Diane Sawyer interviews Mary Katherine Smart, who speaks for the first time about her sister Elizabeth Smart's abduction from their Salt Lake City, UT, bedroom. It was her **astonishingly** awakened memory that helped break open the case and bring home the sister she loves so dearly.

Chris Cuomo meets Jeanette Tamayo, who was kidnapped from her home and held captive by a man who severely abused and threatened to kill her. This brave and clever girl refused to be a victim. She explains how she used techniques she learned on TV programs to save herself and almost single-handedly put her tormentor in prison.

ISOLATED COMMUNITY

John Quiñones returns to Colorado City, AZ, with anti-polygamy activist Flora Jessop and her cousin, Laurene. Laurene escaped from the Fundamentalist Church of Latter Day Saints sect, where she was placed into a polygamous marriage arranged by the sect. For Laurene, this trip is an opportunity to prove to herself that she's truly free from the clutches of her past.

PROFESSIONAL GOLF

Mianne Bagger is a professional golfer on the Ladies European Tour who was born a man. "Primetime's" Jay Schadler interviews the Danish-born Bagger, who says she'd like to play in American events too. However, while the European tour has accepted transsexual golfers, the United States' governing body, the L.P.G.A., has a rule that only natural-born women can play on their tour.

SAFE SCHOOLS

In an hour-long "Primetime" report, co-anchor Chris Cuomo goes inside two juvenile facilities near Phoenix, AZ, and meets a group of kids at a critical turning point – they have one last shot to change their ways.

DEADLY ENCOUNTER

A “Bear Whisperers” dream of living among Alaska’s ferocious grizzlies turns into a horrific nightmare – caught on tape.
