### HOUSING

CBS4 MORNING – 05/13/10 The number of foreclosure filings dropped in April, which was the first annual decline in five years. Analysts say the news is promising but the crisis is not over yet. 05/18/10 New home construction rose almost 6%, while building permits posted a sharp 11.5% drop. 06/15/10 Bloomberg Businessweek reports that Denver is the most improved housing market in the US, because home prices increased nearly 6% in the first quarter of 2010.

CBS4 AT NOON – 04/23/10 the Commerce Department says that new home sales were up 27% in March, marking the biggest monthly increase in 47 years. Analysts credit better weather and tax credits for homebuyers. 06/23/10 New home sales dropped 33% in May, due to the end of the government tax credit.

CBS4 AT 5 – 05/22/10 The Day of Service provided homeless and at-risk people with free health exams, legal advice, housing assistance and hair cuts. More than 1,000 underprivileged families and children attended.

CBS4 AT 6 & 6:30 – 04/28/10 Governor Bill Ritter announced that four communities in Colorado will be guinea pigs for a Main Street initiative to bring in new business but keep the historic character of the neighborhood. One of them is Denver's Five Points. 05/06/10 Habitat for Humanity is celebrating its 400<sup>th</sup> home built in the Metro Denver area. They have provided high-quality, energy-efficient housing for 1,700 adults and children. 05/14/10 Shaun Donovan, US Secretary of Housing and Urban Development visited Greeley, and talked about the challenges of providing affordable housing when the government is short on money. 05/19/10 Developers broke ground in Aurora for Fitzsimons Village, which will include hotels, offices, shops and housing. 06/18/10 The Colorado Division of Housing reports that foreclosure filings in Colorado's largest counties fell nearly 18% in May 2010 compared to May 2009.

CBS4 AT 10 – 04/15/10 First-time homebuyers have just two more weeks to take advantage of a tax credit. 04/25/10 The first time home buyer tax credit is worth up to \$8,000 and the tax credit for existing homeowners is \$6,500. Real estate agents say these incentives have been a big boost for business this spring.

identify a child found dead in a vacant home in Monument. 06/17/10 Denver police are looking for the vehicle involved in a drive-by shooting where seven people were shot.

CBS4 AT NOON – 06/28/10 Boulder county Sheriff's deputies are looking for a man accused of kidnapping two hikers at gunpoint over the weekend.

CBS4 AT 5 – 04/01/10 FBI investigators have joined the search for a missing 12-year-old Greeley girl. 04/02/10 Members of the Washington Park United Church of Christ held a vigil against gun violence. 04/02/10 A doctor who is accused of stabbing a nurse at Sky Ridge Medical Center was formally charged with attempted second degree murder and assault. 04/05/10 The coroner's office has identified a body that was found in the lake at Washington Park, but hasn't yet determined how he died. 04/11/10 Aurora police are searching for a suspect who shot a customer to death at a liquor store. 04/16/10 A Highlands Ranch man, who had a large-scale medical marijuana growing operation, has pleaded not guilty, and requested a trial. 04/17/10 Wyoming State Troopers arrested a kidnapper after a high speed chase and found three kidnap victims; a Colorado woman and her two children. 04/16/10 Insta-Check, a law aimed at keeping guns from criminals, may expire this summer in Colorado. 04/19/10 A man suspected of stealing at least 30 purses from women across the Denver area has been caught in California. Investigators say he would grab the purses out of cars at gas stations and in parking lots. 04/19/10 A thief grabbed a bag containing a newly purchased I-Pad, ripping the owner's finger off in the process. 05/04/10 An 18-year-old who plotted the murder of her mother is now accused of plotting to strangle a guard and escape the juvenile center where she's being held. Authorities want her moved to an adult facility. 05/06/10 Crooks are using a child as a decoy to commit crimes, distracting store workers with the child's need for a bathroom and then stealing while they're distracted. 05/08/10 A man suspected of stealing one car and then carjacking another last weekend, is in custody. 05/15/10 A homeless man, who was panhandling with just a pair of women's panties on his head, is the first person to be arrested under Boulder's new public nudity law. 05/17/10 Responding to gunfire, police entered Boulder Stove and Flooring and found three people dead. 05/18/10 Boulder police have found that an angry employee was responsible for the deadly shootings at Boulder Stove and Flooring.

They were both found dead in a house in Granby. 04/09/10 A teenager from Jefferson County is accused of killing his sister. He's being held without bond for first degree murder. 04/14/10 Police have arrested four people in a home invasion in Commerce City. Officers found large amounts of marijuana, cocaine, heroin and mushrooms in the house. 04/19/10 The remains of a Colorado man who was missing for six years have been found on a ranch in Kimball County, Nebraska. Police arrested his former roommate who is accused of shooting him and burying his body. 04/21/10 A 21-

year-old from Littleton is facing federal weapons charges after he stole guns from his job and had illegal machine guns in his house. 04/21/10 Lakewood police arrested a man in a liquor store sting. They say he sold liquor to a minor while on probation for the exact same crime. 04/22/10 A woman was arrested in connection with the shooting of an Adams County Sheriff's Deputy. 04/27/10 Aurora police are trying to find the man who tried to kidnap a four-year-old girl from the Aurora Town Center Mall. 04/28/10 Lisa Allen pled guilty to second-degree assault and faces three to six years in jail for putting toxic foxglove leaves in her husband's salad. 05/05/10 A man allegedly smashed his SUV into a police car and then kept driving causing three more accidents. The man, plus six others, was injured. 05/06/10 New York Police say they have video of the Times Square bombing suspect after he left the smoking SUV. He claims he acted alone. 06/21/10 A man is charged with attempted first degree murder and conspiracy after undercover officers met with his alleged accomplice. 06/25/10 People in Eagle County can now text crime fighting tips to authorities, anonymously. 06/29/10 Police are searching for a man who has been trying to lure children into his car.

CBS4 AT 10 – 04/03/10 Police say a man robbed a casino in Central City and was later shot by an officer at a Casino in Blackhawk. 04/02/10 Finding Kaylea Wilson, the missing 12-year-old Greeley girl, is now the FBI's highest priority. 04/08/10 A former producer with the TV show Survivor is a suspect in his wife's murder at a resort in Cancun. 04/10/10 Police are searching for Kirk Richardson, a registered sex offender, who is accused of sexually assaulting a woman in Aurora. 04/14/10 An eight-month-long drug investigation has led to the arrest of a 15-year-old. Undercover officers had bought guns, cocaine and bullet-proof vests from the boy. An 18-year-old Evergreen boy has been charged with first degree murder, sexual assault and robbery, in the death of his sister. 04/16/10 Arapahoe County Sheriff's deputies are trying to identify the dead body of a middle-aged man found in Cherry Creek Reservoir. 04/16/10 The business partner of a missing man has now been charged with his murder. The Douglas County Sheriff's office says that the man, who was convicted on 17 counts of child sex assault, was not in court when the verdict was read, and is now missing. 04/21/10 Police arrested two people when they found 177 pot plants along with cocaine, prescription pills, nitrous oxide and a loaded handgun in their home. 04/21/10 The owners of a Boulder investment firm have been indicted for an alleged ponzi scheme. The district will use the money to turn around nine of its lowest performing schools. 06/29/10 The State Department of Education will start alerting school districts when one of their teachers is arrested. This will bring the agency into compliance with a new state law.

CBS4 AT 6 & 6:30 – 04/02/10 The Labor Department announced that businesses added 162,000 jobs last month, but the unemployment rate remained unchanged at 9.7%. 04/21/10 Governor Ritter announced that \$30-million dollars will be available for companies to buy real estate, purchase equipment, and make renovations and \$10-million dollars is being set aside to help farms and agricultural businesses. Revenue from state bonds is paying for the program which will be administered by the Colorado Housing and Finance Authority. 04/12/10 President Obama has decided to cancel the Constellation Project, which could cost our region 4,000 direct and related jobs. 04/16/10 Colorado's unemployment rate went up in March. 04/19/10 Congressman Perlmutter's office is holding a Job Hunter Boot Camp at the Summit Events Center in Aurora. 04/27/10 Fifty-two-thousand Colorado veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan are looking for employment. 04/27/10 Starting in May, the Labor Department will host a series of job fairs for veterans. 05/06/10 The US Census shows that women in Colorado earn just 80% of what men do in similar jobs. IKEA expects to hire 400 people and postings are expected to be on-line late summer 2010. 05/26/10 CU Hospital says that a \$400-million-dollar expansion will mean more than 1,000 new jobs and better care for patients. 06/01/10 Hewlett Packard is cutting 9,000 jobs over the next few years, but it is still unknown if any of the cuts will be made in Colorado. 06/08/10 The Labor Department reports that the number of jobs advertised in April rose to 3.1-million, which is the most since December 2008. 06/23/10 Democratic gubernatorial candidate, John Hickenlooper, has a plan to jump-start job growth in Colorado by setting up coordinators in every county to work with the state to develop ways to promote small business. 06/24/10 First-time jobless claims fell last week by the largest amount in two months, but economists say the number is still too high to signal any sustained job growth. 06/18/10 The Westminster City Council is considering a budget proposal which calls for cutting 76 jobs, 56 of which are currently open. 06/16/10 A survey by Manpower, Inc., found that 19% of Denver area employers plan to hire in the third quarter.
