ISSUES

EDUCATION – Need to improve public schools and opportunity for higher education. Need to reduce high school drop-out rate.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/05/08 Governor Bill Ritter will be the guest of honor at the ribbon-cutting for a new elementary school; Stone Mountain Elementary. It is one of three new schools in Douglas County to be built using a new high-performance-design prototype. 01/22/08 A Denver Public School principal has been charged with a misdemeanor count of failure to report an allegation of child abuse or neglect at Skinner Middle School. 01/29/08 In his State of the Union speech, President Bush encouraged lawmakers to strengthen the “No Child Left Behind Act”. 02/09/08 Eight students from Castle View High have been hospitalized for taking a prescription pain killer. 02/13/08 A teacher in California says he managed to get a job in education, even though, for a long time, he was not able to read. Now he uses himself as an example to students, showing how they can learn from their mistakes. 02/24/08 Governor Bill Ritter will be presenting his statewide achievement plan for kids at the National Governor’s Association annual winter meeting in Washington DC. 03/02/08 Denver is remembering Rachel B. Noel, the first black woman elected to public office in Colorado. She is remembered for her impact on public education, specifically the integration of Denver Public Schools in the 1960’s. 03/03/08 The National Education Association marked the birthday of Doctor Seuss with “Read Across America” day. 03/03/08 Educational groups are cautiously supporting an overhaul of the public school system proposed by Governor Bill Ritter. His proposal could be introduced as a bill at the State Capitol later this week. 03/14/08 Both houses of Congress passed similar \$3-trillion election year budget plans which promise spending increases for education, defense and other popular programs. 03/18/08 The Brighton School Board is expected to officially pull the charter for Brighton Collegiate High School. Three teachers at the school have been accused of having sexual contact with students in the last two years. 03/19/08 Governor Bill Ritter will unveil his public education reform plan. The Colorado achievement plan for kids will overhaul content standards from pre-school through high school and create new proficiency benchmarks to measure student knowledge. The new requirements are also designed to better match up with college admission standards.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/10/08 Education is a key priority for the governor this year. He is focused on getting children into early education programs and making sure they succeed in college. 01/31/08 Michael Hancock, Denver’s City Council President, supports a new bill at the Capitol called “The Innovative School Act”. The bill would let schools set some of their own guidelines rather than the present District, State and Union. 03/27/08 Hillary Clinton discussed health care for students and plans to help students pay off their college loans.

CBS4 AT 5 – 02/11/08 Jefferson County Public School officials are warning parents that their family's personal information may have been compromised. Information on as many as 2,900 students may be compromised because it was stored on a computer "jump" drive which was stolen. 02/13/08 Denver Public Schools and its teachers union announced a compromise that will grant historic freedoms in hiring, staffing and scheduling for Bruce Randolph and Manual schools, in northeast Denver. 02/26/08 A Castle Rock boy has been arrested for bringing prescription narcotics to school, just weeks after eight Castle View High School students were hospitalized after taking oxy-codone. 03/15/08 Colorado's colleges are among the worst funded in the nation, and at the current rate, it would take 17 years to catch up to the national average.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 01/28/08 Governor Ritter wants Colorado to become a leader in preventing school violence. He has proposed the creation of a school safety resource center which would be devoted to stopping things like school shootings and include response and recovery plans when crimes happen. 02/01/08 The Democratic National Convention is holding an essay contest called "Write to Lead". One middle school student and one high school student will be chosen as presidential winners and will receive laptops and an invitation to the convention. 02/04/08 An Arvada Elementary School is receiving a \$10,000 grant from The Colorado State Library and Dollar General, to help rebuild the library after arson damaged the building. 02/07/08 CSU students pay more than \$800 for books in their senior year. Legislators feel that these prices for new editions each year are unnecessary. 03/31/08 Some state lawmakers want to hire more school counselors in order to help reduce the high-school dropout rate.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/21/08 The superintendent of schools in Aurora, and other staff, will visit the homes of students who have been chronically absent from school this year. 01/24/08 The Denver School Board has vetoed a plan to delay the start of the next school year. They were considering pushing back the start date because of security concerns during the Democratic National Convention. 01/29/08 Denver Public School teachers will vote on proposed changes to their contract. 01/31/08 A 14-year-old high school student is charged with attempted murder after repeatedly stabbing a classmate in the back with scissors at Silver Creek High School in Longmont. 02/21/08 The Denver School Board voted to close one charter school and place three others on probation. 02/25/08 Adams County District 50 is on academic watch, suffering from low graduation rates and declining enrollment. Superintendent Roberta Selleck says the District needs to reinvent itself, by adopting a standards-based model of education, which is a sweeping departure from traditional schooling. 03/15/08 A proposal set to go before the State Legislature would increase tuition at Colorado's Big Four research schools up to 9.5, other schools up to 7.5% and community colleges up to 5.5%.

HEALTH CARE – Concerns about high cost of care and the uninsured.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/02/08 IBM launched its voluntary wellness incentive program four years ago, handing each employee up to three hundred dollars a year for completing healthy eating, exercise and preventative care programs. 01/24/08 New research shows that heart bypass may be the best option for patients with more than one clogged artery. While stents have revolutionized health care, bypass is considered less risky. 01/31/08 State lawmakers are expected to present a proposal on Health Care Reform which would eventually cover all 792,000 uninsured Coloradans. Ideas include a requirement that everyone in the state have health insurance, an increase in child health care, and Medicaid to reduce long-term costs. 02/01/08 More than 300 children are expected to take part in “Give Kids a Smile” day at the University of Colorado School of Dental Medicine in Aurora. Local dentists are volunteering their time to give free dental cleanings, exams and x-rays to children in need. They will also work to fix emergency dental problems. 02/21/08 Two mountain communities are trying to help people deal with the rising costs of prescription drugs. They are offering a free 20% discount card good for prescriptions at most pharmacies. 02/26/08 According to estimates from the centers for Medicare and Medicaid services, health care costs are increasing nearly three times the rate of inflation. 03/04/08 “The Partnership to Fight Chronic Disease” says that the way to fight the rising cost of health care, and improve people’s lives, is to target preventable chronic diseases including cancer, diabetes and heart disease. 03/09/08 The event “Promoting Health Care and Cultural Sharing” will raise money to provide free flu shots, health care and dental care for Asian and African-American communities. 03/25/08 US Senator Ken Salazar will meet with hospital administrators to talk about some changes in Medicare rules, which will mean a loss of \$800 million dollars in funding for Colorado’s Medicare program.

CBS4 AT NOON – 03/23/08 Same sex couples are now eligible for health care benefits through Larimer County, which is the first county along the Front Range and the largest in the state to do this.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/10/08 Right now, about 800,000 Coloradans don’t have health insurance. 02/01/08 A state commission on health care, created by the governor and lawmakers, says all Coloradans should be required to have medical insurance. They also say that the state should put more money into children’s health care and Medicaid programs, and that low-income workers should be given subsidies to get private insurance. 02/05/08 According to Dutch Researchers, it actually costs more to care for healthy people than smokers or obese people, because healthy people live longer. 02/26/08 The government says that in less than a decade, Americans will spend one of every five dollars on health care. Last year the average was more than \$7,000 per person, which is expected to double by 2017. 03/03/08 The second annual “Healthcare Day of Action” rally was held at the state capitol to raise awareness of the fact that 700,000 Coloradans don’t have health insurance.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 01/10/08 Governor Ritter's stated goal is that all Coloradans have access to some basic level of health care. He says there's no magic bullet to fix a system that is so fundamentally broken. 01/23/08 In Washington, the House of Representatives again failed to override President Bush's veto of a children's health insurance bill. 02/01/08 Hilary Clinton says that she is the last remaining presidential candidate who is advocating universal health care coverage.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/09/08 The Speaker of the Colorado House of Representatives says health care for the uninsured is a top priority. 01/10/08 Governor Ritter focused on health care in his State of the State address. He wants to control costs and expand access to care. 02/29/08 Discussion with educators and general public about the differences between the Clinton and Obama proposed health care plans.

HOUSING/HOMELESSNESS – Lack of affordable housing. Many families are on the verge of being homeless.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/09/08 The CEO of Fannie Mae says the housing market may not improve this year. He believes the housing market will weaken through the year. He doesn't expect things to turn around until 2010. 01/19/08 Mayor Hickenlooper, along with 500 of Denver's top business and community leaders, will all be in their pajamas at a fun event to raise money to help the homeless. 01/29/08 The Rocky Mountain News reports that Vail is adding new hotels and restaurants, but no one is building affordable housing for the people who would work at the new businesses. 02/12/08 President Bush will announce an effort called "Project Lifeline" to help homeowners who are facing foreclosure. 02/23/08 The second in a series of foreclosure forums will be held in Thornton. Anyone is invited to attend to learn about foreclosure counseling and prevention.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/25/08 Two-hundred nineteen children received brand new outfits as part of Saint Joseph Hospital's new "Duds for a New Year" program. The children attend Wyman Elementary, where they all receive free lunches and 35 percent of which are homeless.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 01/03/08 There were more than 26,000 foreclosure filings in metro Denver last year, and the inventory of unsold homes remains high. Foreclosures are up more than 41% over previous years. 01/28/08 The government reported that new homes sales fell nearly 5% in December -- capping the worst year on record for builders.

02/22/08 The Colorado Foreclosure Hotline receives an average 1,700 calls a month from people in need of help. Senator Salazar's Foreclosure Prevention Act of 2008 is designed to help.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/16/08 The Federal Reserve predicts that the housing market will remain weak for the first part of the year, which will impact manufacturing and auto sales. 01/20/08 Denver's "Homeless Coalition" has one mission; to make sure nobody freezes outside when it's cold and that all shelters work together. 01/24/08 Sales of single-family homes plunged 13% in 2007, which is the most in 25 years.

IMMIGRATION – Pros and cons about the illegal immigrant issue, and it's effect on the economy.

CBS4 MORNING – 02/05/08 Avon police have arrested Javier Barraza Garcia for passing fake \$100 bills at McDonalds and Wal-Mart. He is also accused of carrying fake social security and immigration documents. 03/22/08 The number of illegal immigrants in Colorado has dropped 40%, compared to 2006 when the mandatory reporting law started. Colorado law enforcement reported 16,000 names to ICE last year.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 01/11/08 A Federal immigration agent is accused of using a federal computer to gather information used in a campaign ad during the last race for governor. 02/11/08 Some businesses hire seasonal workers through a federal temporary worker program, but since the number of visas available has been cut in half, some businesses say they cannot find enough workers. 03/13/08 Colorado employs an estimated 9,000 seasonal workers annually to do the field jobs that most Americans won't. State Representative Marsha Looper is sponsoring a bill to speed up the processing of the Federal visas which immigrant workers need. This would allow the state to help recruit guest workers, and protect them from employer abuse.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/31/08 Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama agree on immigration. They want a pathway to citizenship for those who pay a fine and learn English. However, Clinton says no to a driver's license while Obama says yes. 02/03/08 Hillary Clinton's campaign held a rally in Denver to urge Latino voters to caucus on Tuesday. With immigration a key issue and a growing Latino population, political analysts say that this is the first presidential campaign in which candidates from both parties have been actively courting the Latino vote. 02/06/08 Louie Li is accused of hiring, housing and hiding illegal Mexican immigrants. He and three other members of his family have agreed to plead guilty to misdemeanors and pay a \$150,000 fine. The illegal Mexican immigrants are being deported.

ECONOMY – Cost of living increases.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/17/08 President Bush will meet with Congressional leaders to look for ways to stimulate the economy by creating a stimulus package. 01/18/08 Congress and the President are considering tax rebates directly to taxpayers, extension of unemployment benefits and reducing corporate taxes. 01/23/08 Congresswoman Diana Degette says that the Stimulus Package will help strengthen our economy by encouraging low to middle-class families to re-invest in the economy providing a much needed boost. 01/24/08 The Dow was down more than 300 points before roaring back to gain 300. It was a stunning comeback, but no cure for the economy. 01/25/08 Economists say that the best use of the government rebates, in order to stimulate the economy right away, is to spend it on items like clothing, cars and dining out. The worst thing to do for the economy is to save it. 01/29/08 With Washington scrambling to prevent an economic recession, presidential candidates are in battle ground states fighting for a chance to fix the problem. 01/29/08 President Bush used his final State of the Union address to reassure Americans that the nation's financial future remains strong. He then pressed Congress to add some muscle by acting on the stimulus plan now. 02/01/08 OPEC fears that soft world economies will translate into weakened demand. A continued weak American dollar is also a factor in keeping output where it is. 02/07/09 New home starts and sales in the Denver Metro area were down 36% from the previous study. 02/07/08 Senate Republicans have blocked a bill that would add \$44-billion dollars to the President's economic stimulus package. The additional funds would go the elderly, disabled veterans, and the unemployed. 02/09/08 Leaders of the world's seven biggest nations are talking about the state of the world's economy this weekend. The global stock market turmoil has partly been caused by a recession in the United States. 02/11/08 President Bush says that the country is in a period of economic uncertainty. The administration maintains that the economy is fundamentally strong and is not forecasting a recession. 02/14/08 Barack Obama said that if elected, he would spend \$210 billion dollars to create jobs in the construction and environmental industries. 03/05/08 Governor Bill Ritter is dropping his proposal to raise car registration fees because of the poor economy. 03/07/08 Fears of a sagging US economy have sent overseas markets plunging in overnight trading. 03/07/08 The Labor Department has reported more bad news for the economy. It says companies cut 63,000 jobs in the month of February, which is the most since March of 2003. 03/12/08 Charles Schwab says it will expand its operation in Denver, and could add another 500 jobs to its Denver Facility. The move could have a \$50 million dollar impact on the metro area economy. 03/18/08 The Federal Reserve is banking on another rate cut to put the economy back on track. They're fighting housing collapse, credit meltdown and Wall Street turmoil that threaten the country's entire financial system. 03/18/08 Lawmakers are considering a \$25-million dollar tax credit program designed to stimulate the state economy by bringing more movie productions to our state.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/04/08 The jobless rate is 5%, which is a two-year high and the Labor Department is raising fears that the economy could slide into a recession. 01/16/08 Excel utility company says that the winter of 2005-2006 was a record heating season, and we can expect our January bill to be slightly higher than last year, with a two percent increase projected. 01/18/08 The economy has suddenly become a key topic for the presidential candidates on the campaign trail. 01/24/08 Financial experts say that people at different stages in life will have to handle their 401Ks and stocks differently. 02/01/08 President Bush will push for his economic plan which included tax rebates to boost the sagging economy. 02/14/08 Ben Bernanke, Chairman of the Federal Reserve, told the Senate banking committee that the economic outlook has deteriorated due to housing and credit problems. The Federal Reserve may continue cutting a key interest rate to help stabilize the economy. 03/04/08 The Chairman of the Federal Reserve says more needs to be done to ease the mortgage crisis. Rising foreclosures make the housing market problems worse, and could push the economy closer to recession. 03/14/08 President Bush is trying to quell concerns about the American economy, telling a gathering in New York City that better times are just around the corner. However, many economists say the nation is in a recession.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/16/08 As the banking industry sorts out its losses on the leveraged investments tied to sub-prime lending, many market investors are concluding that the problem, while bad, isn't as dire as some had predicted which is actually causing some optimism on Wall Street. 01/23/08 The Federal Reserve cut interest rates $\frac{3}{4}$ of a percent, but despite its likely positive impact on housing, the rate cut may not do enough to stimulate growth. 02/01/08 The Labor Department says that employers cut 17,000 jobs in January. Wage growth also slowed down. 03/13/08 Chrysler announced it will shut down for two weeks in July, forcing employees to take vacations. This move is aimed at boosting productivity and efficiency.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 01/17/08 Dr. Tucker Hart Adams, Colorado's leading economist, says that if we're not already in a recession, we will be shortly. 01/18/08 John Edwards says that in order to grow the middle class, we must strengthen and grow the organized labor movement in America. 02/01/08 January's job losses suggest that the economy is in recession. The economy did add service jobs and also jobs in the retail sector, but that growth was offset by more job losses in manufacturing and construction. 02/14/08 The Federal Reserve Chairman, testifying before the Senate, says that the US economy is in trouble. He said a deepening housing slump and tightening credit market continue to strain the economy. 02/28/08 President Bush hopes that the Government's rebate checks will give the economy a jump start. The checks will start going out in mid-May. 03/12/08 State Representative John Kefalas wants to help working families by restoring the state earned income tax credit. It would benefit families making no more than \$40,000 a year and the average refund would be \$160-\$200 and would cost the state about \$52 million dollars for this year.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/02/08 Oil prices started the new year by trading at a new record high, over \$100 a barrel. Analysts say the milestone reflects that the global demand for oil and related products will continue to out-pace supplies. 01/15/08 For America's financial giants, it's the worst period since the great depression. Citigroup, the country's largest bank, lost nearly \$10 billion dollars in the last three months of 2007. 01/16/08 Inflation is at a 17-year high of 4.1%, but some analysts predict solid economic growth to return by the end of this year. 01/18/08 With Washington scrambling to prevent an economic recession, presidential candidates are in battle ground states fighting for a chance to fix the problem. 01/24/08 The details of the Stimulus Package are: \$600 for most individuals, \$1,200 dollars for married couples. Parents will receive around \$300 for each child. People, who earned some money, but not enough to pay taxes, will get \$300. There are also tax incentives for businesses and relief for homeowners facing foreclosure. 02/04/08 The hardest hit industry right now is construction. There have been nearly 50,000 layoffs because of the housing slump. 02/05/08 The stock market went into a dive in reaction to news that the nation's service sector is slowing down for the first time in five years. The Dow Jones fell 370 points, which is the biggest drop since August. 02/07/08 The Senate and House approved an amended economic stimulus package that will give many taxpayers rebate checks. 03/10/08 DU Finance Professor and Economist Mac Clouse says that stagflation would be a throwback to the 70s when we lined up for gasoline. Prices were higher yet, the economy wasn't growing. 03/11/08 The Dow Jones saw its biggest one-day point gain in nearly five and a half years. It closed with a gain of 416 points. 03/13/08 The dollar fell to a new low against the Euro, retail sales were down six-tenths of a percent, oil and gasoline prices hit record highs, and analysts think fuel prices will keep climbing. 03/13/08 Colorado's Small Business Association says since October first 2007, it has approved more than a thousand loans worth 236 million dollars. 03/19/08 The Dow fell 293 points and oil fell more than \$400 a barrel. This is the biggest one day decline since 1991. 03/21/08 The Dow and NASDAQ are both up, after w week that started with a near collapse on Wall Street.

CHILDREN – Child abuse and neglect.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/08/08 Isidoro Valdez-Ruelas faces a first degree murder charge and a charge of child abuse resulting in death after he shook his three-month-old daughter to death. 01/17/08 A woman has plead guilty to child abuse resulting in death, for leaving her newborn son in a trash can in a Cherry Creek Bar. 01/18/08 An autopsy is planned for a four-year-old girl who is believed ti gave died from child abuse. The mother and boyfriend are jailed for investigation of attempted first-degree murder. 02/27/08 Denver police are investigating the death of a baby left near an emergency call box outside Presbyterian Saint Luke's Medical Center. 03/02/08 Reports of child abuse are on the rise in Colorado. The Denver Post reports that roughly half of all child abuse and neglect call in the state are never checked out. 03/04/09 A man faces several charges including reckless driving, vehicular eluding and child abuse, after leading Douglas County Sheriff's Deputies on a chase.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/09/08 Alex Midyette is accused of fatally injuring his 10-week-old son. His wife has already been convicted. 03/07/08 An independent report on Denver Human Services says DHS caseworkers need to do a better job of recognizing when a child may be in danger. The probe comes after the death of several children who have had contact with the DHS system. Human Services has set up a child abuse hotline. 03/10/08 A mother in Highlands Ranch is accused of prostitution and child abuse. 03/11/08 Nicole Veltze, Principal at Skinner Middle School, has pleaded not guilty to the charge that she failed to tell police immediately about an allegation of child abuse. 03/12/08 Dan Partch is on trial for child abuse causing death. Loreyna Barea weighed just 35 pounds when she died of dehydration and internal injuries.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 01/29/08 Police arrested a father in the death of his ten-year-old daughter who was shot during a gun battle inside her own home. 03/12/08 A senate committee passed a bill that would allow the death penalty in cases of second offenders sexually assaulting a child under the age of 12.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/04/08 The US Supreme Court will decide if Louisiana will continue to be the only state that can execute convicted child rapists. 02/13/08 A mother in Colorado Springs faces 19 charges for a house fire that killed one of her children and burned four others. The charges are first degree murder, attempted murder, child abuse and arson. 03/21/08 A couple has been sentenced for running a meth lab in their home while their one year old daughter lived there. The child now lives with relatives out of state.
