## **WEATHERSCHOOL**

Weatherschool is a weather/science curriculum suited to grade levels 1-6. It has been approved by the State of Utah for science curriculum and it meets the state core curriculum requirements for fourth grade.

During each session of Weatherschool, approximately 450 school children, their teachers, administrators and parents visit KSL Television to participate in Weatherschool and appear live on Eyewitness News at noon. A diverse group representing fifteen schools, a wide geographic area and six grade levels come to the station.

There are several Weatherschool segments included in the one-hour broadcast and students are given the opportunity to share with viewers what they've learned about weather science; clouds, water cycles, precipitation and barometric pressure, just to name a few.

KSL Television emphasizes Weatherschool on two of its news programs. On Eyewitness News at noon, students participate in Weatherschool; Eyewitness news at 6:30 p.m. broadcast the Weatherschool questions and answers. Weatherschool meets the Education and Environment ascertainments.

## **OUR TOWN**

Our Town is a three-minute interview show, which is available for non-profit agencies in our community to use. The agencies use the show to announce fundraising events, promote educational programs and cultural events and ask for volunteers. Also covered are upcoming events that alert the public to issues related to ascertainties listed for this quarter.

The show airs Monday through Friday, with each segment running three times on the day it airs.
