KCNC-TV QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST

Attached are listings of broadcasts or broadcast segments, which, in the station's judgment, reflect the station's most significant programming treatment of ascertained community issues during the period from October 1, 2005 – December 31, 2005.

KCNC broadcasts both locally produced and network programming. Although we include only local programs herein, KCNC also broadcasts several network programs including Face The Nation, 60 Minutes and 48 Hours, which we believe also serve community needs and interests.

PROGRAM INDEX

CBS4 MORNING - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: Two hours Monday - Friday 5:00 am - 7:00am. One hour Saturday 7:00am - 8:00am. Two hours Sunday 6:00am – 8:00am.

CBS4 AT NOON - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday - Friday, 12:00pm - 12:30pm

CBS4 AT 4 - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One hour Monday - Friday, 4:00pm - 5:00pm

CBS4 AT 5 - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday – Friday, 5:00pm – 5:30pm. One hour Saturday – Sunday, 5:00pm – 6:00pm.

CBS4 AT 6 – Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday – Saturday, 6:00pm – 6:30pm.

CBS4 AT 10 - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: Thirty five minutes Monday – Sunday, 10:00pm - 10:35pm

CBS4 YOUR HEALTH - Dr. Dave Hnida reports on recent developments in medicine

Duration: One minute and thirty seconds Mondays – Fridays, 4:00pm newscast

WEDNESDAY'S CHILD – Brooke Wagner highlights a child waiting to be adopted from the Adoption Exchange.

Duration: One minute and forty-five seconds. Wednesdays, 12:00pm, 4:00pm and 10:00pm newscasts

COLORADO GETAWAYS - Regularly scheduled half-hour show features places to go and things to see throughout Colorado.

Duration: One half hour – Saturday, 6:30pm

ISSUES

CONSERVATION – Lack of water on the Front Range and limited water rights

CBS4 MORNING – 10/27/05 Denver Water is asking customers to continue cutting back on water use next year. They will offer rebates for use of water-saving devices. 12/28/05 The great start to snow in the high country could mean less water restricting in Denver this summer. The snow pack on the South Platte watershed is already 27 percent above normal.

CBS4 AT 4 – 10/13/05 Since water heating can account for 14 percent of your energy costs, consider wrapping the water heater and hot water pipes with additional insulation. Wash clothes in cold water and turn the water heater temperature down, particularly when you are away for a few days or more.

CBS4 AT 5 – 10/27/05 A symposium was held in Longmont to discuss the effect of “emerging contaminants”, such as insecticides, pharmaceuticals and household chemicals, which wind up flowing into our wastewater treatment plants.

CBS4 AT 10 – 12/10/05 Denver Water says the drought emergency appears to be over, but they don’t want customers to forget their “water-saving” ways. 12/14/05 Denver Water rates are going up. The Water Board has approved a budget increase of eight percent.

DISCRIMINATION – Racial profiling

CBS4 MORNING – 12/17/05 A data processing error led to what could be considered racial profiling by the US Marines.

CBS4 AT 6 – 10/24/05 CU Boulder has a new facility on campus where students, faculty and staff can go to report discrimination or harassment. 12/09/05 Six former and current employees are suing Best Buy Electronics claiming the company purposefully kept women and minorities from top-paying jobs.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/24/05 What Rosa Parks started culminated in the 1964 Federal Civil Rights Act, which banned racial discrimination at all public accommodations.

TRAFFIC – Highways need to be improved.

CBS4 AT 6 – 10/17/05 A section of I-70 is closing tonight and tomorrow for bridge construction. 11/02/05 Supporters of Referendum D say its failure greatly hampers highway and bridge construction and repairs throughout the state. The Director of CDOT says it takes about 55 projects off the “A” list.

CBS4 AT 10 – 11/19/05 In the past year, more than 800,000 vehicles have used the Central City Parkway, which has resulted in a 47 percent jump in revenue.

HOMELESSNESS – Increasing numbers of people who need assistance

CBS4 MORNING – 11/16/05 The Denver City Council will consider a ban on panhandlers sitting or lying on sidewalks. If passed, the ordinance would require police or an outreach worker to help the homeless to a medical or human services provider. If they refuse, police can then issue a citation or jail the violator.

12/05/05 The Denver City Council is scheduled to consider three new laws that would crack down on panhandlers in the city. The proposed ordinances are part of Mayor John Hickenlooper's initiative to end homelessness in Denver. 12/07/05 The Salvation Army workers patrolled the city helping homeless people get out of the cold. Still, there were some who chose to sleep on the streets. 12/07/05 A Federal Appeals Court is hearing arguments in a lawsuit over a law concerning homeless people in Los Angeles. The law is similar to one of the measures Denver passed this week. 12/25/05 The Denver Chop House and Brewery in LODO expects to serve hot meals to nearly 6,000 homeless men, women and children, as part of its annual Miracle on 19th Street event.

CBS4 AT NOON – 10/10/05 President Bush returned to the Gulf Coast area where Hurricane Katrina left an estimated 350,000 families homeless. 12/07/05 Hundreds of homeless people packed into the Denver Rescue Mission. Every bed was full and some stayed warm in the hallways.

CBS4 AT 4 – 10/31/05 Jeanine Simmons was homeless with two daughters, but found help through "211". The call center provided numbers for housing programs, food banks, bus tokens and education. 12/06/05 The sub-zero temperatures have put the homeless in danger, so the Denver Rescue Mission is increasing its number of available beds.

CBS4 AT 5 – 12/13/05 The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless is putting out an urgent call for help. The agency says a record number of families need help, and the resources just aren't there to help them all.

CBS4 AT 10 – 12/21/05 This is National Homeless Persons' Memorial Day. The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless held a candlelight vigil to remember more than 120 homeless people who died in Denver this year.

HEALTH – Lack of affordable and available health care

CBS4 MORNING – 10/06/05 It may not be long before people will be heading to places like Wal-Mart, Rite-Aid, Target and Walgreen's to get health care. This health clinic concept is presently being tested on the east coast. 10/18/05 General Motors says it will slash health care coverage for unionized retirees. 10/25/05 Denver's Police Chief says the department will explore new options to help curb skyrocketing health care costs for retired officers. 10/27/05 Wal-Mart wants to hire more part-time employees with the hope of lowering health care enrollment. Several days earlier Wal-Mart said it would offer lower health care premiums to employees. 10/29/05 A Community Health Fair is offering free flu shots, skin cancer screenings, blood pressure checks and nutrition counseling. 11/08/05 Three area hospitals are sharing \$250 million dollars from Health One-HCA to improve their present facilities and help pay for new facilities. 12/05/05 Companies are making smokers take a bigger role in soaring health care costs and lost productivity. Smoking costs an estimated \$75.5 billion dollars a year in health care costs and another \$92 billion dollars a year in lost productivity.

CBS4 AT 4 – 10/13/05 Coloradans are being urged to get a flu shot and health officials want to be sure that cost doesn't keep people from being vaccinated. Rocky Mountain Urgent Care is holding a free flu shot clinic this week-end. 11/11/05 A recent study showed that 70% of Americans don't know the three basic questions you should ask before choosing a health care policy; co-pays and deductibles, referrals and what services are covered.

CBS4 AT 5 – 10/05/05 Experts say the top two reasons for bankruptcy are health care costs and divorce. 11/08/05 The new Urgent Care Center at Stapleton is offering free health care this weekend, with no worries about co-pays or insurance.

CBS4 AT 6 – 12/15/05 For more than 10 years, Clinica Tepeyac has treated people who could not afford to go to the doctor. They now have more potential patients than they can handle. 12/21/05 Colorado is giving the green light for a mega-merger between two health insurance companies; United Health Group and PacifiCare Health Systems. The companies will not be able to pass the merger costs on to consumers through higher premiums.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/24/05 Retired Denver Police officers' insurance costs jumped by as much as two-thirds.

EDUCATION – Lack of education for minorities, lack of parental participation in children's education and high cost of higher education

CBS4 MORNING – 10/14/05 The Metro Denver Economic Development Corporation says that Colorado ranks a dismal 48th in state and local support for higher education, 46th in higher education spending per capita and 26th in per capita spending on k-12 education. 11/06/05 Scott Simpson, a college student, posted a listing on E-Bay offering someone the opportunity to fund his tuition for four years.

CBS4 AT 4 – 12/06/05 Nearly a million copies of the state's school accountability reports, which rate every public school in Colorado, will be sent home to parents this month.

CBS4 AT 5 – 11/16/05 The new superintendent of Denver Public Schools is unveiling a new plan to overhaul the struggling district and involve the whole community. He calls for engaging all parents in their children's' education, and when parents cannot be role models, mentors will be found for needy students.

12/09/05 Anna Alejo, KCNC-TV Education Specialist, has created an education page on our website at cbs4denver.com.

CBS4 AT 6 – 11/28/05 Governor Owens proposes spending most of this year's Referendum C money on roads, and promises his budget for next year would have more money going to education. 12/06/05 Governor Owens says that since Colorado began rating schools five years ago, 71,000 more Colorado students are attending high performing schools.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/25/05 Community members say that public schools in Colorado are in a state of emergency, especially in Denver where only 50 percent of students graduate from high school. They say that the way to rescue the children is by voting yes on Referendum C. 12/09/05 Governor Owens says there may be 250,000 illegal immigrants in Colorado, which is causing a big challenge for the state's public schools.

NON-PROFITS – Need more funds

CBS4 MORNING – 12/18/05 The sixth annual Santa Speedo Run raised money for a local non-profit that works to fight breast cancer.

CBS4 AT NOON – 10/12/05 Xcel Energy says they are donating \$2 million dollars to Energy Outreach Colorado, a non-profit that helps low-income customers pay their utilities. They will also match up to \$1 million dollars in donations from customers and others.

CBS4 AT 4 – 10/22/05 Metro Volunteers organized the “Denver Day of Impact”. Five-hundred volunteers got together at 25 non-profit organizations throughout the Denver Metro area. 10/25/05 Non-profit organizations in Colorado are reporting a drop in charitable giving. 10/27/05 All the food and money collected at the Broncos’ Wives’ Food Drive goes to COMPA Food Ministry, a non-profit organization that provides food to 140 food pantries and hunger relief programs in Colorado.

CBS4 AT 6 – 10/04/05 Local churches are rallying to try to save the Urban League of Denver. The non-profit organization is running out of money, and has already started slashing some of its programs. The Urban League was established in Denver 59 years ago to help African Americans with education, job training and other services.

CBS4 AT 10 – 12/04/05 The non-profit group called Energy Outreach Colorado raises money to help the 20 percent of XCEL customers that are low income, elderly or otherwise unable to afford their energy bills.
