Created by KSL 5 TV, Weather Lab is a weather/science program. It is suited mainly to grade levels 3-6 and airs in conjunction with the 4th Grade weather curriculum in Utah schools.

During each session of Weather Lab, school children, their teachers, administrators and parents visit KSL Television to participate in Weather Lab with KSL Meteorologist Len Randolph. The program airs twice weekly on Eyewitness News at Noon and attracts a diverse group of students representing Wasatch Front schools in a wide geographic area. Schools participating come from the public, private and home school sectors.

Weather Lab students are given the opportunity to share with viewers what they've learned about weather science, clouds, water cycles, precipitation and barometric pressure, just to name a few.

Within the site one can find information in such areas as "ask the Meteorologist," weather folklore, weather games, weather experiments, weather safety and quick weather facts. Also, students and parents can click on and see "streaming" video of previously aired segments.
