CBS4 MORNING – 01/05/11 Democrats feel that the time spent trying to repeal health care reform takes valuable time away from turning the economy around. 01/07/11 Retail sales in December were weaker than expected, but they were 3.8% higher than last year. 01/07/11 The International Sportsmen's Expo at the Convention Center in downtown Denver is having a positive impact on Denver's economy. 01/07/11 Analysts predict the economy added 145,000 jobs in December and unemployment dipped to 9.7 percent. Private companies alone added nearly 300,000 jobs last month, which is three times more than what had been expected, and the most in nearly a decade. 01/12/11 Governor Hickenlooper has signed executive orders aimed at promoting job growth and protecting the jobs we already have. They include a plan requiring state and local governments to work together to create jobs and the promotion of tourism, which is a huge part of our state economy. 01/14/11 Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke says the economy will grow 3 to 4 percent in 2011, but that is not enough to reduce unemployment. 01/21/11 Good deals and a better economy have bolstered Colorado's ski industry. 01/23/11 The White House released a preview of President Obama's upcoming State of the Union address, which will focus on his long term goals to improve the American economy. 01/24/11 As the economy continues its recovery; more people are passing up restaurants and eating at home. Usually restaurants are the first to rebound after a recession, but this year they are lagging behind retailers and auto sales. 01/24/11 A new survey from the National Association for Business Economics shows that 82% of industry experts expect the economy to grow from 2% to 4% this year. 01/26/11 In his State of the Union speech, President Obama said we need to out-innovate, out-educate, and out-build the rest of the world. He recognized families who are making sacrifices to live within their means every day and said that they deserve a government that will do the same. 01/27/11 More than 19,000 people will attend the world's largest snow sports trade show, the SIA Snow Show, and the event is expected to bring in \$30 million dollars to the local Denver economy. 01/29/11 The Renewable Energy Program at Red Rocks Community College has doubled its courses and students since 2009. Last month Colorado received \$75 million dollars in energy manufacturing funds from the Department of Energy, and students are hoping to get in on the ground floor of the new energy economy. 02/02/11 The Dow opened above 12,000 for the first time in two and a half years. Analysts say it's another sign the economy is extending its recovery. 02/05/11 Egypt's economy has lost more than \$3 billion dollars as a result of the political unrest. 02/07/11 President Obama said that bolstering the economy requires that Washington and business work together. 02/25/11 Governor Hickenlooper will meet with President Obama and 14 other Democratic Governors to discuss how Washington can work with the states to improve the economy and create jobs. 02/28/11 Gas prices have increased 4% in the last week. 02/28/11 Colorado State Senator Rollie Heath, a Democrat from Boulder, has called for a \$1.6 billion dollar tax increase to fund education. 03/09/11 RTD decided to delay putting a Fastracks tax hike on the November ballot, hoping the economy will continue to improve. 03/21/11 Greeley's economy received a boost from the University of Northern Colorado's NCAA tournament followed by the state's 1-A High School Basketball tournament. 03/23/11 A CBS News poll shows that more than 50% of those surveyed said that the economy and jobs are the most important problems facing our country.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/07/11 The national unemployment rate is down to 9.4%, which is the lowest level in more than a year and half. But the country gained fewer jobs than economists were expecting. 01/07/11 President Obama is expected to name Gene Sperling as Director of the National Economic Council where he is expected to have oversight over the administration's economic policies. 01/26/11 Democrats and Republicans are still divided over how to get the economy back on track.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/07/11 The National Western Stock Show is very important to Colorado's economy. It is here for the month of January. 01/09/11 Governor Ritter will next head up CSU's new Policy Center for a New Energy Economy. 01/12/11 Details of the 20 most common job hunting mistakes. 01/19/11 Consignment stores thrived as the economy dipped and now the move toward recycling and going green has the industry booming. 01/22/11 Colorado lawmakers, both Democrats and Republicans, say they are focusing on jobs and the economy. 02/12/11 Experience and qualifications are no longer enough to get a job. Now employers are also looking at how applicants live their personal lives. 03/01/11 Federal Reserve Chairman, Ben Bernanke, told Congress that he believes the rising oil prices will only have a brief impact on the nation's inflation rate. 03/03/11 The number of people requesting unemployment benefits in the US has dropped to its lowest level in three years. 03/15/11 The Federal Reserve announced that the US economy is on firm footing.

Bruce Allen of BG Allen Investments answered questions about the economy, job growth, and investment markets. 01/06/11 The Denver Business Journal reports that Colorado's business leaders are feeling more bullish about the economy. 01/07/11 The unemployment rate fell to its lowest level in one-and-a-half years but not as many jobs were created as analysts had predicted. 01/14/11 Governor Hickenlooper visited Eagle County to learn what the county needs in order to revive its economy. 01/21/11 A new poll says only 35% of Americans believe the economy has improved since President Obama took office. 01/24/11 Governor Hickenlooper met with a group of veterans and active service members at the State Capitol. The governor says they play a major role in Colorado's economy. 01/28/11 Property taxes may have increased even though there is a good chance that houses are worth less because of the economy. 02/14/11 Prices for cotton and some synthetic materials have doubled as the economy recovers. 02/14/11 In this rough economy, many people are taking advantage of the fact that the price of gold has increased more than 50% in the last three years. 02/15/11 Federal funds that have propped up the Colorado state budget are now drying up, and the economy isn't coming back fast enough. 02/16/11 Some state lawmakers are hoping that a new lottery game can help Colorado's economy. A bill at the State Capitol would create a keno game, with money going to create jobs. 02/17/11 Colorado is making efforts to bring more movie production to the state. When a movie crew comes to town it means a lot of money for the local economy. 02/23/11 For each 5 miles per hour you drive over 60 miles per hour, you pay an additional 24 cents per gallon. 02/28/11 Stabilizing oil prices and more signs of a stronger economy are credited with the rise of the stock market.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/13/11 Governor Hickenlooper begins a four day tour of Colorado to talk about creating jobs and boosting the economy. 01/15/11 Governor Hickenlooper says his tour of the state is a development plan from the bottom up. He wants ideas and input from small businesses on how they can improve our economy. 01/20/11 Naturita, Colorado is a dying mining community. Now the start-up of a new uranium mine, Pinon Ridge, and 300 jobs, promises to bolster the economy significantly. 01/25/11 Millions of Americans who are out of work are waiting to hear what the president will say about growing the economy and creating jobs. It was announced that the unemployment rate in Colorado had reached an all-time high of 8.8%. 01/25/11 Wind turbines and solar panels used to be considered futuristic novelties, but now it appears that the “green” industry may be the key to Colorado’s economic future. 02/04/11 January’s jobless rate fell to 9%, but the economy only generated 36,000 jobs which is the fewest in four months. 02/16/11 A recent study suggests that higher credit card rates are a reflection of the struggling economy. However, the credit card industry says that tighter regulations have forced banks to pass costs on to consumers. 03/04/11 Loyolla Catholic School will close after this year because it’s difficult to operate a school with 100 students and 8 teachers in today’s economy. 03/13/11 Colorado Crossroads, a national qualifying tournament for the USA Volleyball Junior National Championships was held in Denver, which created a big boost to the economy. 03/16/11 Hosting the NCAA tournament has brought millions of dollars in to the Denver economy.

HEALTHCARE

CBS4 MORNING – 01/03/11 When the new Congress is sworn in, Republicans are vowing to go after President Obama’s healthcare law as their first order of business. 01/18/11 Republicans are moving ahead with plans to repeal President Obama’s healthcare law. 01/19/11 The Healthcare Law is expected to provide coverage for more than 30 million uninsured Americans. Republicans say that it is expensive and will cost jobs. Democrats say that repealing the bill would leave millions of Americans with pre-existing conditions, without coverage. 01/20/11 At the U.S. Capitol, lawmakers will work on a replacement for the Healthcare Law. Today, the house will vote again, this time to move forward with committees that will work out the Republican vision for healthcare. They want to roll back cuts to Medicare and do away with the requirement that Americans carry health insurance. No matter what happens in the House, the issue is expected to die in the Senate. 01/26/11 Life expectancy in the U.S. lags behind many other countries despite the fact that Americans spend more on healthcare than anywhere in the world. Researchers blame Americans’ long history of smoking and eating fatty foods. 02/02/11 The Republican-led House of Representatives voted to repeal the Healthcare Reform Law. The Democrat-led Senate will stop the repeal and the law will likely end up before the Supreme Court.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/13/11 Governor Hickenlooper’s State of the State agenda focused on healthcare, water, and efficiency. 01/26/11 Employers of all sizes are expressing concern that the mandates and regulations of the Healthcare Reform Law will deter them from hiring new employees and threaten their ability to retain existing workers. 02/18/11 Wisconsin Republican Governor, Scott Walker, is taking direct aim at the state’s unions. His bill would require most public employees to contribute more to their pension and healthcare, and would end collective bargaining rights. 03/22/11 The new Federal Healthcare Law helped pay for the nation’s first full facial transplant. The recipient was 25 and uninsured but is now able to be covered under his father’s plan.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/09/11 - Homeland Security put out a bulletin offering security tips after the Healthcare Reform Bill was passed. Some lawmakers who supported this bill, mainly Democrats, found themselves in the middle of heated demonstrations, and vandalism. They experienced violent threats, shattered office windows and one lawmaker came home to find a cut gas line. 01/16/11 Congress's debate over health care was sidelined for a week as lawmakers honored the victims and survivors of the shooting in Arizona. Now the work resumes with healthcare and the economy once again taking priority. 03/01/11 The House Republicans, at the Capitol, introduced a bill which would allow Colorado to "opt out" of the Federal Healthcare Reform Act. Under the bill, Colorado would join an interstate compact which would give the states the power to regulate healthcare without worry about Federal mandates.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 01/28/11 Colorado State Representative Jeanne Labuda has introduced a bill to stop drug addicted healthcare workers from hopping from job to job. It would allow a hospital or nursing home to disclose if an employee has a drug problem or violent tendencies when they apply for another job. 01/19/11 House Republicans have passed a bill repealing the Healthcare Reform Law. The law was largely symbolic because the Democrats control the Senate and the repeal has no chance of becoming law.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/18/11 Representative Mike Coffman, from Colorado, says that in this session of Congress we will see a negotiation between the House of Representatives and the White House about what changes can be made to the Healthcare proposal so that it works for all Americans. 01/19/11 In the coming months, Congressional committees will consider changes to the Healthcare Reform Law. 01/31/11 A federal judge in Florida struck down the overhaul plan saying that the government is exceeding its authority by forcing Americans to either buy health insurance or pay a penalty. 02/02/11 Senate Democrats put a stop to the Republicans' plan to repeal the one year old Healthcare Law. The 51-47 vote against repeal was expected, and right along party lines. 02/19/11 The new House of Representatives' bill would eliminate money to carry out some parts of the new Healthcare Law. It also would get rid of most environmental funding and stop federal funding for Planned Parenthood.

HOUSING

CBS4 MORNING – 01/02/11 In 2008 Tom Steyer and his wife, Kat Taylor launched a community bank called One California, to provide loans for affordable housing and small businesses in low income neighborhoods. 02/06/11 Denver's Road Home will host its 6th Annual PJ Day, a fun event designed to raise awareness about homelessness in Denver. The event has raised nearly \$2 million dollars over the past few years, to create affordable housing for the homeless.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/20/11 2010 was the weakest year since 1997 for home sales in Colorado. 02/22/11 Home prices in major U.S. cities are now at their lowest levels since the housing bubble burst. The only market to gain was Washington, DC. 02/24/11 New home sales dropped 12.6% in January.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/05/11 The "Shuffle Inn Bar" which has been closed for several years, was demolished to make way for construction on an affordable housing development. The Colorado Coalition for the Homeless is one of the driving forces behind the project. 01/12/11 More than a million people are still without permanent housing after the earthquake which hit Haiti one year ago. 02/26/11 Governor Hickenlooper is in Washington meeting with Interior Secretary Ken Salazar, the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development and the Transportation Secretary.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 01/12/11 TSC Global is a Colorado company helping those displaced in Haiti. Partnered with Vermeer Corporation, they will teach and build shelters which are nearly indestructible. Government and private grants are helping to pay for the housing. 02/11/11 The State Division of Housing says new foreclosure filings fell last year by 8%, but the number of foreclosed homes sold at auction jumped 17% due to the high number of foreclosures that started in 2009. 02/23/11 Denver's Road Home program has achieved a major landmark. The city has finished its first housing project for chronically homeless people. It's a 36 unit building called the Fourth Quarter. Twenty-five of the units are set aside for homeless veterans. 03/28/11 More people signed contracts to buy homes in February, but analysts say the 2.1% increase is not enough to signal a rebound. 03/03/11 Representative Cory Gardner is introducing legislation that would force congressional committees to hold hearings on any redundant program under their jurisdiction. Presently there are 20 programs to deal with homelessness, 82 to improve teacher quality, 47 on job training, and 80 to help the poor secure transportation.

CBS4 AT 10 – 02/11/11 Reforming the mortgage market by winding down Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac means that the housing industry is headed for a change. Potential buyers could see the 30 year fixed rate go away.

CRIME

CBS4 MORNING – 01/23/11 Police responded to a report of shots fired at 26th and Welton where they found a man shot in the torso. He was pronounced dead at the hospital. 01/27/11 Police say a woman killed in a home invasion was picked at random. Two women entered Susan Wiggs' home near 9th and Sheridan, shot and killed her. 01/27/11 Lawmakers in New Mexico are considering making a drug free status a condition of collecting unemployment benefits. This proposal would make residents take a drug test to qualify for benefits. Sixteen states are currently considering drug testing to receive public assistance. 02/13/11 Sheriff's deputies found a 27-year-old woman who had been stabbed four times. Her sister and boyfriend were arrested for assault. 02/24/11 Police in Colorado Springs are talking to the owner of an SUV who dragged a tow truck driver to his death. They're trying to figure out if it was an accident or a crime. 03/03/11 Charles and Marilyn Long were killed in their home and their two youngest children were critically injured. Their 12-year-old son is in police custody. 03/17/11 Claims of diplomatic immunity weren't enough to free CIA contractor Raymond Davis. He was finally released from a Pakistani prison after a \$2.3 million dollar payment to the families of the men who died. Davis said they were robbers, and had shot them. 03/29/11 Police in Commerce City are searching for suspects after an 18-year-old man was gunned down on the sidewalk.

CBS4 AT NOON – 01/20/11 Lawmakers at the State Capitol are discussing a bill that would make it a homicide whenever an unborn baby is killed as the result of a crime. 01/24/11 The search is on for the driver of an SUV who hit and killed a valet outside a downtown Denver nightclub. 01/24/11 Courtney Bowles, a 31-year-old former teacher, is on administrative leave, facing three felony charges including sexual assault on a child by a person in a position of trust after police found her in a car with an underage boy. 01/27/11 A suspect is on the run after police say he sexually assaulted a jogger around 5:30pm in Cheesman Park. Police have posted crime alerts around the park looking for information, warning joggers, and offering a \$2,000 reward.

CBS4 AT 5 – 01/21/11 DNA evidence helped solve three cold case sexual assaults and put a violent serial rapist behind bars. 01/21/11 Denver police officers are teaming up with taxi drivers to get tough on crime. They announced the “Taxis on Patrol” program. 01/21/11 The FBI is in search of Ann Pettway, the woman who raised Carlina White who was taken from a hospital as a baby in 1987. White has been reunited with her true family. 01/24/11 Fifty-one year old Michelle Whitmire, who manages the cafeteria at Jefferson High School in Edgewater, was arrested for giving marijuana to her teenage daughter and her friends and other children from elementary age to high school. She is charged with possessing and distributing marijuana, and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. 01/27/11 Four people are in custody, including the suspected driver of the vehicle which hit and killed Jose Medina while he was working as a valet outside a nightclub. All four were in the country illegally, and the driver of the vehicle, Norma Vera Nolasko was the last to be arrested as she boarded a plane to Mexico. 01/27/11 Twenty year old Roohallah Mobarez is being held on \$75,000 bond facing five counts of sexual assault on a child. Four separate victims, all under age 12, have been identified and Douglas County Sheriff’s Deputies are worried there may be more. 01/29/11 Aurora police are searching for the person who shot and killed a man outside the Sports Station Bar and Grill in the 800 block of North Dayton. 01/29/11 Denver Police were out in full force catching speeders on I-25 near 48th Avenue. They’re using a \$93,000 grant from the Department of Transportation for speed enforcement. In just seven hours officers stopped hundreds of drivers going well over the limit. 01/29/11 CU student Sid Wells was shot and killed in 1983. His roommate, Thayne Smika has been the prime suspect all along, but an arrest warrant was only issued recently. Police have released new images of how Smika might look now. He disappeared from the Boulder area in 1986. 02/02/11 A cab driver who followed a hit and run driver is being called a hero and honored by the Denver police and the victim’s family. 02/05/11 A mother from Thornton is being investigated for possible child abuse and neglect after her two children, aged 2 and 4, wandered around an apartment complex unattended, for hours. 02/06/11 Aurora police are investigating the suspicious death of a 21-year-old mother. Her 8-month-old baby was found, unharmed, in the same apartment where her body was found. 02/07/11 A man with a gun went into a high-end clothing store. The clerk ran out, and shortly thereafter, the man shot and killed himself. 02/13/11 Northglenn police are conducting what they call a “sweetheart sweep”, where police officers pose as flower and balloon delivery people, and instead, arrest those with outstanding warrants. 02/14/11 The Colorado Bureau of Investigation, FBI and local police arrested Marc Patrick O’Leary. He is being held on a \$5 million dollar bond for sex assault, kidnapping and burglary. 03/01/11 Denver police have arrested a 17-year-old boy in the rape of a 14-year-old girl at Kennedy High School. He faces charges of kidnapping and sexual assault. 03/01/11 Four men have been arrested in the murder of a man and woman in Douglas County. One of them is the estranged husband of the woman. They are being held without bond. 03/10/11 Twenty-seven-year-old Officer Jay Sheridan was a six-year veteran of the Limon Police Department. He was shot and killed in the line of duty trying to serve an arrest warrant. Governor Hickenlooper ordered flags to be lowered to half-staff on all public buildings in the state, and an Honor Flag was flown in to preside at the funeral of the fallen hero.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 01/20/11 More than 100 suspected mobsters were arrested in several states. The massive operation involved multiple agencies and targeted the country's most notorious crime families which are all part of the network known as La Cosa Nostra. 01/21/11 Michael Sanchez is charged with child abuse for leaving his toddler daughter in a van for at least two hours as temperatures hovered in the teens. 01/21/11 Diana Lewis is charged with embezzling \$160,000 from a group she worked for as bookkeeper. The group helps school children in Boulder County. 01/27/11 Twenty-one year old William Lawlor, a soldier stationed at Fort Carson, is accused of impersonating a police officer and sexual assault in Castle Rock last year. 01/27/11 Police are increasing patrols near Denver's Cheesman Park after another jogger was sexually assaulted. This is the second such attack since December. 01/28/11 Jason Stanley faces charges of unlawful cultivation of marijuana and intent to distribute after a dozen armed SWAT team members entered his house and found an intricate grow house in a quiet residential neighborhood. 01/28/11 Denver police are searching for a man who stole the prescription drug oxycontin from a Walgreens store. More and more pharmacies across the country say they've been targeted by thieves trying to get oxycontin. 02/04/11 Crime scene investigators from all across Colorado attended a week-long class taught by Dan Christman. He is an expert at interpreting bloodstain patterns. 02/05/11 Some CU students are disappointed that the city is planning to remove five emergency phones from the University Hill area. The city made the decision because of the growing use of cell phones. 02/15/11 Two 18-year-olds will go to trial for getting a 9-year-old boy drunk on vodka. They will be charged with child abuse and contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

CBS4 AT 10 – 01/18/11 The CBI's statewide identity theft hotline connects to crime victim specialists who then convey the case information to a CBI victim's advocate in the fraud unit. 01/25/11 The State Attorney General's office says they have arrested two of the three alleged ringleaders of the Loya Family drug trafficking operation, which brought 24 kilograms of cocaine from Mexico, through New Mexico and into the Denver area during the past year. Seven other suspects in the trafficking operation are being held at the Adams County jail. 01/26/11 The Cherry Creek School District and Aurora Police are investigating assault allegations against a substitute teacher. 02/15/11 A fingerprint program named "Secure Communities" is designed to identify illegal immigrants. It is now up and running in three Colorado counties. Anyone booked on a warrant or probable cause for a crime is fingerprinted. The prints are then entered into a federal database that checks the person's immigration status. 02/24/11 Lafayette police found the body of Rita Redford at the home she shared with her son. Court documents indicate that her son told officers his mother came down the stairs shooting at him, and he stomped on her head. An official cause of death has not been released. 02/03/11 Three waiters stole the credit card numbers of 200 customers using a credit card skimmer. The skimmers are easy to buy and legal to own, but not legal to use for identity theft. 03/09/11 In January, deputies in Colorado Springs took a report of a missing child named Austin Bryant. After investigating, they determined that Austin had disappeared sometime between 2003 and 2005. They also determined that his older brother Edward went missing as early as 2001. 03/19/11 Marcus Austin Pierce, of Centennial, is accused of exposing himself at Medema, Cherry Knolls and Little Dry Creek Parks and also on the track at Newton Middle School. Pierce is a college student, and the incidents happened when he was home on breaks.
