11PM LOC/NEWS 10/12/08 1:43  
Students are celebrating a successful 45<sup>th</sup> annual Northwood University International Auto Show locally. This does not keep local Delphi plant workers from worrying about the future of their jobs. Right now the automakers are working to cut costs to stay afloat, as the worldwide credit crunch stalls sales.

11PM LOC/NEWS 10/14/08 1:27  
The Figure Skating Eastern Great Lakes Regional Competition will be performed at Midland's Civic Arena. Besides being an honor to have such a prestigious competition, it's a major boost to the local economy. There are 430 skaters, 100 coaches and about 2,000 family members coming along, needing hotel rooms and places to eat. Most of the folks in town for the event, stay 5 days and also shop the area stores.

11PM LOC/NEWS 10/27/08 1:19  
According to the DNR, Michigan's economy could get worse, if the current baiting ban were not implemented. Officials say the ban is a necessary evil that could stop problems for the economy in the future.

6PM NAT/NEWS 11/6/08 1:49  
Tonight leaders of the Big Three and the UAW are on Capitol Hill, looking for help paying for retiree health care. The House Speaker has been in private meetings with company executives about an additional \$25 billion in loans for future health care payments. General Motors is expected to announce important changes this coming Friday, the same day earnings numbers are posted.

5PM NAT/NEWS 11/18/0 1:30  
Top executives of the Big Three and the UAW are in Washington, pleading their case for a bailout, and at the same time answering tough questions posed by the U.S. Senate. The Senate Committee voices concerns over how the American auto industry is being run, and requesting a better business model before any kind of loan is approved.

WAKEUP LOC/NAT NEWS 11/20/08 1:32  
Michigan's Governor Granholm has cut short her trip to the Middle East. Today she heads to Washington, DC, urging lawmakers to loan \$25 billion to the Big Three. Its Proposal came to a halt yesterday and now efforts are being made to save Detroit's Big Three by re-directing existing funds.

WAKEUP NAT/NEWS 12/8/08 1:55  
After weeks of deadlock over Detroit, Democratic leaders are calling Congress back to vote on a plan offering the Big Three a bridge loan proposal. If it isn't approved, approximately 500,000 jobs would be impacted, and the ripple effect to other businesses. Currently, there is a division among the Senate on whether or not to assist the auto industry.

11PM LOC/NEWS 12/13/08 1:10  
Local GM workers have little Christmas Spirit with news from Capitol Hill of the failed bridge loan to the Big Three automakers. Parents plan to skip exchanging gifts to each other, and focus on making their children's Christmas a merry event.

6PM LOC/NEWS 12/15/08 1:20  
Members of UAW Local 699, in Saginaw, fill food boxes for the needy in their annual Christmas drive. Workers wonder, however, what's happening on Capital Hill where the Bush Administration works on details of a rescue package for domestic automakers, after the Senate voted down a bridge loan earlier this week.

6PM NAT/NEWS 12/22/08 :43  
One of the stipulations of getting more than \$17 billion in government loans is that auto workers take a wage cut. UAW President Ron Gettelfinger vowed to fight any deal that called for a cut in labor costs. GM's CEO defended the auto workers and said he remains hopeful the company and the union can strike a deal.

WAKEUP LOC/NEWS 12/30/08 :14  
Dura Automotive in Gladwin will officially close its doors tomorrow. The 150 jobs will be moved to its Mexico plant. The business makes auto structural products, brake and pedal assemblies, exterior trim and other automotive hardware pieces.

### 3. Crime

6PM LOC/NEWS 10/1/08 :20  
Shortly after noon today, on Alexander Street in Flint, police found a man shot in the head. He was rushed to the hospital where he was pronounced dead. The Flint SWAT team arrested two persons of interest around the block from the scene.

6PM LOC/NEWS 10/9/08 :16  
Flint police investigate a fatal shooting in the 900 block of East York Street. Officers say a 32-year-old man was gunned down shortly after 4 a.m. No word on any suspects.

530PM LOC/NEWS 10/16/08 :34  
Four students were shot outside the Henry Ford High School in Detroit, shortly after classes were dismissed this afternoon. Police say the gunman opened fire on the students about a block away, hitting 3 boys and 1 girl. At this time, their conditions are not being released, and the shooter is still at large.

11PM LOC/NEWS 10/26/08 :25  
Saginaw police investigate a murder which occurred at a home near 10<sup>th</sup> and Walnut Streets. The victim has not been identified. Police say he is a Latino man in his forties, who was shot to death.

11PM LOC/NEWS 10/26/08 1:25  
Police say a man cut open the screen window to an 11-year-old girl's bedroom and kidnapped her at knifepoint. He took her back to his apartment where he sexually assaulted her. The girl managed to escape. Police were able to locate him and he is currently inside the Clare County jail.

5PM LOC/NEWS 11/12/08 1:15  
A domestic dispute forced a Bay City police officer to shoot at a suspect. That suspect is dead this morning. Investigators say a man broke into a home on N. Birney Street, where his ex-wife and 3 children lived. The man had a gun and fired outside at police officers, causing them to return fire. There is still some question about who is responsible for the man's death, since it is unknown if he shot himself or was hit by the police fire.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/13/08 1:10  
As customers were entering Sherman Market in Flint, shots were fired in front of the building. When the shooting stopped, a man was lying near the front door with gunshot wound to his chest. Police are not certain why the man was shot, but say it could be over drugs. Family members say he was a good guy who liked everyone.

530PM LOC/NEWS 11/18/08 1:30  
A man was shot in front of Sherman Market earlier this week. Police have arrested four suspects, but two of them have already been let go. The area where the store is located is not a good part of town and customers of the store do not wish to speak about the incident. Police say motive for the shooting could be drugs, and ask anyone who has information to give them a call.

5PM LOC/NEWS 11/25/08 1:24  
A local pastor is shot dead inside his SUV near the intersection of Myrtle and Marvin, and now police are searching for two suspects, last seen leaving the area carrying handguns. Neighbors say the pastor left behind a daughter and was known for his work at several local churches.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/29/08 1:14  
Saginaw Police are looking for a woman who may be the girlfriend of a 36-year-old man found lying in a yard on Hadley yesterday. He had been shot several times and later died at St. Mary's Hospital. Police are now treating the shooting as a homicide and wish to bring the girlfriend in for questioning.

WAKEUP LOC/NEWS 12/10/08 :28  
A late night double shooting has Saginaw police searching for suspects. It happened at the St. Paul Townhouse Village in the 300 block of Vestry Drive. The victims suffered non-life threatening injuries.





5PM NAT/NEWS 11/26/08 1:31

President-elect Obama took a break from his transition work to hand out food to the needy the day before Thanksgiving. Joined by his wife and two daughters, the first family braved the elements in a church courtyard, giving out grocery bags and well wishes.

4PM NAT/NEWS 12/10/08 2:21

The Governor of Illinois, Rod Blagojevich apparently was recorded saying he plans to sell the senate seat recently vacated by Barack Obama. Blagojevich is facing federal charges for alleged plot to swap Obama's open Senate seat for cash or a job.

11PM LOC/NEWS 12/17/08 :22

Governor Granholm's spokeswoman says the governor made it clear today, she does not want to be considered for an appointment in President-elect Obama's new administration at this time. Granholm had been mentioned as a possible candidate for Secretary of Labor.

WAKEUP NAT/NEWS 12/22/08 1:40

The Obama transition team is focusing on the middle class. Vice President-elect Joe Biden will chair a task force to evaluate how policies may affect middle class families. Four cabinet members and other presidential advisors will be part of the group.

530PM NAT/NEWS 12/22/08 1:45

While President-elect Obama relaxes during the 12 days of Christmas, his economic team has been ordered to think bolder. They have recently learned the economy is in much worse shape than previously thought, so transition aides are now huddling with Democratic leaders in Congress to craft a stimulus plan up to \$775 billion to try and jolt the economy.

## 5. Wars in the Middle East

11PM NAT/NEWS 10/16/08 1:50

While Gwen Beberg fights in an Iraqi war zone, her mother fights to get the daughter's dog, Ratchet, from Iraq to Minnesota. In May, troops found the dog in a burning pile of trash and brought him back to the base where he bonded with Specialist Beberg. The family says the dog will help their daughter deal with post-traumatic stress when she is done with her Middle East stint. Currently, the dog is still in Iraq.

11PM LOC/NEWS 10/17/08 2:04

A young girl is told by her grandmother they are picking up a "college friend" at the airport today. In truth, the family is picking up the girl's father, home from a stint in Iraq. They want his return to be a surprise. It proved to be a powerful moment between father and daughter. The reunion will last just a few days, before dad flies back overseas.

11PM LOC/NEWS 10/19/08 :32  
A Vassar native, fighting in Afghanistan is featured in CBS's 60 Minutes. The staff sergeant is in the Army's 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division and his unit was center stage for a 60 Minute segment, on conditions on the ground in the war. During the piece, the local man described what it was like when he got to Afghanistan.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/12/08 1:25  
The principal of Goodrich High School has been notified of deployment to Iraq. He now has the job of breaking the news to not only his own two children, but also telling the 700 Goodrich students. He feels regret over missing the senior class's graduation day, but has served as a reservist with the army for 24 years. He feels his skills as an educator are probably what earmarked him for the Iraq tour.

5PM NAT/NEWS 11/24/08 1:38  
Several bombings of Baghdad, within hours of each other, caused Iraqi government to tighten security there and sent more undercover agents into the streets. This happened just 48 hours before the Iraqi parliament vote on whether or not to let U.S. forces stay in Iraq for 3 more years. Mr. Obama wants to withdraw most U.S. troops by 2010.

530PM NAT/NEWS 11/26/08 1:38  
Lawmakers in Iraq are currently working on an agreement with the U.S. which would allow U.S. forces to legally stay in Iraq through 2011. Lawmakers are debating whether or not to allow the Iraqi people to vote on the measure next year. President-elect Obama is tracking the bill's progress. He will need that agreement in place when he takes office.

WAKEUP LOC/NEWS 12/05/08 :24  
A soldier surprises his two children at a Genesee County elementary school. He made a surprise appearance during a patriotism assembly at the elementary school. The soldier is done with active duty, and home now for good.

4PM NAT/NEWS 12/15/08 :27  
Iraqis gather in Baghdad today to protest the arrest of a journalist who threw shoes at President Bush, this past weekend. After the incident the man was taken away by security. Mr. Bush was in Iraq to celebrate a security pact to withdraw U.S. troops.

5PM LOC/NEWS 12/17/08 1:30  
At least three units will be returning to the area this coming Sunday, including about 130 soldiers from the 125<sup>th</sup> Infantry and 1,600 National Guardsmen. Families prepare for their arrival with excitement and a desire to make the holidays unforgettable.

11PM LOC/NEWS 12/21/08 :45  
Today, 90 soldiers of the Fox Company were welcomed back at Saginaw Valley State University by their loved ones.

11PM LOC/NEWS 12/21/08 1:23

Families waited at Delta College for the Bravo Company to perform their final army rituals and be dismissed to them. Soldiers reunited with children who had either been born or had grown in their father's absence, wives clung to their husbands and parents shed tears of joy for the safe return of their sons and daughters.

Soldiers from Flint's 125<sup>th</sup> Infantry Headquarters were welcomed home with hugs, kisses, tears and cheers at Grand Blanc high school today, after spending almost a year providing security force protection in Camp Ramadi, Iraq.

7PM LOC/NEWS 11/08/08 1:30  
Thousands of residents in Genesee County were left in the dark over five hours today, and many local businesses were forced to close their doors. Apparently a 46,000 volt line faulted, knocking power out of the area and leaving over 9,000 Consumer Power customers in the dark for over five hours.

5PM LOC/NEWS 11/10/08 1:30  
Snow has lots of folks in the northern part of Michigan primed for winter. In Gaylord yesterday, more than 6 inches covered the ground. Some residents even started their snowmobiles, and said the snow actually came a little later than usual this time of year.

5PM NAT/NEWS 11/12/08 :16  
People in South Dakota are still waiting for help a week after huge snowstorm hit the state. Several feet of snow fell causing thousands to be without power. Some folks have simply left the area until power returns, while others burn anything flammable in an effort to keep warm.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/24/08 1:04  
A light snow falling just before rush-hour traffic, created problems later in the evening. There were so many accidents that Genesee County's Central Dispatch could not tally the numbers.

6PM LOC/NEWS 12/09/08 1:25  
Midland County is one of the hardest hit in the area with the latest snowfall. TV5's Reporter went to that area and shows folks dealing with the white stuff with shovels, Plows and salt.

530PM LOC/NEWS 12/10/08 1:25  
A big freeze in the weather caused Isabella County's "Meals on Wheels" program to halt service for the day. All routes were cancelled with no deliveries for homebound seniors. On average, the organization delivers 600 to 800 meals every day, but was forced to close their services for two days straight.

6PM LOC/NEWS 12/19/08 1:13  
Today's snowfall covered the entire TV5 viewing area. TV5's reporter rode along with a Saginaw County Road Commission truck driver, as he cleared area roads. At times the road was not visible at all, but the driver likes his job, even though it can be dangerous.

11PM LOC/NEWS 12/23/08 1:35  
Just before Christmas, Mother Nature brought another round of bad weather with snow, ice, slush and wind. Local roads are icy, causing fuel delivery delays, and making snow

plow drivers work long hours clearing streets. Saginaw County Dispatch has sent officers to almost 90 car accidents.

5PM LOC/NEWS 12/27/08 1:30

A combination of piled-up snow and rain makes for a heavy, wet, never-ending mess. Residents hurry to clear away the latest slush created by unusual rain today, before tomorrow arrives with freezing temperatures again. Another unusual December problem is flooding basements and low areas, caused by the amount of rain dumped today.

## 8. Gas/Fuel Prices

11PM LOC/NEWS 10/05/08 1:20

One gas station in Genesee County charges \$.05 to \$.18 less per gallon to its customers. This has one man who drives to Lansing to work daily, appreciating the discount. Those savings could fuel curiosity and lead many to ask why gas prices are so high at other places around the state. But not here, customers just appreciate the discount.

530PM LOC/NEWS 10/07/08 1:30

While Saginaw area residents enjoy today's mild weather, they worry about what is around the corner. There is concern about what heating bills will look like when snow starts flying and temperatures drop. TV5 interviewed Consumer Powers today.

WAKEUP LOC/NEWS 10/15/08 :26

On the border of Flint and Genesee Township, a station sells gas for \$2.75. Right next door, another gas station sells fuel for the same price. Its part of a trend of falling gas prices in mid-Michigan, and around the nation.

4PM LOC/NEWS 10/20/08 :16

Gas prices in Michigan are going down. AAA says prices in the state have fallen \$.22 since last week, to a state average of \$2.85. The cheapest gas in Michigan is in the Tri-City area, at \$2.81, with Marquette the most expensive, at \$3.01.

5PM LOC/NEWS 10/23/08 1:31

With gas prices dropping, there is a bit of a break for drivers and people in the lawn care business. These business owners plan to enjoy the break while it lasts. Nationwide, the average price of gas is about \$1.25 less than what it was in July.

5PM LOC/NEWS 11/10/08 1:15

There is not much to complain about recently when gas prices in the Saginaw/Bay area are the cheapest in Michigan. Some stations are selling regular unleaded for \$1.93. Some economists say the drop at the pump is a result of America's financial crisis. Oil prices are lower and the U.S. gas demand is decreasing.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/23/08 1:10  
After seeing gas prices soar to record highs in recent months, motorists enjoy the current low prices. With Thanksgiving and the travel that goes with holiday nearing, it makes for inexpensive traveling. Folks are heading from Saginaw to Grand Blanc, St. Charles to Florida and from Indiana to Saginaw, to celebrate the national holiday.

WAKEUP LOC/NEWS 11/27/08 :22  
One thing drivers can give thanks for today is gas prices. AAA is reporting the state wide average is the cheapest it's been in more than 3 years. We are showing you prices at this gas station going for \$1.48. Last year, at this time, it was \$3.09.

11PM NAT/NEWS 12/06/08 1:16  
The Congressional House Speaker has softened her opposition to using \$25 billion from a research program to develop fuel efficient cars, to extend the Big Three American automakers a lifeline intended to keep them out of bankruptcy. The only silver lining to the current economic turmoil is at the gas pump. The average price of gas per gallon fell for the eighth straight day to \$1.75 per gallon.

11PM LOC/NEWS 12/09/08 1:15  
Yesterday TV5 reported that fuel costs are at a five-year low. TV5 went scouting for the best deal in Genesee County. Our reporter found two gas stations selling gas for under \$1.30. It's not a special promotion, but a mini gas war that appears to be generating the low prices.

4PM LOC/NEWS 12/15/08 :24  
Gas prices continue to stay low across mid-Michigan. The prices have actually increased by \$.10, according to AAA. The state average, right now, is \$1.70.

530PM LOC/NEWS 12/18/08 :21  
Crude oil prices dropped to a four and a half year low, at \$36 a barrel. OPEC's record production cut of 2.2 million barrels a day has had little impact on prices. Demand for oil continues to weaken, as the global recession worsens.

530PM LOC/NEWS 12/18/08 1:00  
If the proposed 18 percent gas tax increase is passed in Michigan, we would jump ahead of California and have the highest gasoline tax in the nation. The reason for the proposed increase is to repair roads. The Michigan Transportation Association promotes the tax, while the Michigan Petroleum Association is against it.

## 9. Sex Offenders/Gay Rights

530PM NAT/NEWS 10/16/08 1:00  
With Halloween right around the corner, a lot of parents are looking for ways to keep their little ones safe. Trick-or-treaters in Maryland will see something new this year. There will be warning signs, telling children and parents to stay away from certain homes, of registered sex offenders.

530PM LOC/NEWS 10/16/08 :37  
The Livingston County sheriff now says a teen-age girl will likely be charged with distribution of child pornography. The 14-year-old teen took a nude picture of herself and sent it, in a text message, to her friends. The girl says the message was only intended for 4 people, but at least 200 classmates have the picture on their phones.

6PM LOC/NEWS 10/20/08 1:15  
Today, agencies across Michigan begin a coordinated sweep to catch sex offenders who haven't verified their home addresses with local police. The project is called "Operation Verify," and is scheduled to run until the end of the month.

530PM LOC/NEWS 10/21/08 1:29  
A decoy home was set up in a Grand Rapids Township, which produced the arrest of more suspects than the local sheriff expected. The men traveled to the home for one reason, to have sex with a child. The state's attorney general teamed up with the Kent County sheriff to initiate this sting effort.

6PM LOC/NEWS 10/30/08 :19  
A registered sex offender is currently enrolled as a student at Dow High School in Midland. School officials are assessing the situation and they say the family has been cooperating with the administration.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/2/08 1:30  
A woman walking on a sidewalk on Ames Street in Saginaw, was forced into a nearby garage by a man and was raped and severely beaten. She then came to neighbors for help, who called police. After collecting evidence, Saginaw police are also asking for anyone with information to contact them.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/3/08 1:02  
Police made dozens of arrests across the state, during "Operation Verify", a sting operation which ran from October 20 to October 31. Its purpose was to identify those sex offenders who had not updated their current address on the sex offender registry. One of the arrests happened in Bridgeport, where a man charged with two felonies was identified and arrested.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/05/08 3:15  
TV5's reporter did a profile of a sex offender, describing what that is, how it can happen, and following specific individuals identified as offenders. A certified sex therapist gives insight into these individuals.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/20/08 1:15  
9-1-1 dispatched an officer to Bay City Central High School today for an attempted sexual assault. Right now, authorities will only say that the victim and the attacker are juveniles. Parents want to know how something like this could happen at 1 p.m.

11PM LOC/NEWS 11/21/08 1:15  
Police say the alleged attack happened inside a bathroom at Bay City Central high school bathroom. A 14-year-old boy is now charged with an attempted sexual assault. Now 31 years into the case, detectives have discovered a long string of boyfriends and girlfriends of Christa's, and suspect that jealousy may have been the motive in her murder. However, recent information has led back to the Sal Mineo connection, and his murderer, Lionel Williams, who served 12 years for the crime. After sifting through all the drama of Christa's life, could the detectives discover that she was simply the victim of a random street robbery at the hand of a career criminal? Due to his stalking-like behavior, she also had a restraining order against Zapata. Though Officer Greg Martin found Zapata's behavior strange, the results of his lie detector test were inconclusive. With no physical evidence, the case stalled. Eugene Zapata moved back into the house he had once occupied with Jeanette and acted as though nothing had happened. He explained to the children that Jeanette had simply taken off because she was stressed. In November 2004, Jeanette's best friend, Peggy Weekly -- who never believed that Jeanette would abandon her three children -- contacted police in Madison to reopen the case. Assigned to the case was Detective Marianne Flynn Statz, who after a preliminary investigation, was convinced that Jeanette had been killed and that the right suspect was Eugene. She contacted Linda Zapata, who expressed her own doubts regarding her father's innocence and agreed to help police with their case. After a thorough investigation, Eugene Zapata was arrested for the murder of Jeanette. His trial began in September 2007, but ended in a hung jury. Prosecutor Bob Kaiser was ready to go back to court and try Zapata again, when Zapata surprised everyone and agreed to answer questions regarding Jeanette's disappearance, but only if prosecutors would reduce the charge from murder to reckless homicide. His daughter Linda agreed. According to Eugene, he had argued with Jeanette the morning of October 11, 1976 and when her back was turned, hit her on the head with a paperweight and then strangled her twice. Then he began a grisly thirty year odyssey with her body: burying it, exhuming it, reburying it, and eventually he cut her body into pieces and took it to a land fill. Eugene Zapata was sentenced to five years for reckless homicide. Linda Zapata has been cut off from her immediate family: despite Eugene's plea, her brother and sister believe that their father is innocent. Goudey and Stryker had been dating but friends believed they were ready to break up, even though they had planned to vacation together. Less than two weeks before the trip, witnesses say they heard the couple arguing; and it was the last night Goudey was seen alive. Four days after she was last seen at the hospital, Goudey was found facedown, wrapped in a blanket in the back of her car, in a remote corner of the hospital parking lot. The medical examiner determined it was murder and Stryker became the number one suspect. Nothing police found at the scene pointed directly to Stryker, but it was what they didn't find at the scene that did: her tote bag, the jacket she was wearing and her briefcase were in Stryker's possession. Soon after, Stryker got himself an attorney and the investigation stalled. Goudey's family eventually filed a wrongful death suit. Finally, in 2006, after many delays, the suit finally went to a civil court trial where a jury believed Dr. Stryker killed Dr. Lin Goudey and ordered him to pay Lin's family \$15 million. Nobody was surprised that Stryker said he would appeal, but everyone was surprised when he and his lawyer announced they had found a brand new witness. After being questioned by the police, the witness, Craig Pizzano, admitted that Stryker had put him up to it. Stryker was arrested for perjury. This trial hasn't begun yet, but Goudey's family hopes that eventually Stryker will be charged with murder. (C: Richard Schlesinger - P: Deborah Grau)

**48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Blood and Money On Horseshoe Bay"** - a report on the November 2005 murder of Charlie White, a larger-than-life Texas millionaire who lived a lavish lifestyle in Horseshoe Bay, Texas. When police were called to White's lakeside mansion, they found his body, which had been brutally beaten, with an extension cord wrapped around his neck several times. By first impression, White was a very likeable person, but as police investigated his murder, a darker image of White emerged -- one of a cruel man with a dangerous mean streak sharpened by arrogance, alcohol, and women. With an unbridled passion for the fairer sex, White bedded and rated the sexual prowess of over a thousand women, including strippers, prostitutes, and even the girlfriends of his own son Darin, who Charlie used to pick up women to fulfill his needs. As the murder investigation unfolded, police focused on the troubled relationship between father and son and soon settled on Darin as the main suspect. When Darin voluntarily came in for questioning, he admitted to being with Charlie the night he died. Darin claimed that after a trip to Wal-Mart, they returned home, where he and his father got into an argument that turned dangerously violent -- Darin believed that his father was going to kill him. After Darin beat and choked his father, he went upstairs to bed and the next morning, drove to his mother's house in New Mexico. But the Texas Rangers didn't buy Darin's story and found no evidence to show that 73-year-old Charlie put up a fight at all. Arrested for his father's murder, prosecutors maintained that it was a case of premeditated murder. But Darin's attorney, Eddie Shell, maintained that it was a misdemeanor murder and a crime of sudden passion, which carries a much lighter sentence. Shell believed that Darin exploded and killed his father in a fit of rage -- one that was brought on by years of torment and physical abuse. In the end, the jury sentenced Darin White to twenty years confinement in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Institutional Division for the murder of his father, Charlie White. 11/08/08      **48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Vegas Heat"** - a report on the December 14, 2005 discovery of the charred corpse of a young woman, found in a burned-out car on a Las Vegas, Nevada desert road. The car was registered to Kelly Ryan, a fitness champion who is married to Craig Titus, a Mr. Olympia competitor. Both were stars of the body building world and also hard partiers, known for using illegal drugs and pain killers. The unrecognizable body was initially thought to be Ryan, but authorities were stunned when they arrived at the couple's house only to be greeted by her at the door. When asked about the car, Craig and Kelly claimed that it had been taken the day before by Melissa James, their 31-year-old live-in assistant and a dancer, who was headed to New Jersey to spend Christmas with her mother. Melissa never made it to New Jersey and when pressed, Craig and Kelly accused her of theft -- that she stole the Jaguar and used Kelly's debit card to steal from them. Detectives were lucky and discovered that Kelly's debit card was last used at Wal-Mart by Kelly, who purchased seven bottles of lighter fluid. Panicked by the police visit, Craig and Kelly confided in Megan Foley, Kelly's friend, that a fight between Kelly and Melissa had spiraled out of control -- Kelly tased Melissa, injected her with narcotics and that it ended when Craig choked her. Megan's attorney contacted the police. Armed with that information, police issued a warrant for their arrest. Eventually, the FBI tracked the couple to Boston, where they were charged with murder and arson. Twenty-one days after the body was found, it was officially identified as Melissa James. But because the body was so badly burned, the coroner could not say for sure how Melissa died or if it was even murder. Craig had a different story and in an interview, told 48 HOURS that Melissa had attacked Kelly and that he interceded on his wife's behalf. Enraged, Melissa ran upstairs to her room and when Craig checked on her, she was dead. Craig also claimed that he, Melissa, and Kelly had been using drugs for days leading up to the fight and that her death was an overdose. High on drugs, they panicked and disposed of her body in the desert. As the trial was about to begin, Craig and Kelly each accepted a plea deal -- Craig for second-degree murder, kidnapping, and arson; Kelly for battery and arson. After further courtroom dramatics, Craig Titus was sentenced to 21 to 55 years and Kelly Ryan to six to 17 years in prison. Craig has filed a motion to reduce his sentence. Kelly says her marriage to Craig is over. (C: Peter Van Sant - P: Chuck Stevenson, Chris O'Connell)

11/15/08      **48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Truth On Trial"** - an update of "Sex, Lies And The Doctor's Wife" (OAD: 11/12/05; rebroadcast on 06/06/06). Karen Tipton, a mother of two and the wife of prominent psychiatrist Dr. David Tipton, was found stabbed to death in her Decatur, Alabama home in March 1999. Police quickly ruled out the husband as a suspect, and a month later arrested 24-year-old Daniel Wade Moore, who worked for the alarm company that had installed a security system in the Tipton home. Moore, a drug user, had initially confessed to his uncle to being present at the scene of the murder, but later retracted his statement. Despite the lack of physical evidence, Moore was tried, convicted and sentenced to death row. Eight months following the conviction, Moore's defense attorneys discovered that prosecutors had withheld potentially conclusive information in the case including an FBI report suggesting that Karen was having multiple affairs, and may have known her killer. In a stunning reversal in February 2005, the same judge who sentenced Moore to death released him from prison. The state appealed the decision and Daniel Moore is now awaiting a new trial that could set him free. Update: In February 2008, Daniel Wade Moore returned to court, this time with the FBI report and new witnesses. After six days of deliberation and nine years to the day that Karen Tipton was murdered, Moore's second trial ended with a hung jury. The judge had no choice but to declare a mistrial and Moore was sent back to the Morgan County jail. One month after the mistrial, Moore was told that he would be allowed to wait for his next trial at home. Currently free on \$150,000 bond, Moore's third trial is set to begin on April 13th, 2009, in Decatur -- even though several jurors say Daniel Wade Moore will never be convicted in his hometown. **48 HOURS MYSTERY: "The Mortgage And The Murder"** - For nearly a year, twenty-year-old Renee Ohlemacher was suspected in the murder of her parents, Bernadette and Greg, who were shot in their Albuquerque, New Mexico home on the early morning of August 2, 2005. Renee says that, upon hearing the gunshots, she hid in a closet and called the police. Certain that the killer knew the couple, investigators began questioning her every move. Her family also had their doubts about her innocence -- she was set to inherit nearly \$1 million from a life insurance policy purchased by her mother. However, no physical evidence linked Renee to the crime. Then, nearly a year later, it was discovered that Ron Santiago, the murdered couple's mortgage broker, had once owned a 9-millimeter Ruger handgun, the same type of gun that had killed the Ohlemachers. Police searched his home and found a 9-millimeter shell casing in a bag in his garage. Santiago was arrested, charged and jailed for the murder, but was later released on bail because of a judge's ruling that the search of Santiago's house was illegal. This decision is being appealed by the District Attorney. Meanwhile, Ohlemacher family members still believe that Renee carried out a plan to murder her parents, and that the true killer is still at large. They have filed a civil suit against both Renee and Ron Santiago in their search for answers. (C: Erin Moriarty - P: Paul LaRosa)

**48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Drawn To Murder" (9:00-11:00p)** - a report on the February 1987 murder of 37-year-old Peggy Hettrick in Fort Collins, Colorado. Her mutilated, half naked body was discovered in a field near the home of Tim Masters, a 15-year-old who lived near the crime scene. He said he had seen the body on his way to school but, thinking it was a mannequin, he did not report it to the police. He then became a suspect when police searched his home and found his collection of knives and his drawings of graphic images of murder and mutilation. Under interrogation, he adamantly denied any knowledge of the murder -- and since police had no actual evidence linking him to the crime, he was not arrested. Ten years later, prompted by the opinions of Dr. Reid Meloy, an expert on sexual homicide, the police did arrest Masters for the murder. He was put on trial, convicted and went to prison in 1999, sentenced to life without parole. After losing two appeals, he appealed again, claiming ineffective counsel. His defense team then uncovered important items of evidence never given to Masters' original lawyers, although they had been entitled to them. This included, among other things, questions surrounding Dr. Richard Hammond, a prominent eye surgeon who also lived near the crime scene and who had been arrested for voyeurism. And now, for the first time, DNA tests were done on Peggy Hettrick's clothing. These tests found no DNA of Tim Masters, but did find that of Hettrick's ex-boyfriend, Matt Zoellner, and that of two other males. - 12/06/08      **48 HOURS MYSTERY: "The Guessing Game"** - a report on the January 11th, 1999 murder of Belinda Temple and her unborn child. A resident of Katy, Texas, Belinda was married to David Temple, once the celebrated defensive linebacker at his high school and now a successful and respected football coach, and mother to their one son, Evan. After an afternoon of errands with Evan, David returned home to what appeared to be forced entry and found Belinda in the couple's bedroom closet, shot in the head. Homicide detectives believed that the crime scene had been staged -- nothing was stolen from the home and the way the pieces of glass fell from the broken back door of the Temple's home seemed unusual, as if the glass was broken with the door already opened. Detectives were also troubled when they learned that David was having an affair with a fellow teacher, Heather Scott, who eventually became his second wife. Three months after the crime, a grand jury was convened, but nobody was indicted. With no DNA evidence, no eyewitnesses, no murder weapon, and no incriminating fingerprints linking David Temple to the crime, years passed until 2004, when Scott Peterson was convicted of killing his pregnant wife in a trial that captured the nation's attention. The similarities in both murders gave authorities a renewed confidence in their circumstantial case against David. Prosecutor Kelly Siegler finally got some forensic evidence, when after years of laboratory snafus and delays, a critical FBI report came back and indicated traces of gunshot residue on David's jacket. On November 29th, 2004, David was arrested for the murder of his wife, Belinda. After a contentious trial with David's attorney, Dick DeGuerin, David was found guilty and sentenced to life in prison. He will be eligible for parole in 2037, when he will be 69 years old. (C: Richard Schlesinger - P: Gail Abbott Zimmerman, Jenna Jackson)

In the first case, in 2002, young television reporter Jennifer Servo was found murdered weeks after moving to Abeline, Texas to begin a new job at KRBC-TV. Co-workers suspected an ex-boyfriend, Ralph Sepulveda, who had moved to Texas with her, but with whom she had recently broken up. Investigators also suspected a fellow reporter, Brian Travers, who had recently begun a romantic relationship with Jennifer. In the five years since the murder, police have not been able to make an arrest but vow not to give up until the case is solved. In the second case, Patty Scoville moved to Vermont in September 1991 to become a children's ski instructor, but just three weeks later, she disappeared and was found raped and murdered on a local scenic hiking trail. The investigation turned up more than 20 suspects: men Patty knew or those who had been in the park that day. The best evidence in solving the murder would be DNA, but Vermont was one of the last states to have a DNA data base. After seven years of lobbying by her parents, the Vermont DNA database was enacted into law. Seven additional years after it was established, and fourteen years after the murder the case was solved: Howard Godfrey, a 59-year-old window installer, was charged and found guilty. Polaroid pictures revealing the position of the victims' bodies at the scene of the killings showed that Winger's account of the events lacked credibility. Seven years after the deaths of Donnah Winger and Roger Harrington, Mark Winger was tried and found guilty of murder. He was sentenced to life in prison. In June 2007, Winger stood trial in Pontiac and claimed that the whole thing was a fantasy he never planned to carry out. Mark Winger was convicted of soliciting murder and sentenced to another 35 years. He will never be eligible for parole. Winger's second wife has divorced him. Donnah's parents, Sara Jane and Ira Drescher, are helping other abused women and have established a fund in Donnah's name at "Women in Distress", an organization dedicated to empowering domestic violence victims. - 12/20/08      **48 HOURS MYSTERY: "Power, Passion and Poison"** - a report on the death of 50-year-old Kathy Augustine, a career politician from Nevada. Questions arose about the cause of her death after police received a tip from her husband's co-worker that she may have been poisoned, and toxicology reports further confirmed the presence of the powerful paralytic drug Succinylcholine. That discovery led to further questions about the death three years earlier of her estranged husband, Charles Augustine; her subsequent and immediate marriage to Chaz Higgs, a nurse who had cared for him, and if politics played any part in her death. Upon further investigation, Chaz Higgs was arrested and charged with the murder of Kathy Augustine. He is currently free on bail and his trial is scheduled to begin next month. Nevada authorities are no longer investigating alleged threats against Augustine by political enemies. Includes interviews with Augustine's parents, Phil & Kay Alfano; Reno Police Detective, Dave Jenkins; Charles Augustine's sons from a previous marriage, Larry and Greg. **Update** for this rebroadcast: At the trial, prosecutor Christopher Hicks portrayed Chaz Higgs as a calculated murderer, but defense attorney David Houston revealed that it was discovered that Kathy Augustine had a heart condition - mitral valve prolapse with regurgitation - and argued that she died of a heart attack. The coroner's office disagreed and stood by their original conclusion, that Kathy Augustine died from Succinylcholine toxicity. Chaz Higgs took the stand for his defense and that night, tried to commit suicide by slitting his wrists. Two days later, he returned to court, was cross examined, and denied that it was a sympathy ploy. After nine days of testimony, the jury found Chaz Higgs guilty of first degree murder. He was sentenced to life in prison, but is eligible for parole in twenty years. Higgs is appealing his conviction.
