- (1) **TERRORISM / CRIME:** CONCERN WITH LOCAL AFFECTS OF TERRORISM AS WELL THE AFFECTS OF THE REBUILDING OF IRAQ. ALSO CONTINUED CONCERN WITH GETTING TOUGH ON CRIMINALS BOTH LOCALLY AS WELL AS NATIONALLY.
- (2) **INDUSTRY / BUSINESS:** CONTINUED NEED TO BRING MORE DIVERSE AND UPSCALE INDUSTRY INTO THE AREA AND INCREASED NEED TO STRENGTHEN AND SUPPORT CURRENT INDUSTRIES.
- (3) **POLITICS:** COMMUNITY WANTING ETHICAL POLITICIANS AND FEEL THE NEED TO BE EDUCATED ON LOCAL/REGIONAL ISSUES THAT EFFECT THEIR DAILY LIVES.
- (4) **HEALTH / SAFETY:** WITH THE THREAT OF POSSIBLE BIO-TERRORISM, THE NEW "FLU" BUG AND "WEST NILE VIRUS" STILL TOP OF MIND, RESIDENTS STILL CONCERNED WITH PROTECTING THEMSELVES. ALSO RESIDENTS CONCERNED WITH HELPING ANY VICTIMS OF NATURAL DISASTERS ON NATIONAL AND LOCAL LEVEL.
- (5) **ENVIRONMENT:** DUE TO LACK OF PERCIPITATION IN SOUTHERN COLORADO, A DROUGHT CONDITION STILL EXISTS. CONCERN WITH WATER CONSERVATION, WILD FIRES AND SOIL EROSION IN THE AREA IS STILL STRONG.
- (6) **PLANNING:** WITH THE EXTENSIVE INFLUX OF NEW BUSINESSES AND A GROWING POPULATION, THERE IS A NEED TO BRING THE INFASTRUCTURE UP TO PAR FOR THE CITY OF COLORADO SPRINGS; INCLUDING NEW AND IMPROVED ROADS AND BRIDGES.

1. **TERRORISM / CRIME:** CONCERN WITH LOCAL AFFECTS OF TERRORISM AS WELL AS THE AFFECTS OF THE REBUILDING OF IRAQ. ALSO CONTINUED CONCERN WITH GETTING TOUGH ON CRIMINALS BOTH LOCALLY AS WELL AS NATIONALLY.

DATE BROADCAST: July 1, 2006 (2 Mins.)
BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Colorado Springs Police spent hours trying to get 2 criminal suspects out of an apartment unit after locking themselves inside. The standoff happened near the intersection of Fountain and Chelton. It all started this morning when 3 men walked up to another man asking him for a light, then began beating him with a baseball bat. He was able to get a way and went to the hospital, but on his way home he spotted 2 of the 3 suspects and called the police.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Nina Davis and Richard Seven Valdez were arrested in May after 2 of 3 children nearly drowned in their backyard swimming pool. Valdez is the father of one of the children. Now Nina has accepted a plea bargain that would force her to go against her boyfriend. Davis was also given a drug test after the accident and tested positive for methamphetamine.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: DUI checkpoints have been carefully laid out throughout the city targeting problem areas and dense traffic areas. Police say alcohol and drug related car wrecks are a major concern during holiday weekends because of a hike in the number of parties and celebrations. The sobriety checkpoints will be in progress until July 5th.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Colorado Springs Police need your help finding a serial bank robber. They're looking for a man who held up the Canon National Bank on West Colorado today at gunpoint. He is a white male, in his late 50's early 60's, with gray hair, a mustache and goatee. He was last seen wearing a grey T-shirt, dark pants, and a baseball cape with a red Texaco star logo. He is suspected of robbing a total of 4 banks since the middle of May.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Former Soldier, Steven Green, accused of killing 4 Iraqi civilians is charged today. Prosecutors say he and other soldiers killed 4 people including a woman they allegedly raped. US officials have said they thought the victims were killed by militants. An affidavit filed in court say green was discharged from the Army recently because of what the military called a "personality Disorder". If convicted he could get a death sentence.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: You might notice fewer cars riding your tail thanks to the Colorado State Patrol. Troopers are using a new device that can measure exactly how close cars are following, and authorities say they're enforcing it. One of the leading causes of car crashes in Colorado is cars riding too close together. If you're caught tailgating, you could be fined \$40 and have 4 points taken off your license.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: US Northern Command is now confirming North Korea fired as many as six missiles. All but one was short range and landed in the Sea of Japan, and the long range missile failed less than a minute after launch. NorthCom immediately detected all 6 missiles and quickly determined they posed no threat. The White House calls North Korea's action a provocative act, but says there was no immediate threat.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: The District attorney's Office has launched its own criminal investigation into the improper disposal of evidence by the Colorado Springs Police Department. They say this has been their intension all along, but they had to wait until all of the other agencies investigating the matter finished up with their reports. This investigation will only determine if any criminal violations occurred.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Canon City Teacher Jennie Overstreet was back in court today and had found probable cause on 19 of the 20 counts she faces. Those charges include sexual assault on a child by someone in a position of trust, enticement, and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. According to police records Overstreet gave alcohol and marijuana to young teenage boys she met while working as a teacher at Lincoln Elementary School.

The FBI says this is the real deal; a plot involving martyrdom. The Fed's say it was a "symphony of Cooperation and coordination" between authorities here and overseas that led to the discovery and disruption of this plot, but they stress Al Qaeda has an ongoing interest in attacking the US.

Green was charged last week in Federal court and could face the death penalty in the US. The 4 soldiers are accused of raping and killing a teenage girl after killing her parents and younger sister.

Velez spent 31 years moving through the ranks as an officer, hostage negotiator, homicide investigator and finally Chief; now he is turning in his badge for personal and professional reasons.

The 10 day training concludes this weekend on exercise day which ties everything together with a final test of combat training.

A Judge put the Court-martial on hold last year after the alleged victim's therapist, Jennifer Bier, refused to hand over confidential records from counseling sessions. The judge will decide on Friday to either drop the rape charge against the former cadet or put Bier behind bars.

Afterward Israeli warplanes tried to kill Hezbollah's Leader. The Air strike leveled Nasrallah's home and his office but a few hours later Nasrallah was on TV threatening Israel again.

They allegedly hit the bank at Broadmoor 2 different times, the Colorado National Bank, the Colorado Springs Credit Union, Chase Bank and the Bank at Briargate.

He has also submitted his resignation from the Air Force with hundreds of combat hours served.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: A military Judge in Texas decide not to drop a rape charge against Captain Joseph Harding. The judge also decided to encore and arrest warrant for Jennifer Bier, a civilian therapist, here in Colorado Springs. US marshals say they will meet Monday to determine how to enforce the arrest warrant for Bier.

Salazar finally stopped at fountain and Chelton. Nobody was hurt in the chase, but police say there was a 4 year old child strapped in the back seat.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: One Colorado Springs man is living a nightmare of having his family trapped between the Israeli army and the Hezbollah forces as they go into their 6th day of fighting. It is not easy when 10 of his extended family are stuck in Lebanon miles north of a deadly fight. In the meantime all he can do is wait for a phone calls from family to let him know they are ok.

Lebanon retaliated with 3 separate rocket attacks. This is the deadliest violence against Israel since the beginning of the conflict.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Jeremy Lamberth faces a charge of first degree murder in the Feb 22 shooting death of Detective Jared Jenson. Back on Feb 22nd Det. Jensen allegedly made contact with Jeremy Lamberth who was wanted for the attempted murder of his sister. That is when police say Lamberth gunned down Det. Jenson. The DA's office is still considering the death penalty but they still have at least 2 months to make that decision.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: A steady barrage of Hezbollah rockets hit the Israeli city of Haifa again, killing one man and injuring at least 14 others. Israel continued its air strikes over Lebanon killing at least 30 people. Soldiers used satellites to find the positions of Hezbollah Guerillas across a mountain then hit them with round after round of artillery. By the end of Tuesday more than 120 stranded Americans had been flown out of Lebanon, and by the end of the week there should be another thousand leaving by boat.

Today the Defense asked for the first degree murder charge dropped to a second degree charge. The judge declined saying there was enough evidence for the case to go to trial for first degree murder. Lamberth will enter his plea at his arraignment in September. The DA's office will have 60 days after that to determine if they want the death penalty.

Neither side appears to be backing down as the leader of Hezbollah vows to keep up the fight and Israel's prime minister says any cease fire agreement would need to include the return of two soldiers taken hostage. Meanwhile about 40 US Marines helped evacuate Americans from Lebanon on Navy transport ships on Thursday.

US ambassador to Cyprus, Robert Schlicher, says close to 4 thousand evacuees are expected by boat from Lebanon today in what he calls the most intense day for evacuations.

The intense air assault and fighting continues along the Israeli/Lebanese border killing dozens every day.

The president was joined by John Walsh, the host of "America's Most Wanted" as he signed the bill. Walsh and his wife have been working on the legislations for the past 2 years.
