Education, training and employment services, mental and physical health, terminal illness and grief support, home care, respite services, adult day services, and coordinated transportation

Napa Valley. Two young women, Adriane Insogna and Leslie Mazzara, were fatally stabbed on Halloween night in their rental house, in Napa Valley. A scene straight out of a horror movie, their roommate, Lauren was somehow spared. In an interview with John Quinones, Lauren talks about that terrible night and how she helped end a frustrating hunt for the killer.

KLEPOTMANIA

Shoplifting costs an estimated \$10.5 billion in losses to retailers a year. Non-professional addicted shoplifters -- people who steal once a week or more -- account for the vast majority of retail losses. ABC Correspondent John Avila goes into the mind of a shoplifter to understand the compulsion to steal.

SECURITY FLAWS

ABC News Chief Investigative Correspondent Brian Ross reports on the results of a four-month ABC News investigation of security at the country's twenty-five university nuclear reactors. MARRIAGE ON THE ROCKS

She's a popular radio disc jockey, he's a stay-at-home dad -- and their marriage is on the brink. Between financial stress and suspicions of infidelity, can Kimberly and Jason save their relationship? The couple invited "Primetime's" John Quinones to rig their Rochester, New York home with cameras to document their crumbling relationship. Will watching themselves fight help save their marriage?

CAPTURING OF DOLPHINS

The popularity of dolphin parks is booming. Tourists can pay over \$100 for the chance to pet, kiss and even get propelled through the water by dolphins in the Caribbean, Mexico and other locations throughout the world. "Primetime's" Chris Cuomo's investigation finds that there is a dark side to the dolphin park industry outside the United States.

HOAX PHONE CALLS

A man posing as a police officer convinces fast food workers across the country to do unthinkable acts to co-workers and customers -- all via telephone. Police believe that the same caller may have been carrying out the mind-boggling hoax for 10 years. John Quinones' report follows the police trail to arresting the suspect, hundreds of miles away in Panama City, Florida, who has plead not guilty.

DANGER AT SCHOOL

In the wake of the latest school shooting in Tennessee earlier this week, "Primetime" demonstrates lockdown drills with 100 student volunteers to see how they will react if there is a dangerous threat at their school. Chris Cuomo reports.
