- (1) **TERRORISM / CRIME:** CONCERN WITH LOCAL AFFECTS OF TERRORISM AS WELL THE AFFECTS OF THE REBUILDING OF IRAQ. ALSO CONTINUED CONCERN WITH GETTING TOUGH ON CRIMINALS BOTH LOCALLY AS WELL AS NATIONALLY.
- (2) **INDUSTRY / BUSINESS:** CONTINUED NEED TO BRING MORE DIVERSE AND UPSCALE INDUSTRY INTO THE AREA AND INCREASED NEED TO STRENGTHEN AND SUPPORT CURRENT INDUSTRIES.
- (3) **POLITICS:** COMMUNITY WANTING ETHICAL POLITICIANS AND FEEL THE NEED TO BE EDUCATED ON LOCAL/REGIONAL ISSUES THAT EFFECT THEIR DAILY LIVES.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Thousands of people gathered in Baily to remember 16 year old Emily Keyes who was killed last Wednesday by a gunman in her high school. An open mic was set up so people could share their thoughts and memories. Schools have been closed in the area since the shooting, but classes will start up again on Thursday.

Parents also need to tell their children that tragic events like school shootings are uncommon.

It is disturbing to see teachers and coaches hurt the very kids they're supposed to be protecting. Studies show half of all young victims are abused by someone they know or trust.

They might single your child out by sending notes in class or buying them gifts. Experts say you should watch for any change of behavior with your child and ask questions.

Colorado Springs Fire captain Mike Dalton says no firefighter or city employee will ever solicit door to door. When in doubt you can always ask for an ID.

Eventually police officers will patrol the area to make sure trucks over more than 10 thousand pounds stay off. The bridge should be reopened tomorrow.
