KCNC-TV QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST

Attached are listings of broadcasts or broadcast segments, which, in the station's judgment, reflect the station's most significant programming treatment of ascertained community issues during the period from January 1, 2005 – March 31, 2005.

KCNC broadcasts both locally produced and network programming. Although we include only local programs herein, KCNC also broadcasts several network programs including Face The Nation, 60 Minutes, 60 Minutes II and 48 Hours, which we believe also serve community needs and interests.

PROGRAM INDEX

CBS4 MORNING - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: Two hours Monday - Friday 5:00 am - 7:00am. One hour Saturday 7:00am - 8:00am. Two hours Sunday 6:00am – 8:00am.

CBS4 AT NOON - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday - Friday, 12:00pm - 12:30pm

CBS4 AT 4 - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One hour Monday - Friday, 4:00pm - 5:00pm

CBS4 AT 5 - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday – Friday, 5:00pm – 5:30pm. One hour Saturday – Sunday, 5:00pm – 6:00pm.

CBS4 AT 6 – Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday – Saturday, 6:00pm – 6:30pm.

CBS4 AT 10 - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: Thirty five minutes Monday – Sunday, 10:00pm - 10:35pm

COLORADO GETAWAYS - Regularly scheduled half-hour show features places to go and things to see throughout Colorado.

Duration: One half hour – Saturday, 6:30pm

ISSUES

YOUTH – Teens have major problems with careless driving, cell phones, drugs and alcohol.

CBS4 AT 4 – 01/14/05 The Remember Campaign, a proactive program designed by teens for teens, asks students to sign a personal contract to remember to buckle-up, make sure others do the same, obey the law, don't drink and drive and just take care of each other. 01/20/05 For the second day in a row, teen driving was the focus of lawmakers at the state capital. 02/03/05 – Clint Haskins, an inmate serving 14-20 years for driving drunk as a teenager and killing eight young men who were riding with him, talked to students from prison. 02/03/05 Craig Conrad, a teacher at Moffat County High School, is taking his Sober Driving Campaign to Colorado schools. He's on a mission to keep kids from driving drunk. 02/14/05 The Colorado Teen Driving Coalition left 44 red hearts on the desk of representatives. Each heart represents the drivers and passengers who died in accidents involving 16 and 17-year-old drivers.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/21/05 An Arvada woman is accused of offering sex, drugs and alcohol to teenage boys. 03/03/05 Teenaged drivers will be driving solo for their first six months under a bill passed today by a committee in the State House. The bill also restricts minors from driving between midnight and 5:00am. Sponsors hope this will mean fewer deadly accidents. 03/03/05 Lawmakers are considering a bill that would make it against the law for young drivers to use cell phones. 03/08/05 The most dangerous drivers in America are 16-year-olds. Teens driving with passengers accounted for more than 100 fatalities statewide in the past two years.

CBS4 at 6 – 02/18/05 After the recent binge drinking deaths in Colorado, Denver Academy parents decided they needed a tool to give partying teens a way to be out on the edge but in a safe way. Parents sign a pledge saying they will supervise parties and have no drugs or alcohol. 02/25/05 A bill that would increase fines for underage drinking passed a second test in the House today.

CBS4 AT 10 – 02/15/05 Patty Spady, whose daughter died of alcohol poisoning from binge drinking, is making efforts to educate teenagers and young adults about the dangers of irresponsible drinking.

MENTORING – Mentors are needed to give teenagers positive role models. Teens presently feel that "it's all about them". They need heroes.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/23/05 January is National Mentoring Month and this week is the Thank Your Big Brothers and Big Sisters Program.

CBS4 AT 4 – 02/04/05 Through the Family Rescue Program, homeless families get the support of mentors for several months.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/01/05 Metro Denver Partners wants everyone's New Year's resolution to include changing the life of an at-risk kid.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/01/05 The Denver Police Department is working with at-risk kids to promote mentoring. More than 500 kids in the Denver area are looking for a role model. Statistics show that children who have mentors are less likely to drink or take drugs, and they are more likely to go to college.

EDUCATION – There is a high rate of high school dropouts and loss of liberal and visual arts in schools.

CBS4 MORNING – 02/06/05 For the last six years, students at Bromwell Elementary in Denver have been putting their hand-made cards up for sale at a local art gallery.

02/21/05 Business owners in Aurora's Old Downtown hope that a new arts district will revive the area. 03/02/05 The Commission on Secondary School Reform has spent the last eight months analyzing information about how to make school more meaningful. The Commission will present its report today, and hopes it can increase graduation rates and lower dropout rates.

CBS4 AT 4 – 02/01/05 V-Day is a catalyst that promotes creative events to increase awareness, raise money and revitalize the spirit of anti-violence organizations.

02/11/05 Central Park will become a work of art created by Christo and Jeanne-Claude called "The Gates". 03/03/05 On any given day at North High School, one in four students does not show up for class. The school reports one of the highest dropout rates in Denver.

CBS4 AT 5 – 03/03/05 Denver Mayor Hickenlooper held two citywide meetings to explore ways to improve the achievement of Denver's Latino students.

CBS4 AT 6 – 01/07/05 A Commission is recommending that Denver High Schools make sweeping changes to give more students a sense of community like the Denver School of the Arts.

COMMUNITY - In today's society there is a lack of community. People are isolated and don't help one another.

CBS4 THIS MORNING – 01/07/05 Montbello High School is calling on parents and students to help prevent future violence, after the stabbing death of a student on Tuesday. 01/16/05 The Hispanic Women's Chamber of Commerce sees needs in their community that other groups don't necessarily focus on. 02/12/05 Accounting students at Red Rocks Community College are offering free tax help to low-income families.

CBS4 AT NOON – 02/16/05 City leaders met with community members in Congress Park to let them know that everything possible is being done to catch the man who has sexually assaulted five women since last Friday.

CBS4 AT 4 – 02/16/05 A community meeting will be held this evening for concerned community members about the recent sexual assaults.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/01/05 While the Tsunami has been a devastating event, Red Cross workers feel the assistance from the Colorado Community has been overwhelming.

01/11/05 CBS4 is expanding its Community Forum Program and will be holding the first of our new Regional Forums tomorrow. 02/05/05 February is Black History Month, and today, ten members of the community were recognized as African Americans of Distinction, for their service to the community. 02/17/05 Dave Walstrom started the Colfax Crime Coalition, which includes a neighborhood watch, to address the on-going crime issues around Colfax Avenue.

CBS4 AT 6 – 02/17/05 Police Chief Whitman says that the community can help with neighborhood safety by getting involved ... being the eyes and ears of their blocks.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/09/05 CBS4 is hearing from you through our Community Forums, which are set up so that residents and officials from various regions all over Colorado can bring us up to speed on issues in their community. 01/10/05 CBS4 is reaching out to the Colorado Community through Community Forums. The next one will be held Wednesday at Green Valley Ranch.

POVERTY – Food banks are depleted. Homelessness and unemployment are on the rise.

CBS4 THIS MORNING – 01/13/05 Tonight, the City of Denver kicks off a series of meetings on homelessness. Earlier this week “The Denver Commission to End Homelessness” released a ten-year plan, which calls for creating almost 2,500 new housing units in the next decade. 01/26/05 Colorado ended 2004 with its first job increase in three years. 03/11/05 The Care 4 Colorado Spring Food Drive is necessary because the Colorado economy is slow to recover.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/13/05 Governor Owens started his State of the State with a positive economic outlook, pointing out that unemployment is down and projected job growth is up. 01/25/05 The government is trying to get an accurate picture of the state of homelessness in Metro Denver. Volunteers from 120 agencies and organizations are on the streets today talking with homeless people.

CBS4 AT 4 – 01/14/05 The Family Rescue Ministry gets working families off the streets, into a place to live. Their program is working toward long term solutions for homelessness. 01/24/05 Homeless families continue to be the fastest growing segment of the homeless population in the metro area.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/10/05 Homelessness is reaching a state of emergency in Colorado. That’s why CBS4 and Mile High United Way are launching a United 4 Colorado campaign to help homeless families. 01/14/05 We’ve been following Joy Ranburger and her grandson, who have been homeless for the past three months. 03/31/05 Colorado’s unemployment rate increased slightly in February. State officials call the level stable, as the economy continues to recover.

CBS4 AT 6 – 01/14/05 – Hundreds of students in Denver are Homeless, Denver Public Schools are trying to help. 02/07/05 The Colorado Helping Hands campaign raised more than 48,000 for homeless families in the Denver area.
