HOUSING

CBS4 MORNING – 04/10/11 Rocky Mountain Communities works to provide affordable housing for low income families. 04/11/11 Homeless people in Boulder have appeals pending on camping tickets. They have been charged with camping in public places. The latest was arrested for sleeping in a parking garage without permission. 06/26/11 More and more school students are living in poverty.

CBS4 AT NOON – 06/14/11 In May, foreclosures were down 24% compared to a year ago. Foreclosures have dropped for the last six months. 06/27/11 President Obama met the Rapids to congratulate them on their First Cup and to acknowledge their work off the field including feeding the homeless with food leftover from stadium concessions.

CBS4 AT 5 – 05/24/11 The Deacon's Closet, in Boulder, collects and distributes coats to the needy and homeless. 06/15/11 The Women's Bean Project helps Coloradans who are living in poverty. Their programs help women develop job and life skills. Many of them were addicted to drugs, homeless, and even spent time in prison but they have the desire to improve their lives. 06/15/11 Buying a home right now is riskier than it was before the housing bust so some people, who could afford to buy a home, choose to rent. The interactive Help Center shows an easy to use calculator that will illustrate how much money you can save renting versus buying and vice versa. 06/22/11 In June 4,187 people filed for foreclosure. That's roughly one in every 500 homes. 06/30/11 Twenty-eight formerly homeless veterans and their families now have homes. They just moved into the Fourth Quarter apartments, a complex that is the first VA funded program in the country as part of President and Mrs. Obama's plan to find homes for 160,000 homeless veterans over the next five years. 06/22/11 The Emergency Homeowner Loan Program has a billion dollars available to help qualified people all across the nation.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 04/11/11 State representatives honored 64 Girl Scouts with the Gold Award. It's the highest honor in the Girl Scouts and was awarded for helping their community by helping the homeless. 04/19/11 New home construction jumped more than seven percent in March, to its highest level in six months, but economists say that housing starts are still only about half of what they consider to be a healthy figure. 04/20/11 Purchases by first-time homebuyers fell, which is a troubling sign for the weak housing market. 04/21/11 Viewers took advantage of CBS4's interactive Help Center with The Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) answering questions to help get Americans into houses.

EMPLOYMENT

CBS4 MORNING – 04/13/11 President Obama's new initiative, "Joining Forces", is aimed at providing support and honor to America's military and families. The initiative aims to make sure military families have the support they've earned, focusing on employment, education, and wellness. 04/18/11 A survey from the National Association for Business Economics says the outlook for employment rose slightly, and no firms are reporting big layoffs. 05/06/11 The Labor Department is reporting that employers added more than 240,000 jobs last month. 06/03/11 Andrew Hudson's "Jobs List" website posts jobs from all over the state. He has seen a 30 to 35 percent increase in the number of jobs posted. 05/12/11 The woman in charge of delivering unemployment

benefits says the system is overwhelmed. 05/15/11 Many companies are hiring for Tech positions, including Facebook.

CBS4 AT NOON – 04/04/11 Colorado's Western Slope is dealing with a near record jobless rate. Grand Junction's unemployment rate has tripled in the past two years to over 11% and Mesa County's average wage is \$36,000, which is \$9,000 less than Colorado's average. 04/12/11 Between 75 and 100 job openings are coming to Littleton as the Tavern Bar and Grill is opening another location. 04/13/11 The Labor Department reports that employers posted 3.1 million jobs, which is the most since the height of the financial crisis in 2008. 04/19/11 Across the country and here in Colorado, a hiring frenzy is underway at McDonalds. 04/19/11 Colorado's unemployment rate is higher than the national average, at nine percent. 04/26/11 There are hundreds of jobs available at Ikea, which will be opening soon in Centennial. 04/29/11 A new survey by CareerBuilder.com shows that 46% of employers plan to hire recent graduates this year and some plan to offer higher salaries. Most of the jobs available are in IT, Customer Service, Sales, Finance, Accounting, and Marketing. 05/10/11 General Motors just announced they will be hiring 4,200 employees over an eight state area. 06/03/11 Fifty-four-thousand jobs were added in May, which is much less than the previous three months' average of 220,000 new jobs per month. 06/17/11 The Colorado Department of Labor and Employment reports that the unemployment rate dropped one-tenth of a percentage point to 8.7 percent. The national unemployment rate increased from 9 to 9.1 percent. 06/29/11 President Obama held a news conference and said that there are more steps we could be taking right now that would help create jobs.

CBS4 AT 4 – 06/28/11 Consumer confidence, which is seen as a key measure of the economy, was down as more people worried about jobs.

CBS4 AT 5 – 04/04/11 McDonald's and its franchisees are looking for 50,000 new workers nationwide which means 1,000 in the Denver Metro area. 05/06/11 Economists say the latest employment figures suggest businesses are gaining confidence, creating 244,000 jobs in April. At jobing.com, the mission is to connect local employers with employees. The sectors with the most jobs are education, banking, credit unions, and healthcare. 05/24/11 The riskiest fields in terms of job security are psychology majors and nuclear engineers.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 04/07/11 NASA has plans for converting the former Hewlet Packard campus, in Loveland, into a property of 100 aerospace and clean energy companies generating 10,000 high paying jobs across the state. 04/07/11 The Interactive Help Center reviews job search tax deductions. 04/13/11 The FAA is adding 27 more air traffic controllers to work the nightshift after a lone worker fell asleep at Reagan National Airport in Washington, DC and didn't respond when two planes were trying to land. 04/29/11 The National Association of Colleges and Employers reports that employers plan to hire almost 20% more college graduates this year. 05/19/11 – The Labor Department says the number of people filing for first-time unemployment benefits dropped by 29,000 last week. 05/23/11 Unemployed veterans learned to tailor their resumes for a special job fair at a three-day expo for former military personnel. 06/03/11 The President says the economy is still moving in the right direction after adding two-million jobs in the last 15 months.

CBS4 AT 10 – 04/01/11 The unemployment rate has fallen to a two-year low, and companies are hiring at the fastest pace since before the recession began. 04/02/11 House Speaker, John Boehner, today called for removing regulatory obstacles to job growth, and ending the threat of tax hikes. 04/02/11 More than six-million people have been looking for work for six months or longer. 05/11/11 The longest wait time when calling the Unemployment Department is just under three hours. 05/20/11 Many people over 50 who are looking for a job have found it is very different than they remember. Using networking instead of newspaper ads plus reducing resumes to one page with only the latest accomplishments are just two of the many suggestions offered in Good Question. 06/02/11 May's employment numbers are expected to show that job growth is slowing again. 06/14/11 Lockheed Martin plans to cut eight percent of its work force from areas where Lockheed is ending contracts, including here in Colorado.

HEALTH CARE

CBS4 MORNING – 04/08/11 A government report shows that minority populations tend to be in poorer health and get poorer health care. Suggestions include improving dental care for poor children and providing more resources for Spanish speaking patients. 04/13/11 President Obama's speech focused on four key areas: keeping domestic spending low, cutting the defense budget, reducing health care spending including changes to Medicare and Medicaid, and reforming the tax code. 04/15/11 The Republicans have submitted a plan, which would cut billions from next year's federal budget, to a House vote. It's a plan to reshape government's role in health care for the elderly and the poor. GOP leaders say the plan will save more than five-trillion dollars over the next ten years. It would transform Medicare from a program in which government directly pays bills, to a voucher system. 05/10/11 President Obama's Health Care Overhaul is set for its first debate in Federal Appeals Court. A three-judge panel will hear the cases in Virginia.

CBS4 AT 5 – 04/10/11 Republicans in the House of Representatives want to repeal the President's health care law and cut spending by six-trillion dollars over the next decade.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 04/14/11 Colorado's House of Representatives has given its final approval to an \$18-billion dollar state budget that includes cuts to health care services. 04/25/11 The Supreme Court refused to take the case, which challenges health care reform, out of the appeals court process. 06/01/11 Governor Hickenlooper signed the bill into law, creating Colorado's Health Insurance Exchange, which is required under the Federal Health Care Reform Plan. 06/23/11 The Mountain States Employers Council says that health coverage costs have risen an average of ten percent this year and the average premium paid by single employees jumped 11.5% to about \$91 a month. The study also found that 19% of Colorado companies still pay all the costs of employee health coverage. 06/29/11 A Federal Appeals Court is upholding President Obama's Health Care Overhaul. The three-judge panel backed a lower court ruling from Michigan that said Congress does have the authority to require Americans to have insurance.

CBS4 AT 10 – 04/05/11 The bankruptcy of RHPI, a Colorado health care company, has left thousands of people with large medical bills they can't pay. Its founder, Gerry Rising, has been indicted on charges of theft, money laundering, and fraud. 05/13/11 An audit for the City of Denver is in its final stage. Investigators have been checking on who is listed as dependents of city workers and have been getting city medical, dental and vision benefits when they shouldn't have.

CRIME

CBS4 MORNING – 04/08/11 Investigators are returning to an Aurora Open Space where a body was discovered late yesterday afternoon. Officers guarded the crime scene and are calling the death “suspicious”. 04/11/11 The MADD Candlelight Vigil is an annual event designed to give victims’ families a forum for their grief, and to shine a light on a preventable crime. 04/11/11 Sixteen-year-old Greg Smith, who is accused of killing his great grandparents in Hugo, will be charged as an adult. He’s being held without bail at a youth detention center in Englewood. 04/14/11 A woman who was kidnapped from Cherry Creek Mall told police that a man approached her, robbed her, and put her in the trunk. She was able to escape using the emergency trunk release. 04/15/11 John French has been arrested for shooting and killing his eight-year-old daughter. Investigators say he shot himself after he killed the little girl. 04/15/11 The man who kidnapped a woman from Cherry Creek Mall is in jail, arrested by a Jefferson County Deputy 12 hours later. 05/26/11 Bryan David Mitchell, the man who kidnapped Elizabeth Smart nine years ago, has been sentenced to two life sentences. 05/26/11 The Federal Drug Enforcement Administration says it did not notify Aspen authorities of a major drug bust because it doesn’t trust them. Federal authorities, with help from other local police departments, arrested ten suspects that included six from Aspen and four from Los Angeles. 06/06/11 Burlington police found the bodies of Charles and Marilyn Long in their home in March. Their 12-year-old son’s two younger siblings were injured, and he is scheduled for a preliminary hearing where a judge will decide if he will be charged as an adult. He is facing nine charges, including two counts of first degree murder. 06/28/11 There are now formal charges against the man wanted for the kidnapping of an eight year old girl in Denver. The Denver DA’s office charged Bret Thompson with second degree kidnapping and sexual assault on a child. 06/29/11 After 24 years, Timothy Masters is now clear of any connection to the murder of Peggy Hettrick. Colorado Attorney General John Suthers officially exonerated Masters citing results of a grand jury investigation.

CBS4 AT NOON – 04/06/11 A man who had been arrested in the death of a University of New Hampshire football player last month will not face the death penalty. 04/14/11 A mother and her boyfriend are under arrest for the death of their three-year-old son. 05/09/11 Benjamin Janicki, a former daycare worker, pleaded guilty to sexually assaulting children, and will serve 20-40 years in prison.

CBS4 AT 5 – 04/01/11 Two teenage boys found a body near Ruby Hill Park. 04/01/11 A couple who were selling marijuana from their apartment were involved in the deadly shooting of two male intruders. 04/04/11 A woman was found dead in her office, and police are looking for her husband. 04/05/11 A man fired over 100 bullets from a duplex in Edgewater during a period of 30 minutes. Police and SWAT responded and amazingly, no one was hurt. 04/07/11 A standoff in Wheat Ridge that put a school on lockdown and evacuated several homes ended tragically as police found two people dead inside. 04/11/11 Marc O’Leary faces 28 charges in three cases in Jefferson County where a judge refused to lower his five-million dollar cash bond, calling him a tremendous danger to the community. 04/11/11 Detectives in Pueblo call the death of an eight-year-old girl, suspicious, but they aren’t saying how she died. The girl’s father is in the hospital with a gunshot wound. 04/17/11 Police were called when a man found a pipe bomb in his back yard. Nearby homes were evacuated and a bomb squad detonated the device. 04/18/11 Almost two months after a double murder in Douglas County, two more suspects face charges in the case. That means six people total face charges in the murders of 39-year-old Amara Wells and her brother-in-law Robert Rafferty. 04/25/11 Six people have been arrested in a burglary ring that targeted homes

across the Denver area. Detectives say the group is linked to at least 42 robberies within the last nine months, and they've recovered 2,000 pieces of stolen property. 05/19/11 Prosecutors say that Ann Crall lied about having cancer to make extra money to pay for a prescription drug habit. A judge ordered her to serve 90 days in jail with ten years of probation. She was also ordered to remain in a substance abuse program.

CBS4 AT 6 and CBS4 AT 6:30 – 04/04/11 Hackers targeted customers of major retailers and sent phishing emails using specific names and corresponding email addresses. Companies such as Best Buy, Walgreens, U-S Bank, Citi and Chase banks are telling customers about the breach. Beware of giving out your passwords, social security numbers, or other sensitive data. 04/07/11 Denver police are increasingly worried for the safety of 19 year-old Kenia Monge. She was out with friends at the bars on Market Street late Friday night and disappeared Saturday morning. 04/11/11 Denver Police are hoping someone can help them find the driver in a hit and run during the morning's rush hour. A pedestrian was hit, and now has serious head injuries. 04/15/11 Paul James Kerr, the lead teacher at a KinderCare in Littleton, is accused of sexually assaulting a child at the daycare. 04/15/11 Investigators say that William Lornes, the suspect in a kidnapping and carjacking at Cherry Creek Mall, killed a 73-year-old man the same day. 05/16/11 Police are asking for help from the public to find the hit and run driver who killed a man who was riding his bike to work. 05/26/11 Boulder police have arrested a suspect in the attempted abduction of three boys earlier this week.

CBS4 AT 10 – 04/04/11 Streets around Boulder Hospital were closed as a Swat Team negotiated with an armed man. Eventually he surrendered without incident. 04/05/11 A man accused of smashing into several vehicles during a crime spree across northern Colorado is now in custody. 04/06/11 Ten-thousand dollars' worth of jewelry was stolen from a store in Castle Rock. 04/08/11 Twenty-six year-old Wesley Specht, a girls' basketball coach at Alameda High School, has been arrested for sexually assaulting a student. Now a second student has come forth. 05/19/11 The "Ho Hum Bandit", Adam Lynch, was arrested by Denver Police after being turned in by his girlfriend. She says she had no clue that the man she loved was a serial bank robber. He will go on trial for robberies in California, Washington State, Wyoming, and Colorado. 05/31/11 The FBI says that gangs may be responsible for a growing number of bank robberies in Colorado.
