- (1) **TERRORISM / CRIME:** CONCERN WITH LOCAL AFFECTS OF TERRORISM AS WELL THE AFFECTS OF THE REBUILDING OF IRAQ. ALSO CONTINUED CONCERN WITH GETTING TOUGH ON CRIMINALS BOTH LOCALLY AS WELL AS NATIONALLY.
- (2) **INDUSTRY / BUSINESS:** CONTINUED NEED TO BRING MORE DIVERSE AND UPSCALE INDUSTRY INTO THE AREA AND INCREASED NEED TO STRENGTHEN AND SUPPORT CURRENT INDUSTRIES.
- (3) **POLITICS:** COMMUNITY WANTING ETHICAL POLITICIANS AND FEEL THE NEED TO BE EDUCATED ON LOCAL/REGIONAL ISSUES THAT EFFECT THEIR DAILY LIVES.
- (4) **HEALTH / SAFETY:** WITH THE THREAT OF POSSIBLE BIO-TERRORISM, THE NEW "FLU" BUG AND "WEST NILE VIRUS" STILL TOP OF MIND, RESIDENTS STILL CONCERNED WITH PROTECTING THEMSELVES. ALSO RESIDENTS CONCERNED WITH HELPING HURRICANE KATRINA VICTIMS BOTH ON NATIONAL AND LOCAL LEVEL.
- (5) **ENVIRONMENT:** DUE TO LACK OF PERCIPITATION IN SOUTHERN COLORADO, A DROUGHT CONDITION STILL EXISTS. CONCERN WITH WATER CONSERVATION, WILD FIRES AND SOIL EROSION IN THE AREA IS STILL STRONG.
- (6) **PLANNING:** WITH THE EXTENSIVE INFLUX OF NEW BUSINESSES AND A GROWING POPULATION, THERE IS A NEED TO BRING THE INFRASTRUCTURE UP TO PAR FOR THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS; INCLUDING NEW AND IMPROVED ROADS AND BRIDGES.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: An arrest affidavit released by pueblo police says, 33 year old Charles Wilkinson, the man who confessed to killing his girlfriend yesterday shot her 27 times. The report also says his mother talked him out of killing himself and encouraged him to seek help. Both Wilkinson and his mom called a priest and he escorted them to the police department. Wilkinson told them that his girlfriend had been cheating on him over the internet.

Jurors decided that Moussaoui was responsible for at least one death on 9/11. One of the three convictions Moussaoui could be executed for is conspiracy to use weapons of mass destruction.

If the owner doesn't pay the dog becomes the property of the Society and they'll decide what to do.

Even though the gang members might only be aiming at each other, police say anytime there is gunfire, it puts everyone in danger.
