PRIMETIME: WHAT WOULD YOU DO?

Using hidden cameras, "What Would You Do?" establishes everyday scenarios and then captures people's reactions. Whether people are compelled to act or mind their own business, John Quiñones reports on their split-second and often surprising decision-making process.

Friday, July 1, 2011

- **Teen Dating Violence:** One of the first "WWYD?" scenarios involved a man berating his girlfriend, on the verge of physical violence. Now, five years later, the show returns to the same park to see how people react to a teen dating violence scenario. This time the young boyfriend will be emotionally abusive to his girlfriend and the fight will escalate to the threat of physical harm. One twist will involve changing the couple's attire from conservative/preppy clothes to something edgier.
- **Fake Slip and Fall:** It is a multi-billion dollar scam -- a customer in a store slips and falls, then threatens to sue the store for damages. What happens when our perpetrator tries to pull this scam in front of eyewitnesses who know that no accident occurred in the first place? How will people react if the person appears to be struggling in a tough economy?
- **The Junk Food Police:** While at a grocery store, an overweight mother and her daughter push a shopping cart filled with groceries with no nutritional value. What will bystanders do when they witness another shopper approach the mom and daughter and criticize them for their choice of food?

Friday, July 8, 2011

- **Date Rape Drug:** A past "WWYD?" scenario showed how people jumped to the rescue of a woman they suspected was getting drugged by a man. But what would happen if a man was getting drugged by an innocent-looking young woman putting a suspicious powder into her date's drink?
- **Drag Queens:** At clubs across the country, audiences cheer as drag queens strut their stuff on stage. But not everyone is so enthusiastic about men dressed as women. When two drag queens enter a coffee shop in Millburn, New Jersey, they're greeted with fierce intolerance at the hands of a mean-spirited waiter. Will customers jump to the drag queens' defense, or will they agree with the waiter's harsh treatment?
- **Pregnant Drinker:** A pregnant woman who looks like she might give birth any moment sits at a bar ordering drink after drink. Other patrons watch as she slams back the drinks. What would you do -- toast with her, or try to take her drink away?
- **Bike Theft:** What happens when a thief snatches a bike in broad daylight in a crowded park? To find out, "What Would You Do?" set loose a trio of thieves - white, black and female -- armed with bolt-cutters, hacksaws and a fierce-looking electrical grinder, in full public view. We watch reaction to a white thief, then a black thief. And what happens when the culprit is a sexy young woman in shorts and a tank top? Well, you won't believe it.

- Arizona Immigration Law: What will bystanders do when they observe people being racially profiled right in front of them? "WWYD" travels to Arizona, which has enacted a controversial illegal immigration law that would require police, in the course of enforcing the law, to ask people they suspect might be illegal aliens to show identification. Will anyone speak up when they observe an off-duty security guard confront a Latino family at a restaurant and demand their identification for no apparent reason except their appearance? In a twist, John Quiñones himself steps into the role of the one being questioned.
- Stealing Tips: It is a ritual of restaurant dining... tipping your waiter. But when someone steals the tips left for a waiter, will anyone in the restaurant say anything? The different ways people respond might be surprising.
- Deaf Discrimination: Will anyone intervene when a coffee shop manager blatantly discriminates against two deaf women applying for a job?
- Wanted: Customers at a diner sit at diner when a man who says he is a bounty hunter hands out a poster of a man wanted for passing counterfeit bills. What will the diners do when the wanted man comes into the restaurant? Will they say anything or mind their own business?

- Teenage Abortion: While eating at a restaurant, a teenager girl tells her teenage boyfriend that she is pregnant and she wants to keep the baby. The boyfriend, visually upset, says for all to hear that he wants no part in the rearing of the child and suggests she end the pregnancy. Will anyone in the restaurant speak up? Submitted by: Grand Prize Winner Jared Smith from Chippewa Falls, WI
- Discrimination: A little person is hassled and mocked for his size by fellow customers while shopping. Will anyone intervene? Submitted by: Grand Prize Winner Casey Hubelbank from Meriden, CT
- Homophobic Child: What would you do if, while at a restaurant, you witnessed a father telling his child that he is gay, and the child loudly showing disgust and intolerance over the situation? Submitted by: Damen Sterling from Taylor, MI
- Wheelchair Abuse: A capable young woman in a wheelchair is shopping at her local grocery store when a well intentioned customer tries to help. When she politely declines the offer, the help quickly turns into harassment. How will other shoppers react when they see our highly independent disabled actress being patronized as if she's a child? Contest winner Amy Saffell says it's a situation she frequently faces. Submitted by: Grand Prize Winner Amy Saffell from Franklin, TN
- Insulted Because of Red Hair: A boy is insulted and abused by a group boys at a diner. Will other patrons step in, or will anyone join in with the "ginger abuse" - when red heads are verbally attacked by others because of the color of their hair? Submitted by: Jonathan Gilsdorf from Rocklin, California (please note: Jonathan did not meet the contest age requirement and was not an official contestant)
- "WWYD" Classroom Assignment: John Quiñones and the "WWYD?" cameras visit students from a Buffalo, New York middle school class who submitted scenario ideas for a teacher's assignment (these submissions were not official contest entries as they were sent in by minors).

- Construction Workers Harassing an Attractive Woman: What would you do if you saw three construction workers harassing an attractive young woman who asks them to stop flirting? What happens if these men are in suits and ties instead of construction gear?
- Elderly Shoplifting: Some statistics say senior citizen non-violent crime is up five-fold. So "WWYD" wondered how people would respond if they were eyewitnesses to an elderly shoplifter helping him or herself to food from the stocked shelves. Even law enforcement were surprised.
- Gold Digger: A young, attractive woman sits at the bar with her fiancŽ -- a much older man. All she can talk about is shopping, going to expensive restaurants, presents, convincing him to buy another house, etc. But when he goes to the restroom, the woman confides in the bartender, telling him she can't wait for her fiancŽ to die so she can get his money and finally marry someone her own age. What happens if the couple is an older woman and a younger man?
- "Primetime: What Would You Do?" has won awards from the Chicago International Television Festival, and the Avon Foundation's 2006 Voice of Change award for exposing "injustice and wrongdoing against women and bringing the message of domestic violence to the mainstream." The Columbia Journalism Review has called the program "a Candid Camera of Ethics."
