



## ISSUES

### **HOUSING and REAL ESTATE**

CBS4 MORNING – 07/15/10 One-million Americans are expected to lose their homes to foreclosure. Nearly 530,000 homes have already been taken over by lenders. 07/20/10 The Commerce Department reports that housing starts fell 5% to the lowest level since October. 07/29/10 The latest reports state that there is no end in sight for the nation's foreclosure crisis. Foreclosures are spreading beyond the areas previously hit and more than one-million Americans are likely to lose their homes. 08/03/10 Countrywide Financial Corporation agreed to pay \$600-million dollars to settle shareholder lawsuits which claim that Countrywide concealed risks as it loosened standards for loans during the housing boom. 09/16/10 Foreclosures rose 25% compared to August 2009, but the number of properties entering into the foreclosure process was down for the 7<sup>th</sup> month in a row.

CBS4 AT NOON – 08/24/10 Home sales have taken the biggest plunge in years. The good news is that Metro Denver is at least 2.5% higher than the national average. 08/31/10 USA Today reports that closing fees, including appraisals, surveys and attorney fees, can add up to more than \$3,700 on a \$200,000 mortgage which is up 40% from last year. 09/01/10 Construction spending in July dropped to its lowest level in 10 years.

CBS4 AT 5 – 07/18/10 Thousands of people attended the 13<sup>th</sup> Annual Blues 'n Barbeque for Better Housing Street Festival in Arvada. 08/14/10 The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless held its 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Back to School Clinic where children living in shelters or receiving housing assistance received everything from shots to hair cuts. 08/24/10 With the biggest housing plunge in years, sellers are getting creative, including lawn service, furniture, and many other inventive ideas into the price of their home.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 07/22/10 The Interactive Help Center explores what it takes to get one of the low interest mortgages. 08/12/10 Counselors at the Colorado AIDS Project first try to get clients into stable housing. They presently provide 140 subsidies plus they own two properties that house about 35 clients. There are still 200 more people waiting for help. 08/13/10 The Interactive HelpCenter takes a look at how low mortgage rates are great for home buyers, but refinancing gets tricky. 08/19/10 As part of HUD's Green Retrofit Program, Boulder Housing Partners will receive \$1.3-million dollars to make green upgrades to a senior housing complex. 08/24/10 Sales of million-dollar homes in the metro area are starting to rise. 08/25/10 Sales of new homes fell to the lowest level on record, last month. 09/21/10 The Division of Housing says foreclosure filings rose 15.5% in August from July, after several months of decline. It is expected that foreclosures will likely continue at the general downward trend in the next few months. 09/29/10 The Government Accounting Office says there are two main types of foreclosure scams; advance fee loan modification and sales-leaseback schemes.

CBS4 AT 10 – 08/12/10 Experts say that so far the low mortgage rates haven't boosted the struggling housing market. 08/19/10 Homeowners need to know that qualifications are tougher to refinance. Credit scores need to be 720 or higher, monthly payments need to be less than 30% of monthly income, and home value must not be less than current mortgage.

## **IMMIGRATION**

CBS4 MORNING – 07/01/10 President Obama will present his plans for a nationwide immigration overhaul. 07/07/10 Arizona Governor Jan Brewer is ready for a showdown with the Obama Administration regarding her state's immigration law. 07/07/10 Officials and community leaders in Arizona held a news conference in support of the Justice Department's lawsuit against their state. 07/07/10 Arizona's law, which is set to take effect on July 29<sup>th</sup>, gives police the power to question the immigration status of anyone they suspect is an illegal immigrant and it would require legal immigrants to carry their immigration documents. 07/15/10 Arizona's controversial immigration law is getting backing from nine states including Alabama, Florida, Nebraska, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Virginia and Michigan. 07/15/10 The first major court hearing addressing Arizona's controversial immigration law began. 07/21/10 Denver City Council considered new immigration rules which would require contractors to verify immigration status of their employees. Some object, saying it would turn city contractors into immigration enforcement police. 07/22/10 The Obama Administration's challenge to Arizona's controversial immigration law went before a federal judge. 07/28/10 A city in eastern Nebraska has suspended a voter-approved ban on hiring and renting to illegal immigrants. 07/28/10 Arizona's controversial immigration law was set to go into effect at midnight. The law would give police broad new authority to arrest people suspected of being illegal immigrants. 07/29/10 Maricopa County Sheriff, Joe Arpaio, says he is going forward with an illegal immigration sweep, in spite of the ruling.

CBS4 AT NOON – 07/06/10 The Justice Department is filing a lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of Arizona's new immigration law. 07/07/10 The Federal Government is asking a judge to block the law from taking effect this month as part of its lawsuit. 07/15/10 A federal judge is set to hear arguments on Arizona's new immigration law. 07/28/10 A federal judge struck down some crucial parts of Arizona's controversial immigration law, just hours before the law was to take effect. The judge removed the section that requires police officers to check a person's immigration status while enforcing other laws. The federal judge's ruling basically reinforces the Obama administration's argument that immigration enforcement is the role of the federal government. 07/29/10 State leaders in Arizona will appeal a federal judge's decision to water-down Arizona's controversial immigration law. 07/29/10 Both sides of the immigration controversy are ready for a long battle which could end up before the Supreme Court.

CBS4 AT 5 – 07/07/10 Several Boulder City Council members said there are problems with Arizona's laws, but they don't support meddling in the affairs of

other states. They are now asking for a more policy-directed resolution. 07/28/10 The federal judge blocked requirements for immigrants to carry their papers at all times and blocked officers from making warrantless arrests of suspected illegal immigrants. The Obama administration asked for the injunction until the courts resolve the issues. 07/19/10 Protests around the country marked the start of Arizona's Immigration Law. 09/02/10 Tom Tancredo, the American Constitution candidate for Colorado Governor, is accusing Mayor John Hickenlooper of running a sanctuary city; a magnet for people who come here illegally.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 07/01/10 President Obama delivered his first major speech on immigration reform saying that Congress needs to get past all the political posturing and special interests to fix a broken system. He wants businesses to be held accountable for hiring illegal immigrants. 07/05/10 Boulder City Council will vote on whether to condemn Arizona for its new immigration law. A yes vote would continue Boulder's ban on non-essential city travel to Arizona. 07/06/10 Arizona's new immigration law has led to protests across the country. 07/12/10 Arizona's new immigration law was a hot topic today at the Biennial of the Americas event in Denver. 07/28/10 Arizona's immigration law took effect at midnight, but without many of the controversial provisions. 10/07/28 Arizona Governor Jan Brewer said "We are going to continue to request that we get heard on this, and that the citizens of Arizona are protected." 07/28/10 Democratic Congressman Jared Polis says "The people of Arizona and our country demand that Congress take action to replace our broken immigration system with one that works." 07/28/10 The Federal Government adopted a single immigration policy for the country a century ago. Before that, each state set its own immigration law. 08/02/10 Dan Maes and Scott McInnis, the two Republican candidates for governor, both support Arizona's Illegal Immigration Law. 08/03/10 The Denver City Council is expected to give final approval to a plan requiring construction contractors to check the immigration status of its employees. 08/06/10 The Colorado Department of Labor does not believe that the disabling of a computer program led to illegal immigrants getting benefits. They say they would welcome an audit to determine if any wrong-doing took place. 08/13/10 Lawmakers agree on bolstering security on the US-Mexican border, but they are far apart on immigration reform. 08/17/10 Eleven members of Colorado's Republican Study Committee are meeting with Arizona Lawmakers to learn about how to get a similar law passed in Colorado. 08/18/10 Arizona lawmakers are convinced that their new immigration law will be upheld by the US Supreme Court.

CBS4 AT 10 – 07/06/10 At least 18 cities around the country are boycotting Arizona because of its immigration law. Twenty-two states are considering similar laws. 07/06/10 The Federal lawsuit denounces Arizona's Immigration Bill as unconstitutional. 07/28/10 The Mexican government has also been strongly opposed to the Arizona law. 07/29/10 Arizona's appeal was filed with the Ninth US Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco. It is unknown when the court will consider their request. 08/13/10 President Obama signed a bill that will spend \$600 million dollars to tighten the US-Mexico border. The Bill won bi-partisan

support, but lawmakers are still far apart on the tougher issue of how to reform the nation's system.

## **ECONOMY**

CBS4 MORNING – 07/02/10 The Labor Department released June's unemployment rate, which dropped to 9.5%. 07/11/10 More than 200,000 kids in Colorado are at risk of going hungry each day. Taste of the Nation Denver is rallying support to help end childhood hunger. 08/06/10 The new unemployment rate for July is 9.5% which is unchanged from June. 08/06/10 Stock futures are falling after the Labor Department said companies lost 131,000 jobs last month. However, many of those were temporary census jobs. 08/16/10 Many school districts are cutting bus programs due to the economy. For the first time about 15,000 students in Douglas County will be charged 50 cents each way to ride the school bus. 08/19/10 A new Associated Press poll shows that 61% of voters think the economy has stayed the same or gotten worse since President Obama took office. 08/27/10 A new CBS news poll shows 34% of those asked think the economy is getting worse, 20% say better, and 44% say its the same. 09/06/10 President Obama says in order to heal our economy, we need more than a healthy stock market, we need bustling main streets and a growing, thriving middle class. 09/06/10 Thanks to the internet and the economy, coupons are more popular. Researchers say companies gave out more than 300-billion of them last year. 09/07/10 The President is expected to unveil a package of tax incentives that would allow businesses to write off all new investments in plants and equipment through 2011. 09/13/10 Republicans argue that raising taxes on the rich would only hurt the economy, but the Obama administration insists it has no choice. 09/14/10 Retailers reported, for August, the best gain in five months, despite a drop in auto sales. Consumer spending is what powers the economy.

CBS4 AT NOON – 07/05/10 The government's \$787 billion dollar stimulus package is expected to hit its peak this summer, creating jobs to improve highways, water projects and to weatherize homes. 08/06/10 Private employers added just 71,000 jobs in July. 09/16/10 Fourteen percent of Americans are living below the poverty level, which is the most since the mid-1960s. 09/16/10 The Census Bureau says that more than 43 million people were living in poverty last year. 09/23/10 President Obama says that the nation's economy is still his priority. 09/03/10 President Obama said the economy is moving in a positive direction and that jobs are being created, just not as fast as they need to be. 09/03/10 The Labor Department says that companies added 67,000 new jobs last month. 09/10/10 President Obama kicked off his 8<sup>th</sup> news conference by naming Austin Goolsbee as the new leader for his Council of Economic Advisers. 09/16/10 With the most Americans living in poverty since the 1960s, the President talked about his plan for the suffering economy.

CBS4 AT 5 – 07/07/10 Labor Secretary Hilda Solis says women are increasingly taking a leading role in small and large businesses, and the number of women entrepreneurs has actually gone up during the recession. 09/12/10 RTD is facing a \$12-million dollar deficit and considering a fare increase.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 07/01/10 The Children’s Hospital expansion will be a boost to Aurora’s economy. 07/02/10 More than 14-million people are unemployed. 07/08/10 Stocks rose after a drop in first-time unemployment claims eased concerns about the economy. 08/05/10 The State of Colorado says that the number of foreclosures is now at the lowest level in more than a year. 08/06/10 President Obama says the seventh straight month of private job creation is a good sign for the economy. 08/10/10 The Federal Reserve will try to stimulate the economy by purchasing government debt, to help stocks recover from big losses. 08/18/10 The latest poll from Associated Press shows that 41% of Americans approve of President Obama’s handling of the economy. That is his lowest approval rating yet, on that issue. 08/31/10 Hundreds of job applicants waited for hours hoping to fill about 100 positions at the Sprint Call Center in Englewood.

CBS4 AT 10 – 07/02/10 President Obama says the economy is headed in the right direction. 08/08/10 Due to the bad economy, many older Americans who are out of work are deciding to retire early. 08/12/10 Anxiety over the struggling economy has sent mortgage rates to their lowest level in decades. 08/18/10 President Obama says it will take a few years to dig out of such a deep recession. 08/19/10 New applications for unemployment benefits hit a nine month high last week. 08/24/10 Some analysts say a dramatic drop in home sales could have a big impact on the economy for months to come. Sales of existing homes last month saw their biggest drop in more than 40 years. 08/27/10 Ben Bernanke described the current economy as vulnerable. He said the Federal Reserve will consider taking more aggressive action to keep the economy from sliding back into a recession. 08/30/10 President Obama’s plan calls for extending tax cuts for the middle class, investing in clean energy and offering tax cuts to businesses that hire in the US. Republicans claim the President’s plan would actually raise taxes on many small businesses 09/04/10 Tom Tancredo trumpeted his conservative credentials by supporting three taxation issues to limit government. 09/06/10 At a Union rally in Milwaukee, the President unveiled a \$50-billion dollar job-creation proposal. It would rebuild 150,000 miles of roads, build and maintain 4,000 miles of railways and re-build 150 miles of airport runways. 09/20/10 Despite the budget problems, the Bureau of Economic Research says the Nation’s recession officially ended last summer. Economists say it was the longest recession since World War II.

## **HEALTH CARE**

CBS4 MORNING – 07/01/10 A new tax on tanning services will be used to help pay for Federal Health Care Reform. 07/01/10 A child is being treated at Children’s Hospital after getting sick from raw goat’s milk. Boulder County health officials say at least 16 others are sick, as well. 07/20/10 United Health Care said its second-quarter profits rose 31% in the second quarter of 2010. 08/04/10 An independent health care ratings organization has new evidence that shows infections acquired in hospitals are the leading cause of preventable death for children. 09/06/10 Health Care Reform requires restaurant chains to post their calorie counts by next year. 09/14/10 The Obama Administration will ask a

Federal judge to dismiss a lawsuit by twenty states that claims the Health Care Reform is unconstitutional. 09/23/10 Changes under the New Health Care Reform mean that preventive care such as mammograms and cholesterol screenings will be covered by health insurance, immunizations for kids will be free and children will be covered until the age of 26 under family health care policies. 09/23/10 Republican party leaders say they will reveal a plan to block tax increases and scale back President Obama's Health Care Reform. 09/26/10 Gubernatorial candidate, Republican Dan Maes, argues that money saved by not fighting illegal marijuana would give the government more money to spend on social services and health care.

CBS4 AT NOON – 07/06/10 Under the "Cover Colorado" program, the state will offer health insurance coverage through 2014 to residents who have been uninsured for six months or longer and have been unable to get coverage because of a pre-existing medical condition. Then, beginning in 2014, under the "Getting Us Covered" program, health insurance companies will be banned from discriminating against adults with certain health problems. 08/03/10 In Missouri, people will vote on a referendum which would block the Health Care Reform Act provision which requires that most people have health insurance. 09/16/10 Two medical associations say that health care professionals should be required to get flu shots. 09/23/10 More changes from the Health Care Reform mean there will be no more lifetime coverage limits, annual limits will start to phase out, insurers cannot cancel coverage because of an illness and they can't deny coverage to kids with pre-existing health conditions.

CBS4 AT 5 – 07/01/10 Congress is considering a plan to help America's children eat better by over-hauling the school lunch program. The idea is to spend \$8-billion dollars on Federal nutrition programs focused on the nation's schools. Part of that money would mean increased Federal funding for lunches which meet nutritional standards. 07/24/10 The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid services kicked off a new campaign at the Children's Hospital in Aurora. It's called "Get Covered, Get in the Game" and helps students get the physical exams required for school sporting events. 07/27/10 The Governor's Mansion turned into a mobile dental clinic for low-income families. Those clinics are part of Kids in Need of Dentistry, a Colorado organization that provides the care. 08/17/10 The higher incidence of diabetes and heart disease raise the risk for Alzheimer's in minority populations. 09/18/10 Democrat Michael Bennet and Republican Ken Buck, who are running for Senate, disagree on the Health Care Reform and Embryonic Stem Cell research. 09/19/10 Former President Jimmy Carter believes that Americans would have had comprehensive health care for decades, if Ted Kennedy hadn't killed his bill.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 07/07/10 One of Jane Norton's senatorial campaign pledges is to try to repeal what she calls Obamacare. 07/27/10 Governor Ritter says that since he took office in 2007, 100,000 children, who didn't have it before, now have health care coverage. 08/02/10 A Federal judge says a challenge to the Health Care Reform law can go forward. He denied the Justice Department's request to dismiss the suit filed by the state of Virginia which says that Congress cannot require citizens to buy health insurance or face

a penalty. 09/20/10 Child Health Plan Plus is a low-cost public health insurance. 09/20/10 Health Care Insurance companies are raising rates, and some are also ending sales of child-only policies. They say they need to raise premiums and drop some policies because of the new Health Care Reform Law and the rising cost of providing services. 09/28/10 Colorado voters are angry with the politicians because they get health care free for life and don't know what it's like to pay for health care out of their pockets.

CBS4 AT 10 – 07/31/10 Jon Caldara with the Independence Institute turned in petitions to the state pushing to get a Constitutional Amendment that would bar the state from requiring residents to buy health insurance. 08/14/10 The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless held a Back-To-School Health Fair where homeless children received glasses and necessary shots to start school. 09/22/10 A new law bans insurance companies from denying coverage to kids with pre-existing conditions, which has prompted some companies to drop child-only policies.

## **DRUGS, VIOLENCE and CRIME**

CBS4 MORNING – 07/06/10 A woman, who is believed to have been under the influence of alcohol or drugs, drove the wrong way on I-25, causing several accidents resulting in one death. 07/09/10 Denver City Councilman, Doug Linkhart, wants to tax medical marijuana 6% and use the money to pay for youth programs. 07/20/10 Hundreds of National Guard troops will begin deployment to the US - Mexico border because of the increasing violence in Mexico involving the flow of weapons, cash and human trafficking. 08/09/10 The former President of Mexico, Vicente Fox, says legalizing drugs may be the solution to breaking the power of the drug cartels. Violence along border areas has increased in recent years because of the drug trade. 08/09/10 The manhunt for escaped prisoners intensified after the bodies of a couple were found in a burned-out camper near Santa Rosa, New Mexico. 08/10/10 El Paso County Police questioned a man accused of shooting a worker at a Tire Shop in Monument. 08/17/10 The Bureau of Justice on School Crime and Safety says that every seven minutes a child is bullied at school. 09/03/10 Investigators now believe an illegal marijuana growing operation in Boulder County may be connected to Mexican drug organizations. They think the real street value of those drugs is between \$9-million and \$12-million dollars. 09/19/10 Boulder detectives are working around the clock searching for suspects in a possible hate crime involving a CU student from Nigeria. 09/23/10 Two overnight attempted liquor store robberies were foiled by armed clerks.

CBS4 AT NOON – 08/02/10 Burglars stole a six-foot statue from a Denver Church. 08/05/10 A woman has been charged in the murder of a 9-year-old girl who was beaten and left to linger for days, before being buried alive in a house in Monument. 09/01/10 The Boulder County Sheriff's Department raided two separate marijuana growing sites near the Town of Raymond, between Allens Park and Lyons. They believe the pot operation has been in the works for years.

CBS4 AT 5 – 07/18/10 One man is dead and two people are in custody after an early morning shooting in Denver. Police also shot and wounded one of the suspects. 07/22/10 Robert Walters killed his girlfriend, Brittney Brashers, and staged her death to look like a traffic accident. 07/24/10 Patients treated at Veterans Hospitals and Clinics will now be able to use medical marijuana in Colorado and 13 other states. 07/31/10 A Denver community is hoping to reduce gang violence through a peace march to unite two infamous gangs; the Crips and the Bloods. 08/08/10 A Douglas County Sheriff's Deputy is recovering after being shot while responding to a call in Franktown. 08/08/10 An aide for a Denver childcare center is now accused of sexually assaulting three girls. 08/13/10 Brighton Police are searching for a young man about a sexual assault on a child. 08/24/10 Wheat Ridge police have increased patrols after a woman was violently attacked outside her home. 08/26/10 Seven people have been cited in the weekend riot in Fort Collins, and police expect more charges to come. 08/27/10 Two people walked out of a 24 Hour Fitness center after breaking into men's gym lockers, and they did it at two different locations in Boulder. Police say they took cash and credit cards that they used at other Boulder stores right after the crime. 09/03/10 The Boulder County Drug Task Force searched a house in Erie and found paraphernalia used for making meth. A man and woman were taken into custody and charges are pending. 09/04/10 The FBI has accused six men of human trafficking in Colorado and 12 other states. Global Horizons Manpower is accused of bringing hundreds of women to the US from Thailand and forcing them to work. Many were taken to labor camps in Hawaii and Washington. The FBI says it is the biggest human trafficking case ever brought before a judge. 09/04/10 Police arrested three people and found 213 marijuana plants and 200 ounces of dried marijuana at a Broomfield home. 09/09/10 Three former police officers in Arvada now face misdemeanor charges after one was accused of punching a man during an arrest. 09/11/10 One man is dead and another in the hospital after a standoff in Aurora. Neighbors say the victims are father and son. 09/25/10 A medical marijuana store was robbed at gunpoint. The two suspects were caught on security cameras but are still on the loose. 09/27/10 Several agencies have teamed up to bust a meth smuggling operation in Colorado.
