KCNC-TV QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAMS LIST

Attached are listings of broadcasts or broadcast segments, which, in the station's judgment, reflect the station's most significant programming treatment of ascertained community issues during the period from January 1, 2007 – March 31, 2007.

KCNC broadcasts both locally produced and network programming. Although we include only local programs herein, KCNC also broadcasts several network programs including Face The Nation, 60 Minutes and 48 Hours, which we believe also serve community needs and interests.

PROGRAM INDEX

CBS4 MORNING - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: Two hours Monday - Friday 5:00 am - 7:00am. One hour Saturday 7:00am - 8:00am. Two hours Sunday 6:00am – 8:00am.

CBS4 AT NOON - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday - Friday, 12:00pm - 12:30pm

CBS4 AT 5 - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday – Friday, 5:00pm – 5:30pm. One hour Saturday – Sunday, 5:00pm – 6:00pm.

ISSUES

HOUSING – Lack of affordable housing and homelessness. Over 20,000 families are one paycheck away from being homeless.

CBS4 MORNING

01/14/07 Homeless Shelters across the metro area are full because of the bitter cold temperatures. The Denver Rescue Mission is staying open 24 hours a day, instead of just nights.

01/22/07 The Colorado Housing Authority is offering a new mortgage program to help prevent foreclosures. They will offer a conventional mortgage with a 40-year fixed rate to either buy or refinance a home.

01/29/07 Two state-wide homeless counts are being conducted to determine how much federal money goes to state and local governments to fight homelessness.

02/12/07 Denver Mayor John Hickenlooper will ask religious leaders to unite to fight homelessness.

02/27/07 A new report by the Genesis Group says Denver's housing market will continue to struggle this year, still trying to dig out from foreclosures.

CBS4 AT NOON

01/29/07 A strict new law on panhandling has been in effect for a year, and it seems to be working.

03/05/07 Denver has a new tool in fighting homelessness, called the "Homeless Meter".

CBS4 AT 5

01/13/07 Anyone needing emergency shelter this weekend can call Catholic Charities Samaritan House, Colorado Coalition for the Homeless or Denver Police non-emergency line.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30

02/28/07 An economic report shows that new home sales tumbled more than 16 percent, which is the biggest drop since 1994.

03/05/07 Recent reports say there are more than 16,000 homeless people across Colorado on any given day, and that children and teens make up about one-third of Colorado's homeless.

ANIMALS – Too many animal shelters aren't really "no-kill", due to lack of funding.

CBS4 MORNING

03/21/07 The Colorado Humane Society and the Aurora Animal Shelter had to throw out all wet pet food made by Menu Foods. As a result they are in great need of donations.

CBS4 AT 5

02/22/07 More than \$100,000 is missing from the Denver Animal Shelter.

CBS4 AT 10

02/15/07 Boulder students, as part of CBS4's Pay it Forward program, gave \$500 worth of hand made or hand selected gifts to the animals at the Boulder Humane Society.

HEALTHCARE – Lack of affordable healthcare.

CBS4 MORNING

03/16/07 Governor Ritter has signed a new bill which directs health care providers to notify sexual assault victims about the availability of emergency contraception.

CBS4 AT NOON

01/11/07 Governor Ritter addressed the issue of health care in Colorado. He pointed out that 770,000 state residents don't have health insurance.

CBS4 AT 5

02/24/07 Colorado Governor Bill Ritter spoke in Washington, about the fact that 17% of the population is without access to healthcare.

CBS4 AT 6

02/26/07 Over 50 health care groups are lobbying lawmakers to do something to help the people in Colorado who have trouble getting health care insurance.

03/05/07 Appalling living conditions and poor patient care have been exposed at Walter Reed Army Medical Center.

03/08/07 Lawmakers at the Colorado State Capitol gave tentative approval to a bill that would make health insurance companies pay for cervical cancer vaccines.

CBS4 AT 10

01/24/07 President Bush proposed two new initiatives to help more Americans afford their own health insurance.

02/05/07 Governor Ritter signed his first bill into law, and it will mean that thousands of Coloradans will now have access to cheaper prescription drugs.

03/12/07 The Veterans Administration is ordering a review of all 1,400 of its hospitals and clinics.

ENVIRONMENT – Lack of laws to protect open space.

CBS4 MORNING

02/09/07 After years of debate, elk hunting could be coming to Rocky Mountain National Park within a year or two.

02/15/07 Governor Bill Ritter and General Motors will announce a new partnership. The goal is to increase the availability of E-85 ethanol in Colorado.

02/22/07 Governor Bill Ritter will release a new report on renewable energy which will show the expected benefits of renewable energy to the environment and economy over the coming years.

CBS4 AT NOON

01/11/07 Governor Ritter says that Colorado must have a new energy economy, using renewable energy to improve the economy, while helping the environment.

03/13/07 Governor Bill Ritter made his first appearance before a legislative committee to testify on the renewable energy bill which would establish new renewable energy standards for Colorado.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30

01/03/07 Homeowners in the City of Lakewood voted on a controversial open-space issue. The city wants to give 22 acres of Forsberg Park to a developer in exchange for 22 acres of vacant land nearby.

02/02/07 A new report found that man-made emissions of greenhouse gases are to blame for global warming, more floods, more droughts and stronger storms.

02/08/07 The Bureau of Land Management pulled oil and gas leases in four state wildlife areas from an auction in Denver.

03/05/07 A meeting is scheduled regarding protecting the creek environment and the welfare of Pine citizens.

03/28/07 Park County commissioners must decide if the water diversion planned by Tanglewood subdivision can be done without harming people or the environment.

CBS4 AT 10

02/24/07 People are able to utilize the heat underground to warm their house in the winter and cool it in the summer. Ground source heat pumps provide clean, safe and quiet heating and cooling, are good for the environment and best of all, lower utility bills.

03/24/07 Colorado's state leaders want Colorado to be in the forefront of the switch to renewable energy. Their efforts are working and bringing jobs to Colorado.

SAFETY – Public Safety

CBS4 MORNING

01/18/07 Since 2001, the number of cases investigated by the Denver Police Gang Unit has increased 83%.

01/27/07 Denver police are holding their first Crime Summit, hoping for a valuable discussion on crime and the needs of the community. All members of the community are welcome.

01/31/07 A bill has been introduced which would extend the "Make My Day" law to cover business owners using weapons to protect themselves at their places of business.

02/08/07 Colorado lawmakers are considering three bills dealing with illegal immigration. One would make it a crime for someone who is in the country illegally to be in Colorado. Another would require undocumented workers who are arrested to be held without bond and not allow charges to be dropped against the accused. The third would require people registering to vote to provide proof of citizenship.

02/18/07 Longmont Police arrested 13 people as a result of their "Warrant Enforcement Day".

02/28/07 Denver Police say the crime wave at some DIA parking lots is the worst they have ever seen. Thieves are breaking into cars and stealing stereos, DVD players and personal items.

03/09/07 Violent crime is on the rise in the United States.

03/12/07 Boulder police are investigating two hate crimes. One man was attacked because of his race and another because of sexual preference.

03/15/07 More than 1,000 allegations of officer misconduct were filed in Denver last year. The office was unable to back up any of the citizen complaints about unnecessary use of force.

03/16/07 A new bill being introduced at the State Capitol is designed to protect victims of domestic violence. It would keep the addresses of victims confidential.

03/22/07 A local family is pushing for a law to make doctor's medical mistakes easier for the public to access.

CBS4 AT 5

03/03/07 The mayor's office started a task force on Capitol Hill in the belief that if neighbors band together with police to take a stand against small crimes like graffiti, they can change attitudes and perceptions. It's called the "broken windows" premise.

03/12/07 A bill has been proposed to protect children from online predators. It would require convicted sex offenders to register their online identities.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30

01/02/07 Piles of snow, often blocking traffic lanes, are causing a safety issue, when drivers have to change lanes abruptly, without notice.

01/29/07 Improved DNA technology helped detectives solve a 1987 murder.

02/13/07 New statistics show that violent crime is down in Denver. The report shows a 10% drop in homicides, 11% drop in robberies and a 21% drop in auto theft in 2006.

02/26/07 Authorities in Arapahoe County will soon have a new way of tracking missing people through a federally funded program called "A Child is Missing".

01/17/07 The State Patrol thinks that a growing number of accidents are linked to cell phones. Troopers will now be asking drivers if they were on the phone while driving and the information will be used to determine if cell phones are a public safety issue.

03/01/07 Educators and Public Safety Experts from across Colorado came together for a day-long meeting to find ways to make schools safer.

03/07/07 Bennett residents are restricted from drinking their tap water, after a private contractor cut a water line.

CBS4 AT 10

01/11/07 Governor Ritter promised to focus on lowering crime, in his first State of the State speech.

01/23/07 Colorado is evaluating a new concept which has been initiated in New York City, to equip 911 call centers to receive digital images and videos sent from cell phones.

02/20/07 Representative David Balmer is sponsoring a bill to tighten restrictions for convicted sex offenders, prohibiting them from living or working within 1,000 feet of a school, daycare center or playground.

03/06/07 Police departments in the metro area will soon have additional help from Waste Management drivers. Drivers are being trained because they cover more ground at a fairly slow pace, which gives them better opportunities to notice dangerous situations.

EDUCATION – Not enough money is going toward education.

CBS4 MORNING

01/14/07 There are changes on this year's income tax form involving higher education tuition and fees.

01/24/07 CU President Hank Brown says that state funding is the most critical issue facing higher education right now.

01/22/07 Last year, legislators passed a bill to create the "Support Education" license plate, which was unveiled today. Twenty dollars of the cost will go to an education foundation to support a local school district.

02/02/07 The Federal Spending Bill, a \$463.5 billion dollar measure, has passed. It includes more money for education, veterans and the AIDS battle in Africa.

02/19/07 Sex education in the classroom will be a topic up for debate in the state legislature this week.

03/06/07 Governor Ritter and his wife and son were at the State Capitol to draw attention to the price of higher education. His son, who is a junior in college, was one of 70 students lobbying lawmakers to increase the state budget for higher education. The governor's goal is to make college more affordable.

CBS4 AT 5

01/13/07 Governor Bill Ritter wants to cut Colorado's alarming drop-out rate in half and begin by sending more children to preschool.

01/20/07 Marc Tucker, from the National Center on Education and the Economy was in Denver to offer provocative suggestions for overhauling our public schools.

01/20/07 Colorado could become a test site for reforming public education in response to a new national report titled "Tough Choice or Tough Times" which warns that America is in danger of a dramatic drop in our standard of living.

01/28/07 Hispanic leaders say that only about 47% of Colorado's Hispanic students graduate from high school.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30

01/08/07 President Bush is trying to gain support for the "No Child Left Behind" Act, which mandates standardized testing of students in public schools. Schools that don't meet certain benchmarks are penalized.

01/25/07 Denver Public Schools learned that it was receiving a two-million-dollar grant to prepare more students for college.

01/26/07 More dramatic changes are in store for Denver Public Schools as the district looks for ways to get the most for its money. They are considering selling their District Headquarters building.

02/08/07 The controversial Education Commissioner of Colorado is resigning after a decade on the job. He often clashed with lawmakers and the teacher's union.

03/02/07 "You don't have to love the test to do your best" is the slogan of students preparing for CSAP testing.

03/09/07 Colorado State University will spend millions of dollars to help more students afford college. The new program will help pay off tuition when other financial aid doesn't cover the costs.

03/13/07 Governor Ritter proposes an amendment to an education funding bill, to commit \$84 million dollars, annually, to school funding. The money would come by freezing property taxes statewide at a time when they are expected to go down.

03/13/07 Governor Ritter claims the state education fund will become insolvent by 2011 under current projections.

CBS4 AT 10

01/13/07 Governor Ritter wants to double the production of technical and college degrees in Colorado, over the next ten years.

03/22/07 The House Education Committee turned down a proposal that would have changed requirements for high school graduation. The bill would have required students to complete four years of math and three years of science before getting their diploma.

03/30/07 The Chairman of the State House Education Committee resigned after a controversial e-mail, which was prejudiced against charter schools, became public.

EMPLOYMENT – Employees lack knowledge concerning their rights.

CBS4 MORNING

01/24/07 This is said to be the strongest job market since 2000. A national employment group says companies plan to hire 17% more graduates this year than in 2006. The hot jobs are in management, consulting, investment banking, accounting, technology fields, government jobs and non-profits.

CBS4 AT 5

01/24/07 Colorado's unemployment rate has dropped to its lowest point in five-and-a-half years.

CBS4 AT 6 & CBS4 AT 6:30

01/30/07 Today the US Senate cleared the way for an increase in the minimum wage, but only with business tax breaks.
