About 90 percent of the energy used to clean your laundry goes towards heating your water. Don't be afraid to put it on cold-water setting and switch to a cold-water detergent. Your microwave oven is another spot you can save money simply by using it more. A conventional oven uses as much as five times more energy than a microwave oven. And lastly when you are not using your computer, put it in sleep mode. It will use 80 percent less electricity. Click on control panels and look for the power settings option. All these tips are in Shop Smart, a new Consumer Reports magazine.
