## ISSUES

### HEALTH

CBS4 MORNING – 07/26/07 Andrew Speaker, subject of an international tuberculosis health scare, was released from Denver Public Health's isolation order, on the condition that he receive directly observed therapy for two years. 08/05/07 The City Environmental Health Department says it believes the 40 ducks that dies over the weekend at Denver's City Park, died from a form of avian botulism. 09/13/07 There are now five deaths from West Nile Virus in Colorado. The latest to die was a Mesa County resident. 09/17/07 Hilary Clinton is expected to unveil her health care reform plan which would require every American to carry health insurance. 09/23/07 Talks between General Motors and the United Auto Workers are said to include setting up a trust fund that would be used to pay health care costs for retirees.

CBS4 AT NOON – 07/03/07 A federal health official in Atlanta says the man at the center of an international controversy involving tuberculosis has a less severe form of tuberculosis than previously diagnosed. Doctors at National Jewish Medical Center will reclassify Andrew Speaker's disease this afternoon. 07/12/07 Colorado's Health Department now has a partnership with more than 100 McDonald's restaurants, with the goal to offer healthier eating choices. 07/13/07 Nine people have filed suit against Andrew Speaker, a tuberculosis patient who caused an international scare. 09/14/07 A contractor will submit a clean-up plan to the State Health Department, after a random inspection found asbestos in Denver's Lowry neighborhood.

CBS4 AT 5 – 07/08/07 Researchers with the National Institutes of Health say difficulties in future weight loss or adverse affects on overall health are unfounded. 07/12/07 The levels of Ecoli in the South Platte River tested at more than 200 percent above safe levels. The Health Department has red warning signs posted throughout popular swim areas. 07/18/07 Denver Health Community Voices is offering free health screening with each hair cut. 07/30/07 New research suggests that caffeine could help the body fight off skin cancer. 08/23/07 Administrators at CU Boulder are contacting 39 students who attended summer school because their teacher has tested positive for tuberculosis. The teacher is under voluntary home quarantine. 08/24/07 Word is just getting out on college campuses that the cost of obtaining birth control at the health center will double or triple.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 07/19/07 Congress is hearing testimony about problems with formaldehyde fumes in trailers which FEMA gave to Katrina victims. 07/23/07 The Health and Wellness Commission has named Metro Denver number one in health and wellness. 07/25/07 A presidential committee is recommending broad changes to veterans care, after the Washington Post uncovered serious problems at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. 07/30/07 Government Health Advisers say that Avandia, a popular diabetes drug, should remain on the market. 08/06/07 The new addition at Denver Health, the Pavilion

for Women and Children, is good for both patients and the environment. 08/08/07 Governor Bill Ritter issued an executive order establishing a new health care council to oversee grants for healthcare providers. The goal is to serve the estimated 770,000 Coloradans who lack health insurance. 08/16/07 Cherry Creek's park manager warns about an outbreak of swimmer's itch, which is caused by a tiny parasite which some people are allergic to.

CBS4 AT 10 – 07/01/07 A landmark law in Massachusetts went into effect today, and makes carrying health care insurance mandatory. The poorest people will be eligible for free health care. 07/06/07 Michael Moore was in town to promote his new movie Sicko. He plainly acknowledged that he wants socialized health care in the United States. 07/21/07 Linda and Jack Newell are on a crusade to improve in-home oxygen care. They have filed a lawsuit against their oxygen provider citing problems with dirty equipment, lack of education and mold that can cause secondary infections. 09/11/07 Health experts are warning that Colorado could have its worst season ever for West Nile. 09/19/07 Hillary Clinton is making another attempt at a plan for universal health care. 09/21/07 A motionless football player has been helped by an incredible medical advance called Cooling Therapy, which possibly saved his life.

## **HOUSING**

CBS4 MORNING – 07/29/07 Big Papa's Barbeque restaurant is teaming up with the Denver Rescue Mission to collect items for the homeless. 09/27/07 The latest calculations suggest that the Denver Area housing market may be staging a recovery, even as the national slump continues.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 07/24/07 Mayor Hickenlooper announced, during his State of the City speech, that the city's crime rate and homeless population is dramatically going down. 09/04/07 Money raised at the AIDS Walk Colorado, will help housing programs that are bringing people with HIV in off the streets. 08/16/07 The Commerce Department says that construction of new homes has slowed to its lowest level in more than a decade. 08/21/07 Free help to avoid foreclosure is available from HUD approved counselors. 09/21/07 A high-speed train between Denver and the mountain communities could help people working in the mountains live in more affordable housing in the Denver area.

## **SCHOOLS**

CBS4 MORNING – 07/12/07 The US Government is taking another look at putting seat belts in school busses. 08/06/07 John Barry, a retired two-star general, is the new superintendent of Aurora schools. He plans to make Aurora the state's top school district and to curb a truancy rate that was once double the state average. 08/17/07 Just days before classes are scheduled to begin, Denver Public Schools decided to close Del Pueblo Elementary School for the 2007-2008 school year, because no students were registered to attend the school this year. 08/28/07 A former student from Lewis Palmer High School in

Monument is suing the school district because she is allegedly being denied her diploma because of her valedictorian speech. 09/18/07 Westminster Police arrested a Westminster High School student after the student was found to have a gun at the school. 09/19/07 A teacher's aide says he was fired after reporting a possible case of sexual abuse to police. It involved a disabled girl at West Middle School in the Cherry Creek School District. 09/24/07 A new study being released today is raising questions about the use of Spanish in Denver Public Schools. It found that Spanish native speakers make significantly larger gains in richer schools than in poorer ones. 09/27/07 Today marks the first anniversary of the shooting at Platte Canyon High School.

CBS4 AT NOON – 08/30/07 Denver Nuggets star Marcus Camby joined volunteers from T-Mobile to help clean up the Crossroads Alternative School in Thornton. Seventy-five percent of the students are from single or grandparent households.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 08/07/07 Aurora Schools are starting classes early this year, and when school ends next May, 4,000 students will stay on for an additional 23 days of extra instruction. Parents will be given the option to send their struggling students to the fifth block next summer at their home school, so they can benefit from the familiar teachers and environment. 08/14/07 Denver Schools superintendent Michael Bennet says the goal of closing as many as 40 schools, is to improve the quality of instruction for all children. 09/19/07 Some of the school buses in Poudre School District have been outfitted with new anti-pollution gear. 09/28/07 Denver Public Schools will announce which schools will close. They originally planned to close 40 schools, but that number has been reduced to fewer than ten.

CBS4 AT 10 – 08/04/07 Manual High School will re-open in the fall with a new look. A thousand volunteers worked on the courtyard, painted and repaired the school. 08/20/07 Denver's Manual High School re-opened with 180 freshmen students. The school has been closed for a year due to declining enrollment and poor student performance. 09/17/07 Greenwood Village Police are investigating two shootings at Cherry Creek High School, and one in a nearby neighborhood. 09/19/07 Graffiti, including the words "white power", was spray painted inside the auditorium of Denver East High School. A group of black students did it as a prank. 09/20/07 Carrie Binder, the former treasurer of the Lakewood Performing Arts Council, allegedly stole tens of thousands of dollars from the band at Lakewood High School.

## **UNEMPLOYMENT**

CBS4 MORNING – 07/18/07 for the first time in six years, major US airlines have increased staffing levels.

CBS4 AT 5 – 08/04/07 The Civil Rights Division enforces the state's anti-discrimination laws concerning employment, housing and public accommodation. 09/20/07 President Bush says there is good news on the employment front. Jobless claims dropped to their lowest.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 08/08/07 President Bush says the economy is growing modestly and generating jobs. Inflation has shown signs of improving, even though unemployment was up slightly in July. 08/17/07 Colorado created 45,000 new jobs during the past year. 09/03/07 The economic recovery that began in 2001 has lifted productivity growth and employment of late, but has had little impact on many workers' wages. 09/30/07 United Nations Reports that American workers stay longer in the office, at the factory or on the farm than their counterparts in Europe and most other rich nations, and they produce more per person over the year.

CBS4 AT 10 – 08/02/07 A new law called the Employment Non-Discrimination Act, prohibits employment discrimination based on religion, sexual orientation and transgender status. 08/17/07 Colorado's unemployment rate increased to 3.8 percent in July.

## **EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

CBS4 MORNING – 09/24/07 Nine strangers spent four days testing their knowledge of emergency preparedness in the "What If Colorado" competition.

CBS4 AT 5 – 07/14/07 Homeland Security Officials met at Pueblo's Transportation Technology Center to get an overview of the center's Anti-Terror Training Program. The center is used for preparing first responders in handling potential disasters and terrorist attacks that involve trains and underground stations.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 07/19/07 The Colorado State Health Department's new campaign focuses on Emergency Preparedness at the personal level, empowering people to get prepared.

CBS4 AT 10 – 08/05/07 The Rubicon Team's mission is to protect Colorado from terrorists, and private industry is its biggest client.
