component, that could make the automobile stall while in motion.

The Arizona law requires state and local police to investigate the immigration status of anyone they reasonably suspect of being an illegal immigrant, provoking criticism that it is unconstitutional and would sap law enforcement resources.

Governor Charlie Crist has called for a special session of the Legislature to permanently ban offshore oil drilling in Florida waters. Crist on Thursday

said the session is called for July 20th to the 23rd. Crist wants the legislature to put an amendment to the state constitution on the November ballot asking to permanently ban drilling in state waters. The amendment would require 60 percent approval from the voters.

IMMIGRATION DONATION

Retirees and other residents from all over the country were among those who donated nearly \$500,000 to help Arizona defend its immigration enforcement law. The donations, 88 percent of which came through the Arizona defense fund's website, surged this week after the federal government sued Tuesday to challenge the law. A document from Gov. Jan Brewer's office showed that 7,008 of the 9,057 online contributions submitted by Thursday morning were made in the days following the government's filing.

The federal official leading the Gulf oil spill cleanup says a new containment cap and an additional ship collecting oil could effectively contain the spill as early as Monday. National Incident Commander Thad Allen said Friday that the work to replace a leaky containment cap on the well head with a tighter one will begin Saturday. At the same time, a ship connecting to a different part of leak is expected to come online Sunday.

TPS EXTENSION

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) announced today that the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) will extend Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for eligible nationals of El Salvador from the current expiration of Sept. 9, 2010, through the new expiration date of March 9, 2012. During the past year, DHS and the Department of State have reviewed the conditions in El Salvador. Based on this review, Secretary of Homeland Security Janet Napolitano has determined that an 18-month extension is warranted because the conditions that prompted the 2001 TPS designation of El Salvador following a series of severe earthquakes persist

and temporarily prevent El Salvador from adequately handling the return of its nationals.

BP Plc prepared Tuesday to test a new cap on its runaway well in an effort to finally arrest the flow of oil gushing into the Gulf of Mexico for the last 12 weeks. The tests, due to last between six and 48 hours, will begin later Tuesday on BP's newly installed "capping stack", which has a better seal than the last cap placed on the well and aims to stop oil from spewing out of the failed blowout preventer. A critical test to gauge the integrity of the blown-out well is expected to start "in a couple of hours," a BP executive said at about 3:30 p.m. EDT . As the oil giant prepared for a potential turning point in the worst offshore spill in U.S. history, it also said its plans to sell some non-core assets, which will help pay for a \$20 billion clean-up fund, were moving forward. Both pieces of news had helped BP shares maintain their recent recovery in London, although they seesawed in New York with profit-taking erasing most of the early gains.

BP Plc will go ahead with a key pressure test on its ruptured Gulf of Mexico well to determine if it can proceed with a plan to temporarily seal the well, a senior U.S. official said Wednesday. Retired Admiral Thad Allen, who is overseeing the U.S. effort to deal with the disaster, said the decision was taken after a day of intense deliberation that reached the level of President Barack Obama and his cabinet.

BP has finally gained control over one of America's biggest environmental catastrophes -- at least for now. The company has placed a carefully fitted cap over the runaway well that has been gushing crude into the Gulf of Mexico since early spring. It's only a temporary fix but it's being greeted with hope and high expectations on the Gulf Coast. But some residents are skeptical. If the cap holds, if the sea floor doesn't crack and if the relief wells being prepared are completed successfully, this could be the beginning of the end for the spill. But that's a lot of ifs, and no one is declaring any sort of victory beyond the moment. Tests are being run on the cap to see if it can hold back the oil.
