Agriculture and Business

High energy prices prompted more interest in alternative energy during the third quarter. One wind farm in Benton County began producing electricity during the second quarter, while construction continued on another. At the same time, government officials from other counties, and the state of Indiana, toured the Benton County farms to learn more about the process of establishing wind farms. In White County, the process of zoning for wind farms got underway during the Quarter.

Energy prices also affected area businesses. WLFJ profiled Indiana Beach, in White County, which reported an increase in attendance. Owners attributed that increase to local residents who are taking fewer long trips for recreation.

Employees of Eli Lilly and Company's Tippe Labs were informed during the quarter that the company is considering the possibility of closing the plant near Lafayette. Other options include seeking a strategic partner or restructuring.

Crime

The WeTip Hotline, where callers can leave anonymous information about suspected crimes, received 80 calls during its first month in operation in Tippecanoe County. Law enforcement officials said the local hotline is the busiest in the nation.

Plans for a Juvenile Justice Center in Tippecanoe County took major steps forward during the third quarter, with final design work underway. Construction could begin by the end of 2008.

The Campus Community Bar Retail Coalition, a group representing Purdue University, local law enforcement officials, and bar owners, reconvened during the third quarter to discuss ways to enhance public safety in the West Lafayette Village area. It was learned that the city's smoking ban may be contributing to an increase in the number of pedestrians, leading to safety concerns among police.

Education

Four Indiana counties applied for state funding during the third quarter to explore school consolidation. In the WLFI-TV viewing area, Clinton County applied for the funding. In White County, four school corporations, Tri-County, Twin Lakes, North White, and Frontier, are studying what impact consolidation would have on them.

After changing financing, the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance allowed three building projects in the Tippecanoe School Corporation to proceed. The DLGF cut nearly \$3 million from the proposed Wyandotte Elementary project, and changed financing on two others.

As students began returning to class in August, WLFI interviewed local school safety experts to remind motorists about safe driving in school zones.

A new Domestic Violence Fatality review team was formed during the quarter. Consisting of 15 experts, the team will meet to review homicides and suicides directly related to domestic violence.

Efforts to purchase new ambulances for the Tippecanoe Emergency Ambulance Service proved fruitful during the second quarter. After voting against funding new vehicles, the county council later decided to purchase five new ambulances.
