Comprehensive child and youth development, including education, and family nurturing.
- **Training Assistance**
This issue includes transitional and permanent housing, adult literacy, job training, and employment. Support services such as legal, financial and transportation.
- **Child Care**
Quality child care, health, safety and early intervention by companies, non-profit organization, government agencies, etc.
- **Senior Assistance**
Education, training and employment services, mental and physical health, terminal illness and grief support, home care, respite services, adult day services, and coordinated transportation

Terry Moran reports on the crisis in this special edition of "Primetime."

Thursday, August 31, 2006

TRAIN WRECKS

Are trains across the country ticking time bombs? In January, 2005, when a train crashed into a small town in South Carolina, it unleashed 160,000 pounds of a deadly compound that killed nine people, injured more than 500 others, and forever changed the town. What happened in Graniteville, SC was not an act of terrorism; it was a devastating example of what can go wrong from the millions of tank loads transporting poisonous chemicals yearly. Chris Cuomo reports on the risk of toxic train accidents in America.

TO HELL AND BACK

A Russian orphan adopted by an American man speaks out for the first time about being molested by her adoptive father – who posted explicit photographs of the little girl online. The report chronicles the girls' adoption from an orphanage in a small industrial city in the south of Russia to her new home in the outskirts of Pittsburgh, PA, and questions whether anything could have prevented the vicious child abuse.

MEDICAL ETHICS

ABC News Chief Investigative Correspondent **Brian Ross** reports on a medical experiment on unsuspecting accident patients brought into hospital ERs that has been happening in more than 20 cities across the country. Is it possible that you might have been used as a medical guinea pig without your knowledge?

BAD HABITS

JuJu Chang reports on bad habits that are soft addictions - often these bad habits stem from deep rooted problems.
