- (1) **TERRORISM / CRIME:** CONCERN WITH LOCAL AFFECTS OF TERRORISM AS WELL THE AFFECTS OF THE REBUILDING OF IRAQ. ALSO CONTINUED CONCERN WITH GETTING TOUGH ON CRIMINALS BOTH LOCALLY AS WELL AS NATIONALLY.
- (2) **INDUSTRY / BUSINESS:** CONTINUED NEED TO BRING MORE DIVERSE AND UPSCALE INDUSTRY INTO THE AREA AND INCREASED NEED TO STRENGTHEN AND SUPPORT CURRENT INDUSTRIES.
- (3) **POLITICS:** COMMUNITY WANTING ETHICAL POLITICIANS AND FEEL THE NEED TO BE EDUCATED ON LOCAL/REGIONAL ISSUES THAT EFFECT THEIR DAILY LIVES.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Denver Broncos Cornerback Darrent Williams is dead after a drive by shooting in downtown Denver. Fans were shocked to wake up this morning and find out that one of the Bronco players had been killed. Williams was only 24 years old. Fans say he will be remembered as much for his character as his athletic ability. Fans also said that although the team lost one of the starters, they have high hopes for next season.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Prosecutors in Massachusetts are trying to send a Harvard Graduate student from Colorado back to prison for a deadly stabbing three years ago. Alexander Pring-Wilson of Colorado Springs was convicted in the 2003 stabbing death of a teenage cook. But a Judge later overturned his manslaughter conviction. Prosecutors say the judge abused her power and are headed back to court tomorrow to try to reinstate the conviction.

His criminal history shows that in 1992 he was convicted of 2 counts of statutory rape-carnal knowledge of a child 13-15 years old. His past also reveals a history of eluding, larceny, assault and battery, and failing to register as a sex offender twice.

The police department says it monitored the Hazmat team's entire investigation to make sure evidence was not tampered with.

Already there are critics and supporters of the plan and protests and support rallies were held in downtown Colorado Springs.

This was Pueblo's second jail break in 2 months. The county is now investigating the escape and performing a security audit.

He describes it as a larger and more resourceful version of the agency he left behind.

However, the Palestinian Leader says the United States and Israel are trying to ignite a civil war between Hamas and Fatah.

The two were loading a vehicle for a trip when the accident happened. The victim was rushed to Penrose Main Hospital where he later died.

If you are a resident of Castle West apartments, the Red Cross is asking you to check in with them so they know you are accounted for.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Late this afternoon we learned that the fire at Castle West Apartments has turned into a murder investigation. 2 people have been confirmed dead at the scene and 36 Year old Gene Johnson was arrested and charged with first degree murder. In the hunt for more suspects police are looking for an early 90's model gold Acura that has been seen around the scene the morning of the fire.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: After nearly three days, fire officials say the Castle West fire is finally under control. Colorado Springs Police announced they've arrested a second person in the case, 23 year old Derrick Johnson. He is the cousin to 36 year old Gene who was arrested Tuesday. Both are charged with first degree murder of the two people whose bodies were found inside the building. 31 others were hurt during the fire as well as 4 firefighters. Police say this spawned from a domestic dispute earlier this week between Derrick Johnson and his girlfriend. Police say they believe they have all those responsible for this fire in custody.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: The job of locating more evidence in the rubble of the large complex continued all day, and while the fire may be out investigators are trying to work away to protect the crime scene from the winter storm that is expected to come this week. Authorities believe 23 year old Derrick Johnson and his 36 year old cousin Gene set the fire after one of them was involved in a domestic dispute with a woman who lived at the complex. The woman and her child survived the fire but the two men are charged with first degree murder.

The outpouring of help to victims has been overwhelming over the past few days with countless donations.

Derrick Johnson and his cousin Gene Johnson are already under arrest charged with first degree murder.

The forms are available at any Colorado Springs Sub-station and police say you will need a detailed description of what they look like and what they were wearing as well as their name.

The judge issued a gag order on the case which means investigators and attorneys will no longer to talk about it. His cousin Derrick will make his first court appearance next week.

Rescue crews are hopeful that other climbers will learn from this incident, which it could happen to anyone. An autopsy will be performed tomorrow morning to determine the exact cause of death.

They said only a jury, not a judge, could make that decision.
