Attached are listings of broadcasts or broadcast segments, which, in the station's judgment, reflect the station's most significant programming treatment of ascertained community issues during the period from July 1, 2005 – September 30, 2005.

KCNC broadcasts both locally produced and network programming. Although we include only local programs herein, KCNC also broadcasts several network programs including Face The Nation, 60 Minutes, 60 Minutes II and 48 Hours, which we believe also serve community needs and interests.

HEALTH – Prevention and Cost

CBS4 MORNING – 07/17/05 Denver Health Medical Center doctors are reminding people that heat can take a toll on their health. 08/15/05 A survey by a national benefits consultant says companies will be paying more for employees' health insurance next year. 08/21/05 Kaiser Permanente is holding a free Health Fair, offering vision, dental, cholesterol and many other screenings. 09/01/05 The aftermath of Katrina and Rita has been described as a Health Department's nightmare. There are health threats for anyone in the Gulf Coast area. CBS4 AT 4 – 07/19/05 Studies show that several types of medication work just as well at half the dose which is normally prescribed. Less is just as effective, with fewer side effects, and it's also cheaper. 09/01/05 A new study says cereal and whole grain breads can slow down and in some cases reverse, the build-up of cholesterol plaques in heart arteries. 09/14/05 The Centers for Disease Control will be trying to immunize more than 97 million people. 09/29/05 Colorado has more than enough flu vaccine for everyone this year. If you want to donate supplies or clothes, please call the United Way at 211. CBS4 AT 5 – 07/13/05 Because the previous Ocean Journey was non-profit, funding for exhibit changes was limited. CBS4 AT 6 - 08/18/05 Denver business leaders say that by calling 211 you can donate to programs that will have a lasting impact on the lives of those in need. 09/05/05 The United Way opened its "211" call center yesterday, and so far hundreds of people have called in offering help for evacuees now staying in Colorado. 09/08/05 Ten Police cars and supplies from Fort Collins are headed to Gulfport, Mississippi, to help keep peace after the hurricane. CBS4 AT 10 – 08/26/05 Police officers waited tables and donated their tips to Special Olympics and the Denver Broncos Charities Fund. 09/03/05 Starting tomorrow at noon, the United Way's "211" community service number will be set up to help with donations for the evacuees staying in Colorado. You will be able to donate money and learn about drop-off sites for donations.

LAW ENFORCEMENT - Protection and Response

CBS4 MORNING – 07/06/05 Lakewood police have a man in custody who is accused of hitting two police cars with his own car. 07/11/05 Denver's new Civilian Police Monitor, Richard Rosenthal, and the Citizen's Oversight Board, replace the Public Safety Review Commission which had little effect on officer discipline. 07/30/05 Commerce City police responded to a disturbance call and shot a man, after he refused to drop a knife. 08/01/05 Aurora police are trying to come up with a description of a suspect in a deadly shooting of a man in his early 20's, in an apartment parking lot. 08/09/05 After a five and a half hour stand off, police arrested a suspect in the shooting of singer Marc Cohn. 08/11/05 Aurora police are looking for a man who broke into two pharmacies and stole large amounts of prescription drugs.

CBS4 AT 4 – 08/09/05 A woman filed notice to sue the City of Aurora, because she was brutally beaten by Brent J. Brents after police failed to take him into custody after he admitted to sexually assaulting an eight year old boy.

08/12/05 Aurora police say that two recent attempted attacks have police thinking the serial rapist is prepared to strike again. 08/23/05 A wedding turned into an arrest of members of a smuggling ring. The bride and groom were FBI agents.

CBS4 AT 5 – 07/23/05 Northglenn police are warning drivers to be on the lookout for a police impersonator after a woman says a man pulled her over on I-25 posing as an officer, and assaulted her. 09/19/05 Luis Romero Jr. was killed in May, and today, Denver Police arrested 23-year-old Jose Alvarlado-Juarez.

CBS4 AT 6 – 07/05/05 Aurora police are searching for answers after someone found a man's body in a dumpster.

CBS4 AT 10 – 07/15/05 Police say they went to great lengths to protect the public during a standoff, which stemmed from a routine traffic stop and foot chase. 07/24/05 Police Chief Gerry Whitman went on camera last week asking for the public's help in finding a suspected serial rapist, but no one from Denver PD would go on camera to talk about why so little seemed to be done when a woman in southeast Denver called 911 at 2:00am, to report that a man matching that description had just tried to get into her back yard. 07/25/05 In a written statement, police say there was no clear indication that a crime had occurred, and officers arrived on the scene within three minutes, in response to the prowler report. 08/22/05 Aurora police have arrested Zuri-Kye McGhee, accused of sexually assaulting at least 18 children, ages 9 to 13.

ENERGY – Utilities and Maintenance

CBS4 MORNING - 07/24/05 Xcel Energy says thousands of its customers in the north metro area can expect rolling blackouts again this morning, as part of their controlled outages due to a failed transformer in the area.

CBS4 AT NOON – 09/01/05 A break in a water main has shut down a busy Denver street. Repair crews have dug a huge hole on Alameda to fix the problem. 09/30/05 You can call "211" to get connected with utility bill assistance programs.

YOUTH – Poverty and Child Protection

CBS4 MORNING - 07/04/05 Actor Ewan McGregor is holding the "C-8 Summit", hosting children from eight of the world's poorest nations. 07/10/05 According to a survey by "Kids Count in Colorado", more than 27 percent of children in Denver live in poverty and at risk of hunger. 09/06/05 An infant boy is in good condition after his mother took advantage of Colorado's Safe Haven law, and left him at a fire station.

CBS4 AT 4 - 09/26/05 Denver and Fort Collins/Loveland area both made the top 100 list of best places for young people to live.

CBS4 AT 5 - 07/07/05 State health officials and the Lieutenant Governor announced a campaign called "immunize Colorado's Kids ... Protect the Ones You Love". 07/30/05 As part of the Seventh Annual Colorado Cares Day, a group of volunteers met at the Excelsior Youth Center for Girls to paint and clean up the school.

CBS4 AT 6 - 08/17/05 Micasa's Youth Health Education Program is in desperate need of money. The program provides peer educators to talk to teens about HIV/AIDS. In the last year they've lost more than half of their funding.

CBS4 AT 10 - 09/30/05 Timmy Smith was arrested for dealing cocaine. He was working at Gilliam Youth Center as a security officer and also counseled at-risk youth.

CBS4 AT NOON - 09/21/05 Robert Cook, the operator of a home for troubled youths, committed suicide, after his arrest on charges of soliciting a child for prostitution.

EDUCATION – Improve and Finance

CBS4 MORNING - 08/07/05 A new law takes effect which requires all students to take courses to prepare them for higher education unless parents and school administrators agree to a waiver.

CBS4 AT 6 - 08/22/05 The Principal of Denver's Lincoln High School thought the promise of a college education would keep more kids in school, so he promised them if they did well, he would find money to pay their way. Those students began classes at the Community College of Denver today.

CBS4 at 10 - 07/05/05 The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act requires parental consent before schools turn over education records to recruiters. However, schools can turn over yearbooks, honor rolls, and sports programs without parental consent. 08/21/05 Denver Public Schools has lost the opportunity to get a \$1.8 million dollar grant which would have gone to ten elementary schools where poverty levels are especially high. 08/22/05 A new ad highlights the fact that too many students in Denver are not succeeding in school, and that for all students to achieve, it will take the support of an entire community. 08/25/05 Starting September 9th, children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult on Friday or Saturday night at the Aurora Mall.

TEENS - Driving

CBS4 MORNING - 07/11/05 Today the Department of Revenue and the Motor Vehicle Division will examine a proposed law requiring new teen drivers to enroll in 30 hours of class and six hours of behind-the-wheel training.

CBS4 AT 5 - 07/08/05 A new state law limits the number and age of passengers that a teen driver can have in the car.

CBS4 AT 10 - 07/05/05 Lori Goodwin started a non-profit driving school called Teen Smart, where law enforcement officers instruct teenagers on defensive driving skills.

TRAFFIC – Highways and Concern about Referenda C & D

CBS4 MORNING – 07/03/05 C-DOT crews plan to do rock blasting on US6, just west of Golden, where a rockslide closed the highway two weeks ago. Those rocks now need to be blasted in order to get the road back open. 07/23/05 Traffic will be re-routed while Denver Water crews repair a water valve at Hampden and Yosemite today and tomorrow. 08/01/05 Supporters of Referenda C and D will be in a six-week walk across the state. The bills would allow the state to keep more of the tax money it collects. 08/02/05 C-DOT says traffic traveling through the Eisenhower Tunnel was at its highest point ever last month. CBS4 at 4 – 07/03/05 C-DOT says the closure of Highway 6 may be partly to blame for yesterday's traffic jam where drivers spent hours stuck in traffic on I-70. 08/08/05 Installation of a girder on the E-470 flyby will cause a detour on I-70. CBS4 AT 5 – 08/14/05 The "Keep Kids Alive ... Drive 25 Program" uses yard signs and stickers to remind drivers they are in a residential neighborhood. CBS4 AT 6 – 08/26/05 If approved, Referendum C would lift state spending limits for five years and would allow lawmakers to spend an estimated \$3.7 billion dollars that otherwise would have been refunded to taxpayers. Referendum D would let the state borrow up to \$2.1 billion dollars to start road and school construction. 09/26/05 The E-470 fly-by bridge at I-70 will create a direct route allowing drivers to get over the interstate without stopping at the traffic lights. CBS4 AT 10 – 07/02/05 Traffic on I-70 headed into the mountains is slow, and often bumper-to-bumper. Some drivers feel more lanes should be added. 08/14/05 Traffic is at a crawl on I-70 near Idaho Springs, where rockslides forced the westbound lanes to shut down. 08/16/05 C-DOT is blasting the mountain at Idaho Springs, in hopes of preventing more rockslides.
