Attached are listings of broadcasts or broadcast segments, which, in the station's judgment, reflect the station's most significant programming treatment of ascertained community issues during the period from April 1, 2008– June 30, 2008.

KCNC broadcasts both locally produced and network programming. Although we include only local programs herein, KCNC also broadcasts several network programs including Face The Nation, 60 Minutes and 48 Hours, which we believe also serve community needs and interests.

CBS4 MORNING - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: Two hours Monday - Friday 5:00 am - 7:00am. One hour Saturday 7:00am - 8:00am. Two hours Sunday 6:00am – 8:00am.

CBS4 AT NOON - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday - Friday, 12:00pm - 12:30pm

CBS4 AT 5 - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: One half-hour Monday – Friday, 5:00pm – 5:30pm. One hour Saturday – Sunday, 5:00pm – 6:00pm.

CBS4 AT 6 – Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

ISSUES

ECONOMY – Foreclosures and declining property values.

CBS4 MORNING –04/03/08 In the first three months of the year, 2,000 homes were placed in foreclosure. The hardest hit areas were Montbello, Green Valley Ranch and Southwest Denver. 04/04/08 The price of jet fuel has risen sharply and the slowing economy has led airlines to fear that demand is about to drop. 04/08/08 President Bush plans to meet with business executives to help him highlight the investment tax breaks and stimulus plan he and Congress agreed on. He maintains the stimulus package is all that is needed to get the economy back on track. 04/13/08 Lawmakers are expected to announce some major legislation providing homeowners with more opportunities to save their homes from foreclosure. 04/21/08 According to a new survey released by the National Association for Business Economics, 70 percent of economists surveyed were more down on the economy than they were in January. Thirty percent of economists now think the economy will shrink in the first half of this year, compared with just ten percent in January. There are three major factors affecting spending right now; credit, financial and housing. 04/23/08 A new report shows that foreclosure rates continue to rise, despite efforts by the government to help. The state foreclosure prevention group found that foreclosures are up 8% since October. 05/07/08 The US House of Representatives is preparing to vote on the Democratic plan to rescue homeowners who are facing foreclosure. The plan would allow the Federal Housing Administration to insure up to \$300 billion dollars in new mortgages for homeowners who don't qualify for large loans. President Bush is threatening to veto the plan.

CBS4 AT NOON – 04/01/08 Lawmakers are questioning oil company executives about why the price of gas is so high. 04/02/08 Hillary Clinton announced her \$7-billion dollar jobs plan which includes tax incentives for US companies not to send jobs overseas. 04/03/08 A bill now before the Senate would ease the foreclosure crisis. The Bill contains \$4-billion dollars in grants to local governments to buy and refurbish foreclosed homes, as well as a tax credit to buyers of homes in or near foreclosure. 04/07/08 With a recession looming and unemployment rising, many people are worried about getting laid off from their jobs. But economists say there are some areas where jobs will continue to grow despite the economy. 04/21/08 Until 2007, Colorado was one of only two states with an unregulated mortgage industry, which may have been one of the issues resulting in homebuyers mortgaging homes they couldn't afford. 04/30/08 Colorado is one of the five worst states for foreclosure rates.

CBS4 AT 5 – 04/02/08 The Federal Reserve Chairman says he expects more economic growth in the second half of this year. He also says a recession is still possible. 04/03/08 Senate leaders have agreed on a bill that would issue \$10-billion dollars in tax-free bonds to help homeowners get out from bad sub-prime loans, and offer a \$7-thousand dollar tax credit to buyers of homes in or near foreclosure. 04/13/08 State lawmakers are pushing a plan to make sure homeowners and lenders are talking to each other in order to prevent foreclosures. 04/13/08 Realty Trac says Colorado had more than 6,700 properties in some state of foreclosure in February. That's one foreclosure for every 305 households.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 04/15/08 Foreclosure filings against US Homeowners rose 57% in March, and adjustable-rate loans will be resetting to higher rates through May and June. 04/21/08 Governor Ritter announced the start of Foreclosure Prevention Week across the state. One of the main goals is to make homeowners aware of the state's foreclosure hotline. 05/02/08 President Bush says that rebate checks will help people through the tough times. It will take a few months to see if the rebate checks have the desired effect of reviving the economy.

CBS4 AT 10 – 04/02/08 Congress has reached a bi-partisan agreement that would cost about \$20-billion dollars. It would issue \$10-billion dollars in tax-free revenue bonds to help homeowners get out from under bad sub-prime loans, and it would offer a \$7-thousand dollar tax credit to buyers of homes in or near foreclosure. 04/10/08 The Colorado Foreclosure Hotline was launched 18 months ago, and its success is truly amazing. Eighty percent of the homeowners avoided foreclosure by selling their homes before final foreclosure, or paying off missed payments and initiating a re-payment plan, or by receiving a mortgage re-modification. 04/13/08 State Democrats unveiled a plan called "The American Dream Protection Act of 2008" which would require banks to work more closely with homeowners and put foreclosure plans on hold. 04/29/08 President Bush is blaming lawmakers for the country's economic problems. He criticized Congress for failing to act on everything from home foreclosures to high gas prices.

EDUCATION – Insufficient number of schools. Standardized education levels for all schools regardless of socio-economic reasons.

CBS4 MORNING – 04/01/08 A non-profit group called "America's Promise Alliance" looked at graduation rates in 50 major cities and found that only half the students in some urban areas are getting diplomas. Denver Public Schools has a 46% graduation rate. 04/04/08 The U.S. Education Department reports that Colorado eighth-graders were among the best in the nation on a writing test administered last year. 04/06/08 April is financial Literacy month, and the Young Americans Center for Financial Education is offering free classes for children and parents on everything from being responsible with credit cards to saving money. 04/25/08 Governor Ritter will meet with the governing board members of the State's ten universities and colleges. 04/28/08 Governor Bill Ritter will sign the State budget into law, and the largest portion will go to fund education. 05/02/08 Governor Ritter has made a plan that would update Colorado's curriculum standards from preschool all the way through college. 05/06/08 The Colorado State Senate passed a bill changing the K-12 education standards to better prepare students for college.

CBS4 AT NOON – 05/14/08 Governor Ritter signed four new laws related to education. These laws create new standards and assessments that start with preschool and carry on through college. 06/20/08 A grass-roots group called "Citizens Advocating Public Education" says the Boulder Valley School District is too large to be managed effectively.

CBS4 AT 5 – 05/28/08 Barack Obama toured Mapleton expeditionary school in Thornton and spoke about fixing an education system where he said a student's success should not be based on wealth or birth. He said that the responsibility for our children's education has to start at home. We have to set high standards for them and spend time with them and love them and we have to hold ourselves accountable. 06/27/08 Denver's school board approved two charter schools for 2009. This was part of the district's early cycle for new school programs which is a new initiative by Denver Public Schools to provide varied educational programs.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 04/24/08 Governor Ritter testified before the House Education Committee to push his education plan. 05/14/08 Governor Ritter is making good on his promise to make education a priority. He signed four education bills into law. 06/05/08 Governor Ritter signed the final bills of the 2008 session. He says this legislature will be known as the Education Session, for its accomplishments in education reform and funding.

CBS4 AT 10 – 04/09/08 Bob Schaffer has worked to promote charter schools and made it easier to establish them in Colorado. 05/13/08 The Denver Board of Education responded to a CBS4 investigation into CCI Charter School. It says that Denver Public Schools will take the appropriate actions to ensure that all of its schools, including charter schools, are complying with district, state and federal rules and laws. 05/14/08 Governor Ritter signed four education bills into law, including the Colorado Achievement Plan for Kids. 05/30/08 Students at the Denver School of Science and Technology come from all walks of life, and any student can apply. They are selected through a random lottery where the only requirement is that 40% of them come from low-income families. 05/30/08 A state judge has ruled that the Mill Levy Freeze, which was signed by Governor Ritter last year, is unconstitutional. The ruling comes in a lawsuit against the so-called "School Finance Act".

GROWTH & DEVELOPMENT – Long term growth and development in Downtown Denver.

CBS4 MORNING – 04/16/08 A government report on housing says that the construction of new homes has dropped to its lowest level in 17 years. 04/23/08 Nationally, sales of existing homes fell again in March. 05/05/08 A new building is setting an example for all of downtown Denver. It's silver on the outside and "green" on the inside. They recycle 60% of their office waste. 05/16/08 The Commerce Department announced that housing starts rose by more than 8%. A big jump in apartment construction offset the weak construction for single-family homes. 05/20/08 Construction of a new community in Aurora, called Horizon Uptown, could begin this year. When completed, the area is expected to have 3,800 new homes, an elementary school, a central park, and 1.3 million square feet of retail space. 06/11/08 A report in the Rocky Mountain News says that for the 8th straight quarter, housing starts have declined in the Metro area, due to the fact that qualifying for loans has become harder for homeowners.

CBS4 AT NOON – 04/23/08 The housing market in the Metro Denver area is flooded, but more homes keep being built. 04/29/08 The Denver City Council has agreed to re-zone two neighborhoods in order to stop construction of multi-family homes. 06/02/08 Economists say a report on construction spending in April shows the sixth monthly decline in seven months. 06/04/08 Governor Ritter will sign a bill to fund construction of the new Ralph Carr Justice Center downtown.

CBS4 AT 5 – 05/21/08 Construction of the Rocky Mountain Hospital for Children is now under-way in Denver.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 06/11/08 Four of the nation's largest homebuilders have settled with the EPA for failing to control runoff at construction sites. Those companies failed to control runoff from 104 construction sites in Colorado. 06/12/08 ICF homes, built from Insulating Concrete Forms, are very strong and can withstand tornados. Some people in Windsor are rebuilding with this technology, following the recent tornado. 06/26/08 The Denver Federal Center's \$6-million dollar solar park was dedicated today. It will produce 10% of the Federal Center's electricity.

HEALTH – Lack of health insurance.

CBS4 MORNING – 04/02/08 Expedition Health will be completed next year at the Denver Museum of Nature and Science. The new exhibit will inspire people to make health changes in their everyday lives. 05/26/08 Thousands of private counselors are volunteering their services to troops returning home from Iraq and Afghanistan.

CBS4 AT NOON – 04/10/08 Lawmakers are considering a state consumer guide to increase health care coverage transparency.

CBS4 AT 5 – 04/03/08 Larimer County workers can now get health coverage for their domestic partners. 05/28/08 Colorado is ranked in the bottom third of all states in providing quality health care to children.

CBS4 AT 6 and 6:30 – 04/03/08 The Kaiser Permanente Health Plan shows that the cost for injectable drugs went up 20% or up to \$250. 04/10/08 Under House Bill 1385, the State Insurance Commissioner would be required to set up and maintain a website where Coloradans can find critical information to make their health care decisions. 05/02/08 Senator John McCain held a town hall meeting in Denver to talk about his health care plan. 05/05/08 Colorado lawmakers passed legislation making an additional 57,000 children eligible for health insurance. They also passed a bill to make it easier to understand health care bills.

CBS4 AT 10 – 04/08/08 A new health clinic is set to open at Alameda High School in Lakewood. It's for kids and teens, and will also be open to the community. The clinic is funded by a state grant, and will be staffed year-round with nurse practitioners. 05/19/08 Google launched a new health website which allows consumers to store all their personal health information in one place, including prescriptions and medical records.

YOUTH – Activities for kids, transportation issues over school breaks.

CBS4 MORNING – 04/16/08 Governor Ritter will hold a news conference about additional efforts to address child-protective services in Colorado. 06/06/08 Workforce skills are the main focus of the after-school program at Youth Biz where teens build their confidence and develop an idea of what they want to do with their lives. For 16 years, Youth Biz has turned ordinary teens into extraordinary leaders. 04/04/08 Denver police will be strictly enforcing summer curfew hours, which means that minors 17 and under need to be off the streets by midnight on Friday and Saturday. The curfew is 11:00pm Sunday through Thursday.

CBS4 AT NOON - 06/10/08 A survey of Colorado's children shows a 73% increase in the number of children living in poverty. Governor Ritter says the solution is committing to educating those children.

CBS4 AT 5 – 04/12/08 The goal at Box City is to teach kids the basics of how a city is actually built, hoping that this kind of hands-on involvement will lead to better cities in the future. 06/14/08 CBS4 is partnering with Kindervision to help keep kids safe. It's a way to guard against abduction and exploitation.

CBS4 AT 10 – 05/23/08 the Denver Broncos are sponsoring a free high school player development camp, for kids to work on their grid-iron fundamentals. 06/26/08 Marco Nunez works as a parent youth advocate, and helped draft the Denver Public School Discipline Guidelines. They ensure staff training and make strong efforts to minimize out-of-school suspensions, expulsions and referrals to law enforcement.
