KCNC broadcasts both locally produced and network programming. Although we include only local programs herein, KCNC also broadcasts several network programs including Face The Nation, 60 Minutes and 48 Hours, which we believe also serve community needs and interests.

ISSUES

POVERTY

CBS4 MORNING – 10/19/09 A new report in the Denver Post shows that Colorado has the highest rate of growth, in the country, for children living in poverty. The percentage has grown 73% from 2000 to 2006. 11/17/09 Kenyon Martin of the Nuggets delivered more than \$7,000 dollars worth of turkeys to the Denver Rescue Mission. 11/30/09 Southwest Airlines donated \$50,000 dollars to the Denver Rescue Mission, which will go toward 4,000 turkeys and “Banquet in a Box” to needy families. 12/05/09 The Denver Firefighters Museum offered free admission and asked people to donate something for a needy child. 12/15/09 Senate hopeful, Andrew Romanoff quoted a former president as saying “the best anti-poverty program is a good job” and that’s what more people need right now. 12/17/09 The 500+ page SavvMari Survival Guide provides references for surviving hard times for kids, adults, rich, poor and elderly.

CBS4 AT 5 – 11/14/09 In our poor economy, many families are struggling to put food on the table this year. The fourth annual “Fill the Mayflower”(moving van) campaign was held to benefit military families in need. 12/15/09 Orthodontist, Dr. Kevin Theroux, founded a chapter of the non-profit “Smile for a Lifetime” through which he will award free braces to ten needy students each year. 12/16/09 CBS4’s Care 4 Colorado campaign collects toys for needy kids caught in the recession. 12/22/09 Through the “Sound Beginnings” program, the service club “Quota International” identifies needy children up to age 23 and Siemens Hearing Instruments awards vouchers for free hearing aids.

CBS4 AT 6 & 6:30 – 11/23/09 Volunteers of America loaded up 1,500 Thanksgiving baskets, including 20 pound turkeys, for needy families.

CBS4 AT 10 – 11/14/09 The 14th Annual David Clifton Ministries dinner to feed the homeless and needy families drew so many people, that they were lined up on the streets around Civic Center Park. 11/16/09 Carmello Anthony spent the day helping out needy families, handing out 400 meals through the “Feed the Children” organization.

EDUCATION

CBS4 MORNING – 10/23/09 Many people feel that it is unacceptable that legal residents are paying for the education of illegal residents, when their families are not paying taxes. 10/27/09 President Obama says he guarantees education reform and a good education for our kids. 10/29/09 The Flame of Hope gala is a fundraiser for the American Indian College Fund, which helps Native Americans go to college. 12/17/09 Governor Ritter will meet with the presidents of the state’s public universities, and he is expected to announce a review that will lead to a new long-term plan for higher education.

CBS4 AT NOON – 10/27/09 Governor Ritter told lawmakers that the single largest cut from the state budget will be a \$145 million dollar reduction to higher education. 12/17/09 Governor Ritter has asked two Denver businessmen to chair a new committee to study Colorado’s college system.

CBS4 AT 5 – 10/08/09 State officials honored eight students who had perfect scores on the college entrance ACT Test. 11/07/09 The future of Montbello High School is up in the air. Community leaders for Northeast Denver want Denver Public Schools to close it down and start over. 11/26/09 Concerts for Kids hosts fundraising and community service events throughout the year to support children's health and education programs. 12/14/09 The Jefferson County School District needs to cut \$30 to \$40 million dollars over two years. Proposals include closing 11 middle and elementary schools. 12/17/09 More of Denver's high school students are graduating and going on to college. The graduation rate is now 52%.

CBS4 AT 6 & 6:30 – 11/06/09 Governor Ritter is proposing a \$260 million dollar cut in K-12 education spending. 12/10/09 The Colorado Department of Education plans to implement new standardized tests that could eliminate CSAP, the Colorado Student Assessment Program. 12/15/09 Denver Public Schools has several programs in the works to address the low graduation rate. 12/16/09 Chauncey and Piper Billups have each started foundations targeting at-risk youth.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/03/09 Colorado's Long-Term Fiscal Stability Commission is creating a financial plan for all areas of state funding, from higher education to transportation. 11/05/09 Former students claim that they were deceived about the value of their degrees and the true cost of their education at Westwood College.

HOMELESSNESS

CBS4 MORNING – 12/04/09 One-hundred-fifty people will sleep in boxes, outdoors, to help the homeless. The event will raise money for the Denver Rescue Mission and Denver's Road Home. 12/10/09 Warren Village provides shelter, child care and support for homeless single parents. 12/16/09 Mayor Hickenlooper and the president of the Coalition for the Homeless will host a candlelight vigil to remember the 150 people who died in Denver this year. 12/25/09 The Salvation Army, with more than 200 volunteers, served up their annual holiday dinner at the Colorado Convention Center. 12/25/09 Nearly 1,000 18-25 year-olds spend the night at the Urban Peak Shelter every evening and on Christmas, they received a breakfast feast and presents from Santa.

CBS4 AT 5 – 10/09/09 Hundreds of people from Mile High United Way and Denver's Road Home helped the homeless search for jobs, prepare for interviews and find affordable child care at the family project Homeless Connect. Families make up more than half of Colorado's homeless population. 11/05/09 Homeless veterans can get a hot meal, clothing, a flu shot and even dental screenings and haircuts at the Denver National Guard Armory as part of the Homeless Veterans Stand-Down, supported by the Department of Veterans Affairs, Social Security, and other agencies. The VA says, nationwide, there are about 131,000 homeless veterans out there on any given night. 11/08/09 More than 16,000 Coloradans are homeless. The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless is holding their "Run Home for the Holidays" 5K, to raise money to help families go home for the holidays. 12/04/09 The Denver Rescue Mission held a graduation ceremony for more than 100 men and women, who were all once homeless and have now completed their rehabilitation and transitional living programs. 12/08/09 A viewer, who follows us on Twitter, asked how to get blankets to people who are homeless. Call 211 and the United Way to donate. 12/12/09 As part of a national event, photographers, make-up artists and hair stylists donated their time at the St. Francis Center where they welcomed the homeless and gave them the special treat of having a photo taken with their loved ones.

CBS4 AT 6 & 6:30 – 10/14/09 Denver is shifting funds to avoid cuts to the Library System by using more than \$900,000 dollars from homeless programs and a business development fund. 10/26/09 The PeaceJam Club has been doing donation drives over the past two years for an organization that helps homeless women and children. 11/11/09 The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless is starting a new fund to help get housing for homeless veterans and their families. It's designed to get veterans into homes more quickly than the Department of Veterans Affairs. About three thousand veterans are homeless in Colorado.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/06/09 The mayors of Denver and Philadelphia have made a bet, and homeless families will benefit no matter which team wins. If the Rockies win, the Denver Road Home program will receive two thousand dollars in donations. If the Phillies win, Project Home in Philadelphia will receive the prize. The prize money is being donated by Comcast, First Bank and Citizens Bank. 11/25/09 Governor Ritter was among those dishing up free meals at the Denver Rescue Mission. Five-hundred homeless men, women and children enjoyed the traditional holiday feast and each received a new scarf, hat and gloves. 12/12/09 Students at Colorado Academy spent the day helping homeless children. After months of collecting, they handed out warm clothing, food and presents. 12/13/09 Hundreds of homeless and low income men, women and children dined at the Denver Rescue Mission Christmas Banquet. 12/24/09 A woman walked into the Express Inn, in Colorado Springs, and donated \$640 dollars so that the homeless could get a good night's sleep, shower, and store their belongings. Since the initial donation, several more people have stopped by to donate money to extend the number of nights. A non-profit organization operates out of the motel, providing rooms to the homeless for \$100 dollars a week. 12/25/09 Thousands of homeless and underprivileged people ate at the 14th annual Miracle on 19th Street at the Denver Chop House, one of LoDo's fanciest restaurants.

UNEMPLOYMENT

CBS4 MORNING – 10/05/09 The unemployment rate continues to rise, but some employers can't find enough qualified people to fill jobs in the fields of accounting, health care, software sales, physical therapists and electrical engineers. 10/28/09 The US Senate will look at a bill that would extend unemployment benefits by 14 weeks. Statistics show that unemployment presently runs out for 7,000 people every day. 10/30/09 The newest stimulus report from the White House is expected to show that the \$787 billion dollar financial package saved or created hundreds of thousands of jobs. 11/19/09 The Labor Department has announced that, for the first time, the number of people filing for unemployment did not change last week. 11/30/09 A White House jobs summit will concentrate on new ways to battle rising unemployment. 12/03/09 President Obama is expected to outline his jobs plan in a speech next week. 12/04/09 President Obama will take part in what's being called a "White House to Main Street Tour" which focuses on job creation. 12/04/09 The nationwide unemployment rate fell from 10.2% to 10% last month. Employers cut a total of 11,000 jobs which is the fewest in a year. 12/07/09 Richard Wobbekind, a University of Colorado Economist, says Colorado's unemployment will climb to 8.1% in 2010, before settling down.

CBS4 AT NOON – 11/05/09 The news that fewer workers are seeking unemployment benefits sent stocks higher in early trading. 11/06/09 The nation's unemployment rate has surpassed 10% for the first time since 1983, and it is expected to go higher. 12/04/09 President Obama says the latest job report shows that America is on the right track. 12/18/09 Colorado's unemployment rate is holding steady. The rate for November was 6.9%, down slightly from 7.0% in October.

CBS4 AT 5 – 10/31/09 President Obama says we will likely see further job losses in the coming days. 11/21/09 Thirteen states reported unemployment rates above the national average of 10.2 percent, but unemployment also fell in thirteen states. 11/21/09 In Jefferson County, the unemployment rate has reached a 22-year high and thousands of people are relying on the JEFFCO Action Center for help.

CBS4 AT 6 & 6:30 – 10/28/09 Governor Ritter says the state's 7% unemployment rate is improving and is still 3% below the national average. 11/04/09 The number of people applying for unemployment benefits has dropped, which is a good sign that job losses are slowing as the economy recovers. 11/10/09 Surveys with employers show that job openings are at rock bottom levels. There are six unemployed people competing for every job opening. 11/20/09 Colorado's unemployment rate fell for the third month in a row. 12/03/09 The Denver area has more than 92,000 unemployed workers, and the unemployment rate is 6.8%. 12/08/09 President Obama wants to extend unemployment insurance for those out of work. One idea to pay for it would be to use \$200 billion dollars of unused bail-out money.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/02/09 The nation's unemployment rate hit a 26-year high of 9.8% in September 2009. 10/03/09 Republicans are blaming the President for the rising unemployment rate because they feel that the Economic Stimulus Plan is not working as promised and therefore more tax relief is needed. 10/03/09 President Obama says he is exploring ways to create more jobs and help those who've been laid off. 10/21/09 Colorado's unemployment for September 2009 was 7% which is down 3-tenths of a point from August. 10/31/09 President Obama says that new figures on the gross domestic product show it growing for the first time in a year. 11/23/09 Republican gubernatorial candidate, Scott McInnis, criticized Governor Ritter for Colorado's high unemployment rate. 12/03/09 Unemployment numbers for November 2009 will be released, and it is predicted that the country will have lost another 130,000 jobs. 12/04/09 A slight improvement in the nation's unemployment rate surprised many experts. 12/11/09 A third extension of Federal Unemployment benefits provides an additional 13 weeks. To be eligible, one must have run out of money provided through tiers one and two.
