ENVIRONMENT

- Wayne Vandre, horticulturist, demonstrated germination of seeds-soil, depth of planting, moist covering and heat.

Week of April 7-11, 2003

- Wayne Vandre, horticulturist, discussed roof moss. Many homeowners learned they had moss after the major windstorm required roof repairs. Moss can destroy a roof and he gave instructions on removal.

- Wayne Vandre, horticulturist, discussed the prognosis of lawns in the local area because of the lack of snow coverage this past winter. Warming and freezing can cause major damages to lawns and will need reseeding.
