- (1) **TERRORISM / CRIME:** CONCERN WITH LOCAL AFFECTS OF TERRORISM AS WELL THE AFFECTS OF THE REBUILDING OF IRAQ. ALSO CONTINUED CONCERN WITH GETTING TOUGH ON CRIMINALS BOTH LOCALLY AS WELL AS NATIONALLY.
- (2) **INDUSTRY / BUSINESS:** CONTINUED NEED TO BRING MORE DIVERSE AND UPSCALE INDUSTRY INTO THE AREA AND INCREASED NEED TO STRENGTHEN AND SUPPORT CURRENT INDUSTRIES.
- (3) **POLITICS:** COMMUNITY WANTING ETHICAL POLITICIANS AND FEEL THE NEED TO BE EDUCATED ON LOCAL/REGIONAL ISSUES THAT EFFECT THEIR DAILY LIVES.

Private First Class Derek Gibson also died in that attack.

Yesterday at Horizon middle school, a resource officer arrested a 14 year old student for threatening to "shoot or kill people" at the school. Just last Monday at Horizon, an 11 year old and 12 year old were pulled from class for allegedly threatening online to kill a teacher.
