Reports and interviews usually two to three minutes in length, which expand upon current problems and issues facing the community.

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/3/08 – Port St. Lucie police have arrested a known sexual predator for allegedly stalking new victims. Charles Phillips is being held at the St. Lucie County Jail. He has a lengthy criminal record including bank robbery and rape. We spoke with neighbors who were outraged to find out they were living next to a known sexual predator. (1-2 minutes in length – 12:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/9/08 – A Boynton Beach woman and her alleged accomplice remain in jail, accused of shooting a man outside a strip club in suburban West Palm Beach. The woman lured the man outside the strip club with an offer of sex, but with the intention of robbing him. Police say the man was shot seven times by an accomplice of the woman. The accomplice was injured during his capture and the woman is being held on a \$40,000 bond. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/5/08 – Colombian police say they have captured a leading drug kingpin. Oscar Varela Garcia is alleged to be a key member of a large cocaine cartel. An extradition request is pending against Varela, who is wanted by a Florida court on drug-trafficking charges. Colombia is the world's largest producer of cocaine. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/10/08 – Jacksonville Jaguars wide receiver Matt Jones faces a felony drug charge. Police in Fayetteville, Arkansas say they found him in a car cutting cocaine with a credit card. Jones was a star quarterback at Arkansas and a first-round draft pick in 2005. Jones is now one of many professional athletes who are highly paid and yet are bad examples of behavior to their sports. (1-2 minutes in length – 6:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/14/08 - Police arrested a 21 year old man who was an employee of a local pet store, after two customers complained he'd thrown a mouse several times. Two women said that he had asked them if they would like to see him break a rabbit's neck. The pet shop has many snakes and the rodents and rabbits are used for feeding the snakes. The employee was arrested and released on \$3,000 bond. (1-2 minutes in length – 5:30PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/17/08 – Tonight an employee at Miami International Airport is under arrest after police say he tried to get through security with a gun. Investigators say Andryl Billu was on his way to work at American Eagle Airlines when screeners found the weapon in his bag. According to police he does not have a permit to carry a gun. He's being held on \$5,000 bond. (1-2 minutes in length – 6:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/7/08 – A future fire station and emergency operations center in Boynton Beach has become a crime scene. A burglar hot-wired a backhoe to break holes into two steel containers at the construction site off High Ridge Road near I-95. About \$7,500 worth of copper wire and tools were taken from storage units which had about \$20,000 worth of damage. Police are seeing more and more thefts of construction materials everyday. (1-2 minutes in length – 6:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/25/08 – A local family is still trying to get over an apparent case of mistaken identity. It started when sheriff's deputies thought they were chasing the bad guys, but instead it was a family coming home from church. The family was driving a similar green Saturn car. Sheriff's deputies swarmed around the car, guns cocked and a helicopter overhead, the mother was arrested and cuffed while her family looked on. She is still waiting for an apology. And she has asked internal affairs to investigate their conduct. (1-2 minutes in length -5:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/29/08 – A Treasure Coast father took matters into his own hands to protect his family. He shot a man trying to break into his home. This is one of many home invasions that have taken place over that last few months. The family is upset and dealing with the fear, and police are trying to stay on top if this growing crime. More and more homes that are located in desolate areas are vulnerable to this new, bold crime. (1-2 minutes in length - 11:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 8/1/08 – Lake Worth police continue to look for two suspects in connection with a deadly shooting. The incident happened last night at about 10PM in a home in south Lake Worth. An older Hispanic man died from a gunshot wound at the scene and two young, Hispanic males in their late teens were seen fleeing from the scene. (1-2 minutes in length – 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 8/2/08 – A Palm Beach County Sheriff's Deputy chased a stolen car into the parking lot of a local movie theater late at night. The driver of the car a 16 year-old drove the car in reverse twice, the first time smashing into the patrol car. The second time the car started approaching the deputy at high speed. The deputy fired and struck the driver, who then hit a tree and a sign. The driver was killed but a passenger and the deputy were not hurt. Controversy surrounds this incident and the 16 year old driver had no prior criminal history. And his family says the deputy was unjustified. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 8/5/08 – Lake Worth residents will soon be under the watch of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's office. City leaders made the decision last night to have the current police department merge with the Sheriff's office. The residents of the city are frustrated with the lack of involvement by police to break up gang activity and violence and the Sheriff's Dept. has the resources and the training to handle what is a growing problem in that city. (1-2 minutes in length – 5:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 8/6/08 – Palm Beach County's Violent Crimes Task Force is now investigating five separate shootings that took place within an hour and forty minutes of each other, four in Belle Glade and one in Pahokee. One person was killed, four were injured. The local residents formed into angry crowds as police scrambled to search five crime scenes for evidence and clues as to who might have done this and if they were all related. There is gang rivalry between Pahokee and Belle Glade, and deputies have their hands full trying to help keep the peace between the two cities. (1-2 minutes in length - 12:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 7/26/08 – A couple who were married at a church in Pompano Beach, and who were fighting a bad crack addiction stole thousands of dollars worth of speakers and sound equipment from the same church. They tried to sell the stolen audio equipment to a near-by music store. The couple had recently sold one of their own pets to a drug dealer for drugs. (1-2 minutes in length -11:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 7/30/08 – An area pediatrician, Dr. Sergio Rodriguez is facing nine criminal charges accused of writing unnecessary prescriptions. One family says Rodriguez issued nine different medications for their baby, and gave him 25 to 30 shots after diagnosing him with three dangerous illnesses. After getting a second opinion, the family found out there was nothing wrong with the child. Authorities raided Rodriguez's office and home, and investigators spent hours inside a Lake Worth drug store to find out if other doctors and pharmacies were involved. (1-2 minutes in length -11:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 7/31/08 – A Florida man is in jail after bringing a toddler to a crack deal. Police in Charlotte County arrested Douglas Sterrett saying he brought his two and one half year old son to a drug deal. Sterrett appeared in court to answer to drug charges. He could also be charged with exposing a child to drugs which carries a thirty year prison sentence. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 8/1/08 – Detectives are looking for a man who's responsible for at least one pharmacy robbery along the Treasure Coast. Detectives have surveillance footage of the man. The suspect asked a local pharmacy employee if they sell Oxycodone, when she said yes, he lifted up his shirt, showing the handle of a gun and demanded the drugs. She took him back to where they were and gave him five bottles. Detectives believe that same man could be responsible for two similar robberies in Port St. Lucie and Vero Beach. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 8/4/08 – Drug enforcement agents brought in a big haul of marijuana at a marina near Miami. Police say three people tried to bring in the drugs at Bal Harbour in the Haulover Marina Saturday. The pot was found after the boat was stopped for speeding. The people jumped overboard to escape. Police found more than thirty three bricks of marijuana worth about \$100, 000 dollars. (1-2 minutes - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2– 8/5/08 – A slew of dangerous drugs are off the streets in St. Lucie County as the result of Operation “Safe Medicine Cabinet.” Deputies allowed people to bring in old medicines, where they will be disposed of properly and not fall into the wrong handles of children or drug addicts. Residents who turned in their outdated prescriptions were rewarded with gift cards at local stores. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 8/12/08 – Three West Palm Beach police officers tried to arrest suspects after an Oxycodone robbery at a local CVS pharmacy and controversy ensued. One of the suspects pepper-sprayed the officers prior to being cuffed, then tried to bite one and spit in another’s face. The police roughed up the suspect, and all the action was caught on one of the police cruisers’ dashboard cameras. The suspect is being charges with assault and battery on a police officer and one officer has resigned and two others are on leave for not using excessive force options. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 8/31/08 – A surprising discovery was made in furniture shipped to Italy. Customs officials found pure cocaine stuffed into secret compartments inside the pieces. The furniture was shipped in three containers. Authorities found out about the drugs after one of the containers weighed more than the others Police say the Cocaine is from South America. (1-2 minutes in length -6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 9/18/08 – Neighbors in a Vero Beach community awoke to the sound of gun fire and sheriff’s deputies outside their homes. A man broke into the house with two knives, a mother and her two sons were asleep inside. One of the sons awoke and picked up a shotgun and fired killing the intruder. Friends of the murdered intruder speculate that he was there to steal drugs. The mother of the house has had her share of legal problems. She had been arrested for selling Oxycodone. No drugs or large amounts of cash were found on the premises. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:30PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 9/23/08 – A man in Loxahatchee said he had to grow pot to pay his mortgage. He and his wife say they started a grow operation last summer as a means to help pay the bills. They had harvested the plants there at home and gathered about 40 to 50 pounds of pot from it. The yield will now be destroyed and their daughter is now in DCF custody. (1-2 minutes in length -11:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 7/27/08 – The state of Florida has sent out emergency payments to 5,600 Medicaid providers who haven't been reimbursed in a month. Right now, \$48 million dollars in emergency payments are on their way. It's all because of a computer glitch with a new computer system. The state agency for health care administration says their technology problem will be fixed soon. About 100,000 people deliver services and are then reimbursed by the state. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 7/29/08 – Several people are undergoing treatment for rabies after coming into contact with a rabid kitten. A woman rescued the 8 week old feral cat from a wooded area behind a home development. Eight people were exposed to the kitten and are being treated for possible rabies contamination. Once again residents in the Boca Raton area are reminded not to approach wild animal or attempt to feed them because rabies is a serious and fatal disease to both humans and animals. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 8/1/08 – A new health problem has cropped up with all of the foreclosed homes in our area. Because many of them are lying fallow, the swimming pools in the backyards are now turning into muck ponds that have become breeding grounds for mosquitoes. With the mosquitoes come the problem of encephalitis, and a number of health hazards. Because no one is even checking on or trying to maintain the houses, health department employees are trying to counteract the problem with frequent area sprayings of pesticides. (1-2 minutes in length -5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 8/3/08 – Community and business leaders are reminding parents that their kids may be eligible for low-cost or free health care. Hundreds of parents showed up for the Florida Kidcare Back to School Enrollment Fair in West Palm Beach. Aside from giving students free school supplies, event organizers were on-hand to help them enroll for insurance coverage. Experts say more than 500,000 Florida children are eligible for low-cost or free health insurance but are not enrolled. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 8/4/08 – American growers have a problem with blueberries. Demand and acreage of the fruit soared after reports came out that the fruit has major health benefits. Now there's enough supply to meet demand and then some. Industry leaders are working with blueberry exporters like China, Canada and South America to develop markets in their own countries to keep their berries out and prices stable. (1-2 minutes in length - 12:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 8/6/08 – The Governor's plan to provide low-cost health coverage to the state's almost four million uninsured is catching some heat. A research group says the proposed premium is too high and the plan doesn't cover important medical services. State agencies have been working with insurance companies to revise the plan. Insurers have until the middle of this month to submit a coverage plan, but so far no plans have been turned in. The earliest the plan will be available is January of next year. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 8/6/08 – Students who need immunizations before school starts can get one free today in Indiantown. The free shots are being offered by the Martin County Health Department. The immunization clinic begins today. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 –9/2/08– Increasing physical activity may delay the onset of dementia. Alzheimer’s experts have conducted an in-depth study of two groups of people; one worked out three times a week for six months and the other did not. Those who increased their physical activity scored higher on cognitive tests even a year after the study concluded. The information appears this week in the Journal of the American Medical Association. (1-2 minutes in length -5:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 –9/4/08 – A new study found toddlers and preschoolers had levels of fire retardants that were two to three times higher than their mothers. The chemicals known as PBDEs are found in everything from TV sets to mattresses. But the main source of exposure is thought to be household dust. There is a concern the chemical may increase the risk of health problems including behavior problems and cancer. Experts warn this was a small study and other studies like it were mostly conducted in animals. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 9/5/08 – The number of soldiers taking their own lives could break last year’s record high. This year alone there have been sixty two confirmed suicides, committed by active duty soldiers. An additional thirty one deaths are being investigated as suspected suicides. To combat the problem, the Army says it’s actively increasing its roster of mental health professionals. (1-2 minutes in length -5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 9/13/08 – A woman named Vela Pierre who is a Haitian community AIDS activist is known locally as “The Condom Lady.” She spends her days visiting local businesses such as restaurants, specifically in black communities, handing out condoms and teaching people about the killer among them – AIDS. She says a large part of the Caribbean-American community has very little information on AIDS. And even if they’ve heard of the disease, they don’t necessarily believe in it. A 2006 CDC study shows African Americans accounted for nearly half of AIDS cases and Latinos were second with 17%. Floridians were most at risk, second in the country only to New York. (1-2 minutes in length – 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 4 – 7/8/08 – Today is the day that schools throughout Florida learn their F-Cat grades. The Florida Department of Education will release schools’ grades for the 2007-08 school year. Today’s results also help determine state bonuses to hundreds of South Florida schools. They qualify by earning an “A” or improving at least one letter grade from the previous year. (1-2 minutes in length -5:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 4 – 7/22/08 – Sam’s Club is trying to lure college kids to its warehouse stores by offering a special membership deal. College students can get a year-long membership for \$40, which is similar to the current Sam’s individual membership. But the college deal offers a second free card for a roommate or friend and a \$15 gift card. (1-2 minutes in length - 12:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 4 – 7/30/08 – A judge says the Okeechobee school district must allow a club that promotes gay tolerance to meet on campus and provide for the well-being of gay students. The American Civil Liberties Union sued after Okeechobee High tried to ban the group from gathering on school grounds. In a ruling the judge says the club does not interfere with abstinence-only education as the principal previously argued. (1-2 minutes in length -6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 4 – 8/1/08 – This year the state’s back-to-school tax break didn’t happen. And because of that many families are cutting back on what they buy. A national study claims 4 out of 5 families plan to spend less on back to school shopping. It goes on to say that parents will be more concerned with pencils and paper than shirts and shoes. Families make cuts in the fashion area first, and more and more families are shopping at outlets. Family budgets aren’t the only ones suffering. Schools took a huge blow to their bank accounts. Administrations are looking to cut cost and save fuel, so school buses will make fewer stops. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 4 – 8/11/08 – The number of school-aged children being schooled at home has been grown by 80% on the Treasure Coast. More than 2,000 students are now home schooled on the Treasure Coast. According to the U.S. Dept of Education more than one million students were home schooled in the U.S. in 2003 which is the last figures released by the department. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 4 – 8/11/08 – Gloria and Emilio Estefan put together a big fan fair at a local casino to make a big announcement about a concert to be held in October. Proceeds from the concert will benefit South Florida public schools including Palm Beach and Indian River counties through donations to the education funds. Gloria’s mother was a teacher and she saw first hand how teachers often use their own money to supplement classroom supplies. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 5 – 7/23/08 – Sixty years after President Truman desegregated the military, senior Black officers are still rare, particularly in the highest ranks. Blacks make up about 17% of the total force, yet just 9% of all officers. And only one of the thirty eight of the four star generals or admirals serving is Black. One reason is career choice. Fewer Blacks are choosing combat jobs that lead to the top spots. (1-2 minutes in length – 5:30PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 5 – 7/9/08 – Soon you will be able to show your love of Hispanics with a license plate that says “Hispanics discovered Florida.” The money used to buy this license plate will help with job programs and tutoring. Authorities are looking into the proposal. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:30AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 5 – 7/8/08 – The death of a West Palm Beach man being held on immigration charges has sparked calls for a federal investigation. 23-year old Valery Joseph died last month at the Glades County Jail. Now his family is demanding an independent review of his death. They claim there isn't proper access to health care for those in immigrant custody. Immigration and Customs officials deny the claim and say Joseph died of a seizure. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 5 – 8/12/08 – The Sheriff's office says a man named Robert Haynes is responsible for sending Commissioner Addie Greene hate mail. Green says for the last three years she's gotten racially offensive material. A recent letter even celebrated the death of a black teen at the hands of police. The Sheriff's office says Haynes admitted to sending two postcards. He will not face any charges. (1-2 minute in length – 5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 5 –8/29/08 – On the 45th anniversary of Martin Luther King's historic "I Have A Dream" speech this report asked many local black residents how far they believe the community has come and what it means to have black candidate running for president. From segregated schools and businesses to the possibility of a black president the country has come very far. (1-2 minutes in length 5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 6 – 7/16/08 – Lake Worth has decided to join a lawsuit against a planned Palm Beach project to nourish its beaches and protect some residents. "The Surf Rider Foundation" and three citizens are working to block the plan claiming it wouldn't be good for Lake Worth's coastline. Last night Lake Worth Commissioners voted to become part of the effort to protect its pier, beaches and reefs. Palm Beach believes its project is environmentally sound and necessary. An administrative law judge will start hearing arguments for and against the project in August, unless a settlement is reached before then. (1-2 minutes in length - 12:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 6 –7/10/08 – The recent rain has helped Lake Okeechobee's water level. The lake's level is half a foot higher than just one month ago. But it's still two feet shy of its average for this time of year. Experts say a slow but steady rise in the lake level is good. If the water comes up too fast it could hurt the plants. (1-2 minutes in length - 6:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 6 – 7/15/08 – Ft. Pierce's Marina Square is now a wonderful location for locals and tourists alike to meet, snap photos and enjoy the view as well as live music and motorcycles on the weekend. Initially the area was a parking lot, then it was grassed over and eventually it has become an area with pavers that people can truly enjoy the space. The City plans to add more boat slips and destination hotel. (1-2 minutes in length -5:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 6 – 7/1/08 – Charred pilings and burned planks are all that remain of lab and classroom facilities at the Wabasso Island Environmental Learning Center after a fire erupted Monday night. Gone are the wetlands exhibits and the teaching tools used to educate young and old about the Indian River Lagoon and its fragile ecosystem. Children taking part in summer camps at the learning center had to steer clear of the wreckage, but did learn a lesson about the power behind Mother Nature. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:30AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 6 – 8/11/08 – A huge lobster poaching case nets a big catch for federal agents. Officials are doing what they can to protect the marine environment in the Florida Keys. After a detailed investigation they say they've reeled in their suspects and hopefully ended a big illegal poaching operation. Lobster season is very limited in the Keys and the Fish and Game Commission and Coast Guard patrol the waters heavily. (1-2 minutes in length – 5:00AM)

PROBLEM/NEED 6 – 8/29/08 – For easy green living an expert says simply change one thing in each room of your house. In the bathroom you can save thousands of gallons of water each year with a low flow faucet, in the kitchen use stainless steel cookware (they don't release the off gasses that are harmful to the environment and to you personally). In the living room use eco-friendly paint without all those chemicals, or chose a bagless vacuum cleaner. It all helps to reduce the size of the carbon footprint. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:30PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 6 – 9/18/08 – Want to be more eco-friendly? Pitch the plastic bags and buy reusable bags which can also generate money for charity. Supermarkets around the country are now selling canvas bags for grocery shopping, and the goal is to get more and more people to stop using the plastic bags. (1-2 minutes in length - 5:30PM)

THESE PROGRAMS FEATURE PROMINENT NEWSMAKERS ON A NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL LEVEL, OR AS FICTIONAL DEPICTIONS OF CURRENT TOPICS.

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/3/08 - The installment of the Dr. Phil program featured people who had lost money in Get Rich Quick schemes. In many cases people deliberating defrauded family members. In many cases, these would-be millionaires lived lavish lifestyles on the money others invested in the business, simply to look successful. An actual, successful inventor/salesman addresses a group of wannabes to tell them exactly what they are up against and explain the pitfalls. (60 minutes in length 3:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/9/08 – This Dr. Phil show interviewed a young, married who are a modern day Bonnie & Clyde. They have committed three armed robberies and used the money to pay for a honeymoon. The question for the couple’s parents was how could they have gone so wrong? The bride went from a straight A student to a felon, and the groom has an emotional plea for his parents. (60 minutes in length 3:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 3 – 7/14/08 – On this Dr. Phil show a panel of doctors, who are specialists in many areas answered questions and addressed controversial subjects from uterus transplants, water intoxication, and plastic surgery nightmares. The audience gained information about what they should ask of their own physicians or specialists. (60 minutes in length 3:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 7/24/08 – Dr. Phil hosted a discussion of sexual predators and how often and when they victimize their prey. In many cases, they prey upon family members including step children. In many cases there are older family members who are aware that the molestation is going on and who say or do nothing. This show featured a mother, daughter and molester all confronting one another. (60 minutes in length 3:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 1 – 8/21/08 – This Dr. Phil program was all about vigilante justice and how average people have taken the law into their own hands out of frustration. People of all ages and backgrounds have made national news by fighting back against prejudice and incompetence. In some cases they even made citizens arrests. Where is the local law enforcement and why do these people feel that the law is unresponsive? (60 minutes in length 3:00PM)

PROBLEM /NEED 5 – 9/12/08 – This installment of Dr. Phil lead a group discussion about the use of the “N” word and whether it is or is not appropriate under any circumstances. Members of the black and white community weighed in on occasion when they have used the word and how comfortable they are or are not with it. Many audience members felt the word was offensive under all circumstances, and should be banned from the lexicon. That the word promotes hate and anger. (60 minutes in length 3:00PM)

PROBLEM/NEED 2 – 9/17/08 – This Dr. Phil program took an intense look at a stay-at-home mom who is addicted to pills. The woman is swallowing 30 to 50 pills a day. And it all started with a prescription for post partum depression. The woman is now endangered of losing everything, husband, daughter and possibly her life. The woman admits to having an affair while high on Oxycodone. Dr. Phil works with the woman before it’s too late. (60 minutes in length 3:00PM)
