Attached are listings of broadcasts or broadcast segments, which, in the station's judgment, reflect the station's most significant programming treatment of ascertained community issues during the period from October 1, 2010 – December 31, 2010.

KCNC broadcasts both locally produced and network programming. Although we include only local programs herein, KCNC also broadcasts several network programs including Face The Nation, 60 Minutes and 48 Hours, which we believe also serve community needs and interests.

CBS4 MORNING - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Duration: Two hours Monday - Friday 5:00 am - 7:00am. One hour Saturday 7:00am - 8:00am. Two hours Sunday 6:00am – 8:00am.

CBS4 AT NOON - Regularly scheduled news broadcast dealing with timely news and other subjects of general interest to viewers in the metropolitan area.

Loan Program finances green energy projects through stimulus money. 12/09/10 Governor Ritter dedicated a solar electric system on the roof of the Rifle Library. It will generate enough power to cover half of the library's energy needs.

12/10/10 The City of Aurora handed out \$7,500-worth of free LED holiday lights which were donated by Wal-Mart. The US Department of Energy says that LED bulbs can last for up to 40 holiday seasons.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/02/10 Canopy Airport Parking is building 4,200 valet, self-park and open air spaces. The parking garage is green, built partly of recycled cars and it also uses geothermal energy, solar panels and wind turbines.

ECONOMY – Joblessness, Unemployment Insurance, Bankruptcy

CBS4 MORNING – 10/03/10 People who are frustrated with the sluggish economy voted Republicans into control of the House of Representatives.

10/05/10 Ben Bernanke, Chairman of the Federal Reserve, warned against raising taxes or slashing spending, because it would hurt the economy too much, in both the short-term and the long-term. 10/05/10 Personal bankruptcies are on the rise as 1.2 million people have filed for bankruptcy since January. The number is expected to rise to 1.6 million by the end of the year. 10/08/10 While analysts predict the economy gained 75,000 jobs in September, unemployment is expected to edge up to 9.7 percent, as more people look for work. The jobs picture is actually far worse than the unemployment rate suggests because more than a million Americans who have stopped looking for work this year are not counted in the jobless report. 10/13/10 A recent survey found that nearly seven out of every ten Americans have an optimistic outlook about their household finances for the next two years. 10/25/10 Some of the nation's leading economists are lowering their expectations about how quickly the economy will rebound. 10/28/10 The Labor Department's weekly jobless claims report says that 21,000 fewer people filed for unemployment benefits. 11/04/10 Twenty-thousand people filed new unemployment claims, which is the second rise in four weeks. 11/05/10 Employers in the US added 151,000 jobs in October, which is the most in five months. However, the unemployment rate remains at 9.6%.

11/08/10 Federal funding for long-term unemployment insurance expires in December. 11/15/10 The Department of Commerce will release the latest report on retail sales, which is a major indication of how much people are spending. It could affect the economy and how retailers will make decisions about sales for the rest of the holiday shopping season. 11/22/10 A rise in gas prices could mean less money available to spend on holiday shopping, which is a big negative for the economy. 11/24/10 The Labor Department's weekly jobless claims are at their lowest level in more than two years. Fewer unemployment claims mean a strong job market, which is one sign of a healthy economy. 11/30/10 President Obama wants a two-year pay freeze for millions of federal employees, in order to get the Federal deficit under control. It could save more than \$5 billion dollars.

12/01/10 Starting today, hundreds of thousands of people lost their unemployment benefits. That number will reach into the millions by the end of the month because Congress failed to pass another extension yesterday.

12/01/10 People who were on the extended unemployment insurance had 99

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 10/12/10 Stocks rose after the Federal Reserve meeting showed that the Central Bank is ready to take steps to stimulate the economy. 10/22/10 The Denver Job Fair was held today. 11/04/10 Stock indexes set new highs for the year after the Fed announced it will buy \$600 billion dollars in government bonds in hopes of driving interest rates even lower. Retailers also reported solid sales gains for October. 11/05/10 The hot hiring sectors are education, retail and healthcare. 11/05/10 Many who go to job fairs have high expectations about what they will be offered once they get there. The reality is that very rarely is a job offer made at a job fair. 11/10/10 Governor Ritter announced that Colorado's unemployment rate is still well below the national average. 11/17/10 Economists say unemployment is likely to remain high in 2011. First-time jobless claims rose by 2,000 last week, but remain near their lowest level in two years. 11/23/10 Colorado added 7,100 jobs in October, but it wasn't enough to lower the state's unemployment rate. 11/29/10 A recent poll showed that nearly 60% of Coloradans feel that jobs and the economy should be the focus of lawmakers. 11/30/10 President Obama and Congressional Republicans say they are willing to work together to get the economy back on track. 11/30/10 The Conference Board announced that Americans' confidence in the economy is at its highest level in five months. The Consumer Confidence Index rose even more than economists expected, but it's still well below the level needed to indicate a healthy economy. 12/01/10 More than 116,000 Colorado businesses will see big increases in their unemployment insurance premiums in 2011, due to the sluggish economy and an outdated system used to determine premiums. 12/07/10 President Obama says that his number one priority is to do what is right for the American people, for jobs and economic growth. He has proposed a compromise with Republicans which extends the Bush-era tax cuts for two years, extends unemployment benefits for 13 months, and lowers payroll taxes for a year. 12/07/10 While unemployment is rising, employers are posting more jobs. 12/17/10 President Obama signed the \$858 billion-dollar tax cut package. 12/24/10 Comfort Dental provided free dental care for the 27th year. On Christmas Eve, 200 dentists and more than 1,000 staff members donated their time to help patients on a first-come-first-served basis, with everything from cleaning to extractions. They had a record turnout last year, and are expecting to help even more people this year due to the tough economy. 12/28/10 According to a new study, consumer confidence is down due to high unemployment and declining home values which lower their confidence in the economy.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/29/10 A debate among the three Colorado Gubernatorial candidates centered on the economy, and how they would handle cutting the state budget. 11/03/10 President Obama says he is willing to compromise with Republicans on extending tax cuts, energy policy and fine-tuning health care reform. 11/03/10 Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke is dismissing concerns that the Fed's latest plan to give the economy a boost could unleash inflation. 11/27/10 Early numbers for Black Friday show that shoppers may still be worried about the economy. 12/10/10 Governor-elect Hickenlooper says it will take time, but he is confident that the economy will get back on track, despite the divided legislature. 12/13/10 Based on a test vote today, the plan to cut everyone's taxes is expected to pass the senate later this week and then move to

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 –10/19/10 Bank of America, one of the nation's largest banks, may face a multi-billion dollar lawsuit over foreclosures. 11/11/10 The Denver Rescue Mission only has 212 turkeys, which were all donated today. They need at least 6,000 turkeys to feed thousands of homeless people over the holidays. 11/24/10 The Denver Rescue Mission served turkey and all the fixings to 500 homeless men, women and children. 11/25/10 The Salvation Army served Thanksgiving dinner to more than a thousand people. Some were homeless, some couldn't afford a meal and some were without family members nearby.

CBS4 AT 10 – 10/27/10 Wells Fargo admits it mishandled the paperwork on tens of thousands of foreclosure cases. It is now promising to fix them. 10/29/10 A group of local experts called the Haven Team, is offering free help to people trying to avoid foreclosure.
