## Agriculture and Business

A ban on smoking in most workplaces in the city of West Lafayette is scheduled to take effect on July 1, 2007. During the first quarter a bar owner and a bartender filed suit against the city in an effort to stop the ban from taking effect.

The city of Lafayette released results of a survey of downtown residents and business owners. Respondents say they want more retail business, increased police protection, landscaping, sidewalks and improved streetscape in the downtown area.

Lafayette Paperboard closed in January, putting 70 people out of work. The closure also left local governments looking for recycling options. The city of Lafayette, for instance, received about \$9,000 annually for taking its recyclables to Lafayette Paperboard.

## Crime

The growth of gangs in the Tippecanoe County area was highlighted early in 2007 when police, prosecutors and social service agencies gathered for a summit on gang activity. Simultaneously the Lafayette City Council began debating a controversial ordinance that would require property owners to remove graffiti within a proscribed period of time or face a fine. Some property owners consider this "punishing the victim."

An Indianapolis physician who investigates allegations of child abuse was the featured speaker at a community forum on abuse during the first quarter. Michelle Laskey helped investigate the fatal Aiyana Gauvin case. Her address to about 200 people was designed to help them recognize signs of abuse.

During its Noon News Public Affairs program, WLFI also profiled Heartford House, a child advocacy center designed to minimize the trauma of abuse investigations.

## Education

The release of state-wide dropout rates prompted questions for the Lafayette School Corporation in the first quarter. LSC's 2006 graduation rate was calculated at 65 percent. That led to a meeting between school administrators and parents. Administrators explained changes in the way the state calculates dropout rates may have played a role in Jefferson High School's lower-than-average number.

After months of negotiations the West Lafayette Community School Corporation and its teachers union arrived at a tentative contract agreement. The contract was ratified within weeks.
