Attached are listings of broadcasts or broadcast segments, which, in the station's judgment, reflect the station's most significant programming treatment of ascertained community issues during the period from January 1, 2009 – March 31, 2009.

KCNC broadcasts both locally produced and network programming. Although we include only local programs herein, KCNC also broadcasts several network programs including Face The Nation, 60 Minutes and 48 Hours, which we believe also serve community needs and interests.

ISSUES

HEALTH – How to continue health insurance after lay-off.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/06/09 Overall health care costs rose 6.1%, which is the smallest increase in almost ten years. The biggest factor in the slowdown was a jump in the number of people buying generic drugs. 01/22/09 A legislative committee has passed a bill which would allow insurance companies and businesses to offer discounts to people who participate in wellness programs. 02/04/09 President Obama is expected to sign a bill expanding the State Children's Health Insurance Program. 02/12/09 Colorado State lawmakers want to help the people of Colorado with affordable health care insurance. Right now, 800,000 Coloradans are uninsured. 03/05//09 President Obama hosts his White House forum on health reform. 03/16/09 A bill is introduced at the Colorado State Capitol that will ban gender discrimination when it comes to setting insurance rates. 03/24/09 A proposed law that would have barred health insurance companies from discriminating against women is now dead.

CBS4 AT NOON – 02/10/09 "Beating the Recession" Money can be saved on dental work by having it done at a dental school. 02/13/09 A proposal to extend health insurance benefits to same-sex partners of State employees is headed to the full Senate for debate. Presently women pay 30 to 40 percent more in health insurance than men.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/19/09 Volunteers from Kaiser held a huge health fair at Manual High School in Denver. Hundreds lined up for free services. 02/05/09 "Beating the Recession" Lowering costs of prescriptions can be accomplished by using generics. Sometimes it is more economical to buy larger milligram pills and split them. Buying three month quantities can often be cheaper. 02/20/09 King Soopers grocery store has opened urgent care clinics inside four of their stores. 02/23/09 "Beating the Recession" Tri-County Health is helping uninsured, struggling parents to get vaccinations for their children. 02/25/09 A new study from the Institute of Medicine says the number of Americans without health insurance is growing as more employers cut benefits. 03/09/09 "Beating the Recession" Kaiser Permanente offers an HMO plan that includes a \$30 co-pay, \$5 generic medications and free preventive services, for only \$100 per month. Because of this report, Kaiser Permanente is setting up a free broker referral hotline, not only for Kaiser products.

CBS4 AT 6 & CBS AT 6:30 – 01/05/09 Often, employers or health insurance providers offer discounts for gym membership. 02/11/09 "Beating the Recession" State Rep Spencer Swalm says his bill would open up HMO plans to tens of thousands of working class Coloradans who can't afford health insurance right now. It would allow HMO's to sell a limited benefit, affordable health insurance product in a small-group market. 03/02/09 President Obama nominated Kathleen Sebelius for the job of Health and Human Services Secretary. She will help him tackle the health care system.

CBS4 AT 10 – 02/02/09 State Lawmakers are busy looking at a bill that would prevent people from being dropped by their insurance companies. The bill would require insurance companies to continue covering patients who choose to participate in clinical trials, focusing on helping patients who have tried conventional therapies and may benefit from experimental ones. 02/04/09 President Obama signed the Children’s Health Bill, which extends health coverage to four million uninsured children. 02/20/09 “Beating the Recession” Some King Soopers grocery stores are setting up affordable health clinics to help those with no insurance or those who need help on the weekends or later in the evening.

HOUSING – Re-financing, buying, selling, foreclosures, and interest rates.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/22/09 “Beating the Recession” Realtor Wayne Herman told of the opportunities, at present, in real estate. 01/22/09 The Commerce Department released the latest information on new housing construction for December 2008. Construction fell for the sixth straight month. 01/28/09 According to a national housing report, the Denver-area housing market outperformed all but one market. 02/18/09 President Obama is expected to unveil a \$50 billion dollar package to ease the housing crisis. 03/17/09 Despite the tanking market, some realtors in the metro area are helping home owners, and themselves, beat the recession and sell homes.

CBS4 AT NOON – 02/13/09 President Obama plans to announce a housing program. His administration will unveil proposals for overhauling regulations.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/25/09 In the struggling housing market, homebuilders are using big incentives for those willing to buy now. 02/07/09 The slow housing market over the past year is starting to pick back up in the Denver area. 03/02/09 The United Way’s Individual Development Accounts allow low-income people to save money and receive matching funds to buy houses or start businesses.

CBS4 AT 6 CBS4 AT 6:30 – 01/22/09 The Colorado Foreclosure Hotline’s organization called “Neighbor to Neighbor” says more successful loan re-financings are now being seen. 01/26/09 Home sales, nationwide, actually rose by 6.5% in December, as consumers bought up foreclosed homes. 03/03/09 The United Way’s Brunetti Lofts offer a five year transformational housing program providing families reduced rents and financial counseling. 03/04/09 The government will spend \$75 billion dollars to help as many as 9 million homeowners avoid foreclosure. The program is called “Making Home Affordable” and it helps struggling homeowners in two ways: by refinancing as many as \$5 million dollars in loans and modifying the terms of another \$4 million. 03/16/09 CBS4 is holding a “Beating the Recession” Town Hall meeting. The first hour is broadcast live; the last half hour is web-cast live. There are experts on topics ranging from the job and housing markets to tightening up the family budget and bargain shopping.

CBS4 AT 10 – 02/02/09 “Beating the Recession” Boulder Housing Partners will be accepting applications for affordable housing through the end of February. Help for people outside of Boulder County is provided by calling United Way. 02/23/09 The Colorado Division of Housing says that the Metro housing market foreclosure rates are falling significantly. 02/26/09 Students at Loveland High School are helping families beat the recession by building affordable housing. They are taking their geometry skills and applying them to job sites. The houses are going to low income families. 03/17/09 Nationwide, new construction was up 22% from January to February, but the west was the only region to report declines in new home construction. 03/18/09 The Federal Reserve will buy \$300 billion dollars in treasury bonds. This action tells investors that the government is serious about solving the housing crisis.

EMPLOYMENT – Surviving lay-offs. How to find another job.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/06/09 the Colorado Women’s Chamber of commerce hosted a free job fair in Downtown Denver, with businesses from 12 different industries participating. 01/19/09 A forecast released by the U.S. Conference of Mayors finds only five metropolitan areas in the U.S. will escape job losses this year. Ithaca, N.Y.; Fairbanks, Alaska; and St. George, Utah, are among the handful of the nation's 363 metropolitan areas expected to see employment remain flat or increase slightly. 01/28/09 Unemployment in Colorado has reached 6.1%; the highest it’s been in five years. The national average is 7.2%. 02/17/09 A CBS4 investigation has revealed that Joblink, an employment service based in Denver, has admitted that it was giving job-seekers outdated and useless information. 02/18/09 “Beating the Recession” Two job fairs; Devry University and Employment Guide.com are sponsoring one at the University’s Westminster campus, and the Greater Denver Career Fair is being held at the Colorado Convention Center. 03/16/09 Fed Chairman Ben Bernanke believes the recession will end this year, but the unemployment rate will keep climbing past the current 8.1 percent. 03/17/09 The City of Westminster has more than 20 job openings for seasonal workers in Parks and Recreation and on golf courses. Employment applications are due by March 25th.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/28/09 Tips on how to avoid the long lines at the unemployment office. First time applicants can file their claims on line. Staff has been increased to handle the overwhelming number of phone calls. 02/17/09 The Economic Stimulus Plan should create 3.5 million jobs, and 60,000 of them are in Colorado. The White House released how many jobs will be created in each of Colorado’s seven Congressional Districts. 03/17/09 Denver Police are looking for a fourth man in connection with an on-line employment scam. A company called Careers for Life was posting job openings on Craigslist.

CBS4 AT 5 – 03/14/09 Danish-owned wind turbine company Vestas plans to build a plant in Pueblo. It will be the largest of its kind in the world, so hundreds of job-seekers showed up at the Vestas Job Fair to hear about the employment opportunities. 03/28/09 Fortune Valley Hotel and Casino held a Job Fair for 120 new positions opening up at the casino. 03/30/09 Andrew Hudson puts together a comprehensive jobs list of people looking for employment, or for those looking to change careers.

CBS4 AT 6 & CBS4 AT 6:30 – 02/05/09 The number of people who filed for unemployment benefits hit a 26-year high at the end of February. Six-hundred-twenty-six thousand people filed for jobless claims. 02/23/09 Three Colorado investors have plans for a huge new community. They are beating the recession with a “green” housing development plan that could pump thousands of jobs into the area. 03/27/09 Now that Colorado’s 3-month unemployment average exceeds 6 percent, the Federal Government offers a second tier of benefits for 13 more weeks.

CBS4 AT 10 – 02/04/09 “Beating the Recession” The number of employment scams is rising, as so many people are desperate to find work. 03/21/09 “Beating the Recession” Lakewood is hiring 20 police officers and Arvada has 4 openings. 03/27/09 The Federal Government has extended its benefits to Colorado. There are still about 30 states with a higher unemployment number than Colorado, but the Government is watching our last three month average.

ECONOMY – How to beat the recession.

On January 19, 2009, CBS4 Denver began reporting on the recession in a new way, in every newscast, covering the tough economic news, but also covering the people who are fighting back. It’s called “Beating the Recession”. Reports are done by Molly Hughes, taking on the family budget; Kathy Walsh and Dr. Dave addressing avoiding stress and saving money on health care; Shaun Boyd explaining the job market; Alan Gionet asking “Good Questions” about real estate; Terry Jessup explaining what the government is doing to help consumers; and Karen Leigh and Jim Benemann introducing families with financial questions and matching them up with financial planners.

CBS4 MORNING – 01/03/09 – Colorado’s top Democratic lawmakers say they will focus on the economy when their new legislative session begins next week. Their top priorities are dealing with the budget shortfall and creating jobs. 01/07/09 Elbert County Colorado is cutting ten percent from its budget. There will be no job cuts, but employees will have their pay cut by 10%. 01/07/09 Obama’s proposed recovery package could cost nearly 800 billion dollars. He says the heavy spending is needed to jump-start the economy. 01/09/09 President-Elect Obama is pushing a plan to help Americans deal with the recession, but his stimulus plan is meeting with heavy opposition. 01/11/09 President-Elect Obama is looking to save or create more than 4 million jobs by passing his stimulus plan. 01/12/09 The “big three” automakers in Detroit are taking a giant risk, in this sagging economy, by putting billions of dollars into electric cars. 01/13/09 The Shane Company, Colorado’s largest jeweler, has filed for Chapter 11 Bankruptcy, and plans to restructure. 01/14/09 The economic news could get worse for Americans. December retail sales reports are expected to show the worst holiday shopping season in almost 40 years. 01/19/09 CBS News has a website section on weathering the downturn in the economy, which offers information on finding a new job. 03/25/09 A Denmark-based company, Vestas, makes and sells wind turbines used to make energy. They have one plant in Windsor and plans for two more in Brighton. Nearly 1,400 jobs will be created.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/08/09 Obama says it's not too late to change our economic course, but it will be if we don't take dramatic action immediately. 01/08/09 The State of the State speech, Governor Ritter touched on several big issues, but the big focus was the economy. 01/09/09 Car repair businesses are seeing increased business, because rather than trading up; people are hanging onto their aging cars, and relying on the repair shops to keep them going. 01/15/09 Experts say that there are fewer foreclosures, despite the tough economy, because lenders are more willing to work with homeowners, and some have suspended foreclosures. 01/20/09 Molly Hughes has a list of 20 healthiest foods for less than one dollar per serving. If you follow it, you can save hundreds, even thousands of dollars each year, and become healthier in the process.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/03/09 Obama talked about how his American Recovery and Reinvestment Plan will create jobs. 01/04/09 Colorado Lottery ticket sales are down 2% over the past 6 months and down 17% in November. The drop in sales means less money for the state’s parks, wildlife and open spaces. 01/05/09 President-Elect Obama is focused on the economy as he drums up support for a second economic stimulus package. 01/09/09 Barack Obama promised to work with Congress to refine his \$800 billion dollar stimulus package. 01/14/09 Governor Ritter says with less money coming in due to the economy, the state must come up with new revenue sources to pay for critical projects which will create more jobs.

CBS4 AT 6 & CBS4 AT 6:30 – 01/04/09 Our recession-challenged economy is forcing small businesses in Colorado to find unique ways to attract customers. Rhinelander Bakery reduced the size of their pastries and in turn, the prices, in order to better match what customers are able to afford. 01/05/09 Some big discounts can be found at gyms because they didn't have their typical flood of people signing up after the holidays. 01/05/09 Legislative leaders say their overriding focus will be the state's economy, to retain and create jobs. 01/06/09 The 111th Congress convened with the nation's economy as their top concern. 01/06/09 Former Colorado State Treasurer Mike Coffman was sworn into the U.S. House of Representatives. He says the economy is his main concern. 01/07/09 Colorado State Lawmakers went back to work today. Boosting the Colorado economy is their top priority. 01/08/09 Governor Ritter wants to build on Colorado's successes in forging a new energy economy. 01/14/09 Republicans on Capitol Hill feel that part of Barack Obama's bailout should go to real estate and housing. 01/20/09 President Obama's \$825 billion dollar stimulus package includes \$550 billion to be spent on renewable energy, education, and health care innovations, along with billions in tax cuts.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/04/09 The President-Elect will meet with Democratic and Republican leaders about his plans to get the economy back on track. 01/05/09 Hyundai Assurance is a new program. If you buy a car, and then you lose your job or your business goes bankrupt, you can return a new Hyundai within a year and get the appraised value plus \$7,500 in depreciation. 01/05/09 Barack Obama reveals his plan to save the economy. 01/08/09 Governor Bill Ritter gave a very sobering State of the State Address, saying that the State Budget is suffering right along with many Coloradans during this recession. 01/08/09 President-Elect Obama's battle-cry to Congress is "Act boldly and act now!" 01/10/09 President-Elect Obama says that if nothing is done to fix the economy, this recession could linger for years. 01/13/09 Denver Mayor Hickenlooper is working to stimulate the local economy this year, by accelerating infrastructure projects. 01/13/09 After more than 100 years in business, National Hirschfeld printing is closing.
