Americans getting fat	July 4, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	A look at the why people are getting heavier. Also, is there programs to keep the weight off or all diets just fad someone thinks will get the wieght off. Guests included dieticians and repretative from LA Weight Loss and WeightWatchers.
Allowing a loved one to die at home	July 11, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	Do you have what it takes to allow a loved one to return home and die? What is the "right thing" to do and who determines the "right thing?" Guests included local Hospice Care Givers and Family Members who had to make those choices.
U.S. Intelligence on Iraq	July 18, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	A senate committee on Intelligence made public it report on the U.S. Intelligence Agency's Assessments on Iraq. Did the CIA mislead the President? Did we enter war in Iraq based on faulty information? Report says yes. We talk to a former CIA agent about the report.
Closed Door Meetings in Idaho	July 25, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	When is a closed door meeting allowed in Idaho? Who can have them. Who decides what's Public and what's not. The Idaho Press Club says the State Legislature is holding too many closed door meeting and says it's against the law. We discuss the issue with two reporters who cover the legislature and two State Senators about the issue.
Illegal Aliens	August 8, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	More than a quarter-million people enter the United Stae Illegally every year. Why do they come? Could our country survive if they didn't? We talk to Mexican Aliens and the Idaho Migrant Council and High School Student and a Human Resource officer from INEEL.

We talk to the Mayor of Blackfoot, a local farmers, the water master and Congressman Mike Simpson about the issue.
Boulder White Clouds Wilderness Debate	August 22, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	Congressman Mike Simpson is proposing to create a wilderness area in the Boulder White Cloud Range. People who live nearby are totally against it. But environmentalists want it to be protected. We take a look at the debate and try to find out what the plan is. Guests include a representative from Congressman Mike Simpsons Office, a State Senator from Custer County, and representatives from the Idaho Mountain Bike Association and the Idaho Conservation League.
Democracy in Iraq	August 29, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	A look at the history of the middle east and why it is the way it is. But can democracy work in that region. We talk to an ISU Professor about the topic.
Snowmobiles in Yellowstone National Park	September 5, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	Will snowmobiles ever be banned from Yellowstone Naitonal Park and why so many people are for the ban. But people who live near the park say it's not that bad and it could destroy an economy. Guests include representatives from the Blue Ribbon Coalition, Hotel manager from West Yellowstone, a conservationist from Bozeman.
Cattle Feed lots and Large Dairies	September 19, 2004	Tough Talk	30 minutes	CAFA! Concentrated Animal Feedlot Operation. Four words that strike fear in the hearts of environmentalists and neighbors who live downwind. Why are dairy farms and cattle feedlots getting so big. Should we allow it to happen and especially in Eastern Idaho? Guests included Farm Bureau representative, a dairy farmer, environmentalists from Bonneville County and the Magic Valley.
